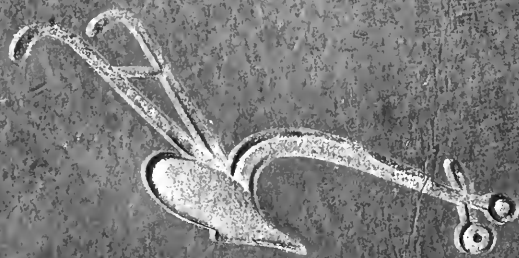

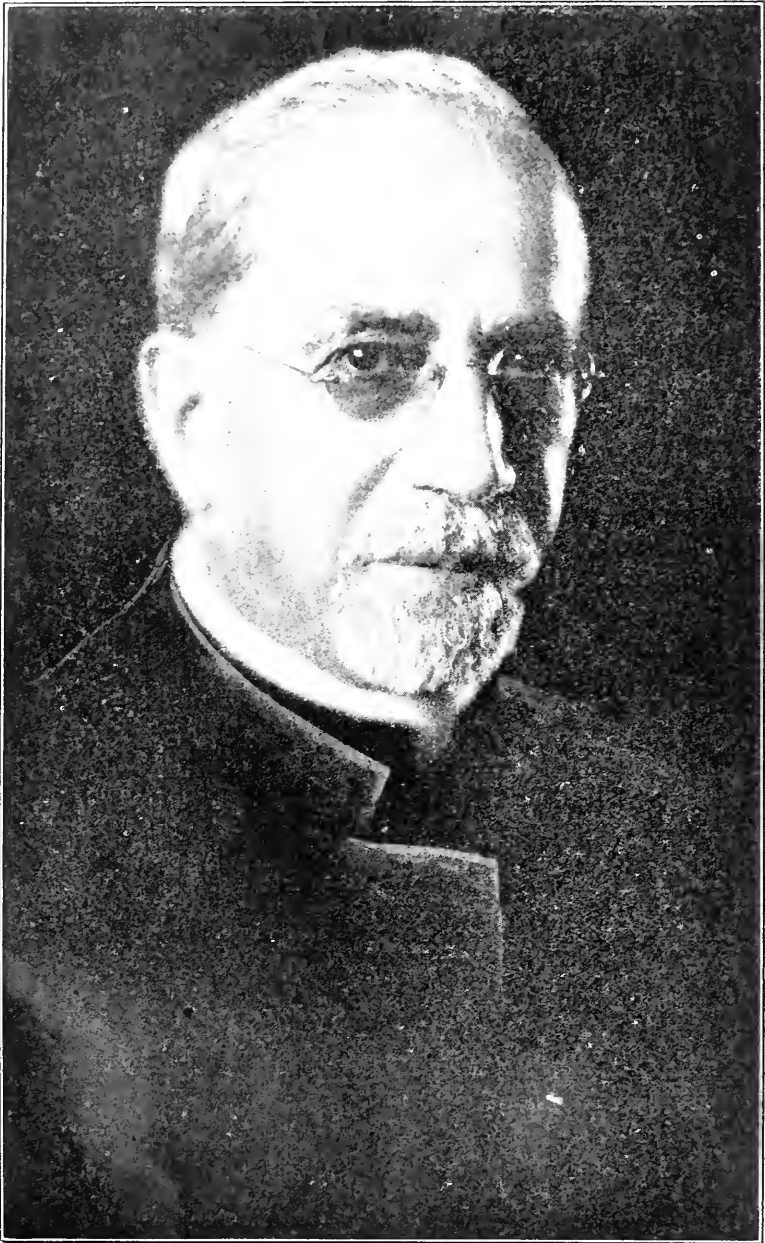

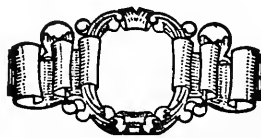

*Message of the President***HERBERT D. ALLMAN**

TO THE

THIRTY-SECOND ANNUAL MEETING

OF

THE NATIONAL FARM SCHOOL

OCTOBER 20, 1929

If one-fourth the American population is today producing almost twenty times the farm products of a half-century ago, there must be some reasons for it.

Agriculture, notwithstanding public opinion's inherent unfavorable attitude, has made greater strides under adverse conditions than any other industry. We are on the eve of a still greater development. Inventions of new agricultural products through chemical research, financial aid promised by State Bankers' Associations, and training farmers along scientific lines, will inaugurate a new era of prosperity. Is it not time the oft-quoted expressions "Farm Depression" and "Farm Relief," be thrown in the discard—eliminated from public consciousness? There is no more depression in agriculture than in any other industry. Farming should be regarded as a staple, growing venture, able to hold up its head, secure in the general business structure of the nation. Farm statistics indicate that nature has co-operated with the farmer this year in wiping out surpluses—that relatively high prices are in prospect for all important products raised by those who "know how." The demand for good farm land is improving—another indication that farming pays, if scientifically understood and carried on.

Farming is, and must continue to be an individualistic business of small units and independent ownership. The farmer is an outstanding example of the economically free individual. It is estimated that only 7 per cent. of the world's arable land, 6 per cent. of its population and 4 per cent. of agricultural workers are found within the boundaries of the United States, yet we produce 25 per cent. of the world's wheat, 75 per cent. of its corn, 60 per cent. of its cotton, 50 per cent. of its tobacco, 25 per cent. of its

oats and hay, 20 per cent. of its flaxseed and 13 per cent. of its barley. These figures demonstrate that the change from hand labor to machinery is increasing.

While many authorities, including President Hoover, Secretary of Agriculture Hyde, and Chairman Legge of the Federal Farm Board, are interested in the solution of the farm relief problem, the most the government can do, is to help farmers help themselves. The Farm Board possesses no miraculous powers, nor has it any money to give away. It cannot set aside natural economic laws. It cannot merge 6,000,000 farms, nor subsidize agriculture. It cannot arbitrarily fix prices. It can, however, encourage the development of a full co-operative marketing system, advantageous to the country as a whole.

The greatest need of American agriculture is more effective organization. The farmer must use his head with his hands. Those remaining on the land are forging their way back to prosperity, by adopting machine methods, dispensing with superfluous hand labor, keeping more accurate accounts, and following the procedure of up-to-date business.

Significant changes in agriculture, due to the wider use of machinery, are traced in a report made by the United States Chamber of Commerce. That survey shows that the mechanization of production processes results in larger farms, facilitates the organization of industrialized farms, swells the volume of agricultural production and tends to reduce prices of farm products. The report adds that American agriculture has more power available for its use than any other branch of American industry, except railway transportation. It has more per worker than the combined manufacturing industries and uses more annually than all mining industries. The power problem in agriculture consists in mechanizing farm operations, at present requiring prodigious expenditures of human effort.

Since 1920 tractors on farms have more than tripled. Larger numbers and improved types of farm implements have been placed on the market. The one-way disk-plow, has added to the efficiency of seed-bed preparation, while the most spectacular development has occurred in the field of harvesting machinery.

Farms of the future will be run along factory lines. Agriculture is going through a transition period, due to increased use of machinery. Successful farms will resemble well-managed factories, resulting in general prosperity by increasing the farmer's

profits, thus enabling him to buy more necessities. Industry went through a period of distress similar to agricultural conditions of today, but mass production is beginning to overcome this deficiency.

Many farmers through adequate capital, skilled management and mass production are making substantial profits regardless of the condition of the farmer who is a poor manager and lacks machinery. An average of 400,000 persons for the past 8 years has left the farm, being replaced by machinery, which does their work better and more quickly. Where electricity is made available, a vast market for electrical farm machinery and household appliances will be opened up. The successful farmer of the future will be a combination business man and technician. He will use machinery, keep accurate records, know production costs and how to control them, thus securing a larger and more staple income.

Many hold the opinion that farming is merely a laboring occupation, requiring bone and muscle only. Agriculture, the foundation and support of human existence is not only fundamental and basic to man's happiness, but rudimentary; requiring knowledge and training to carry on successfully.

Is it not, therefore, obvious that in addition to a common school education, the study of plant life, soil culture and husbandry, the farmer should, to be successful, keep in touch with all improvements, especially those mechanical? Should not specialized and scientific farm training, include a practical knowledge of farm machinery?

In order to accomplish this, your Trustees are now erecting a modern Mechanics Building, solely for the purpose of giving their students a complete course in this important branch.

This utilitarian building, the first of its type in the East, will be complete in every detail. It will be electrically equipped and wired to handle all problems. The basement in its sub-divisions will contain tractor, forge rooms and carpenter shops. A course will be given in the study of gas engines, electric light plants, storage batteries, magnetos and carburetors, now so necessary on isolated farms. The boys will be taught how to run and operate them—to determine horse-power by the break methods, enabling them to handle tractors and make their own repairs when on the field.

Pumping systems on the farm are rapidly becoming popular. By including the various types, deep well and shallow, as well as

hydraulic rams, their mechanics can be practically illustrated. Welding, bending and other blacksmithing will be taught in the forge rooms. In the woodwork shops, students will be shown how to make the many small things always necessary on the farm.

The second floor will be used for the study of farm machinery as to construction, type and method of operation. Farm implements and tractors will be donated by their makers, so our students may dismantle, reassemble and study the methods of transferring power.

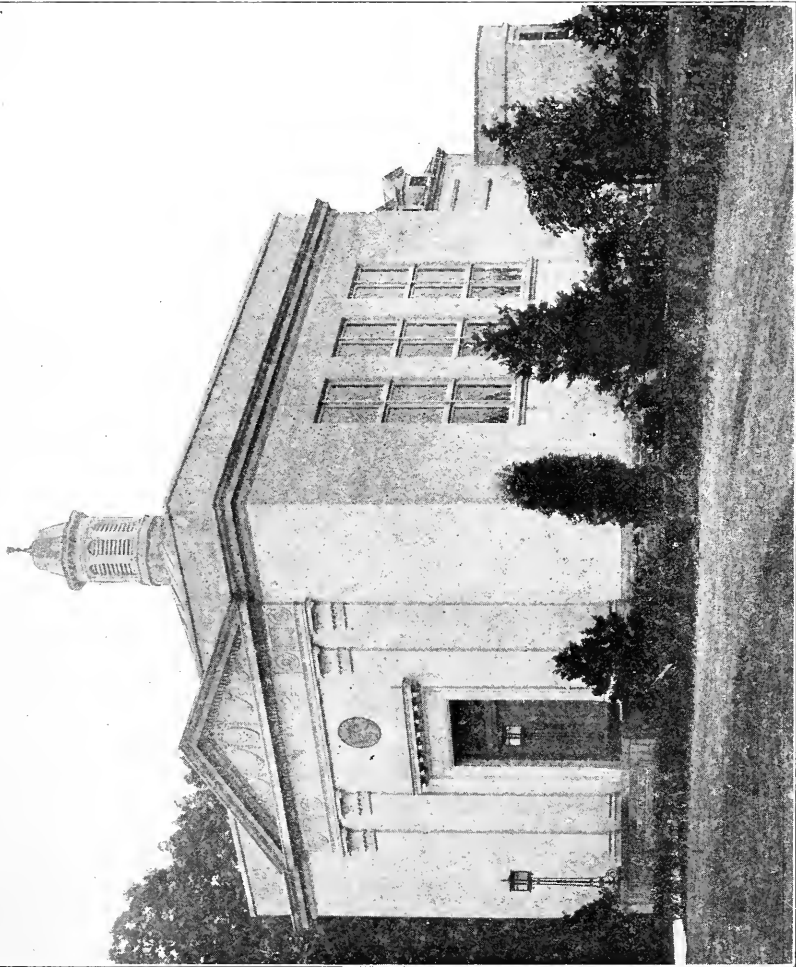
The first floor front will be used as Executive Office and District Post Office.

In addition to the Mechanical Hall, there is being placed in use a new system of interior roads and concrete walks, connecting the various buildings on the Campus, entered through a handsome brick and stone Gateway, the gift of Mr. I. H. Silverman, in memory of his wife.

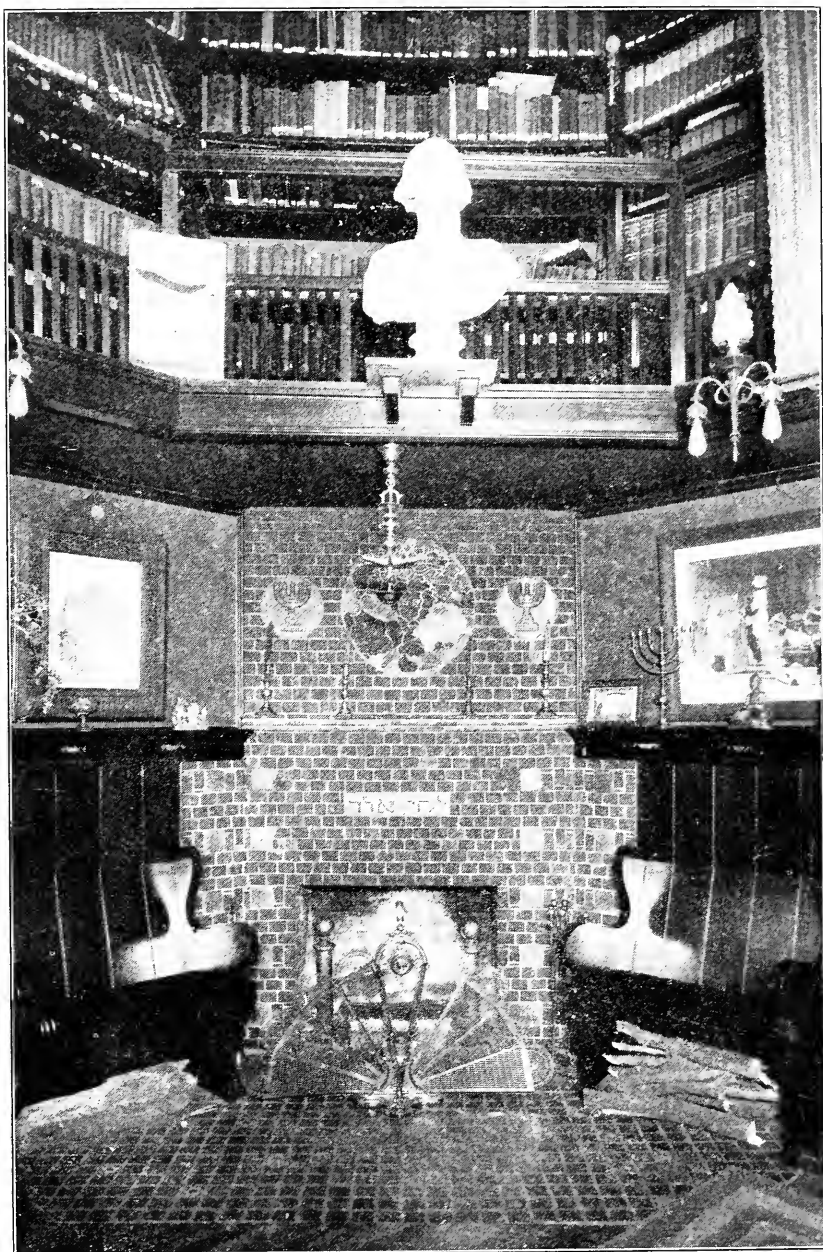
These improvements were designed by Edwin H. Silverman and Abraham Levy, Associate Architects, of Philadelphia, and are being constructed by John S. Bailey and Bro., Contractors, of Doylestown, Pa., under the supervision of our competent Building Chairman, Mr. Leon Rosenbaum.

Taking a retrospective survey of our endeavors during the year just passed, we feel gratified at the results. A summary shows the largest and best enrollment of lads in the School's history; excellent health records of students and staff; good moral and ethical deportment; the graduation of 58 Seniors, now in good paying positions; large and profitable crop and dairy returns; broadening of curriculum and field training; outstanding sport and athletic achievements and wide and favorable press and public commendations—credit for many of these satisfactory results, being mainly due to the efficiency of Prof. C. L. Goodling, Dean of the School.

One of the best evidences of the School's progress, is the rapidly growing list of applicants from all parts of the United States, eager to make some branch of agriculture their vocation. We meet but one discouragement—lack of money. Stretching our maintenance fund to the utmost, we must still every year turn away disheartened scores of worth-while lads who desire to avail themselves of the opportunities afforded by our School.

We are proud of our athletic teams, efficiently coached by Mr. Samuels. They have been almost 100 per cent. victorious, meeting some of the strongest inter-collegiate freshmen teams in the East. The football rallies and victory dinners have been impressive to students, teams and guests, among whom were Olympic Champions and other outstanding amateur and professional athletes.

Our School Band, organized and trained through the voluntary services of Philadelphia's outstanding bandmaster, Lieutenant Joseph Frankel, has been most successful at home and abroad. The String Orchestra has been a credit to its members and entertaining to students. Other student organizations have functioned satisfactorily in fields of agricultural research, general knowledge and entertainment. "The Gleaner," controlled by a student board of editors, is a worthy publication.

Our graduates continue to give excellent account of themselves. Alumni Chapters in various sections of the country are functioning efficiently, helpful to their members and their Alma Mater. We are proud of these upstanding citizens, and glad to meet them at their annual reunions.

Monthly meetings of our Board of Trustees have been largely attended. Our various Men's and Women's Committees and Chairmen have given freely of time and service.

Our reorganized National Board of 117 members, covering every State in the Union, contributes to the advancement of the School in every direction, especially helping in the careful selection of students from distant points.

Our Faculty, Office Staff, Field Representatives, Matron and Domestic Assistants, have given their best co-operation, for which we offer our thanks and appreciation.

Notwithstanding many thousands enthusiastically sponsor and support our School, certain of its high position among educational institutions, we sometimes meet doubters who fail to understand the vital importance of specialized agricultural knowledge and practical training. In order to answer such occasional critics, we sought an opinion from a disinterested source, inviting no less an authority than Dr. Clyde L. King, nationally-known agricultural expert and economist, to make a fair and impartial survey of our Institution and its work. After careful study, he submitted an illuminating 48-page report, including his opinions that the School has a legitimate place in the scheme of Jewish

communal activities—that its success has been completely demonstrated—that its expenditures are kept well within limits—that it exists to give a better chance to boys whose parents cannot give them a fair opportunity, thereby serving trebly—the individual, the family and the community. As a training for living and vocation, our School can, and does, perform service of inestimable value. The School is recognized as a great Jewish philanthropy, and encourages a better racial understanding by accepting a proportionate number of non-Jewish students.

Dr. King adds that educators are in substantial agreement as to the essentials of our training—that pupils learn more rapidly in an environment characterized by happiness, creative ability, educational understanding and mutual service. That we have built up a faith in the School through the country, regardless of race or creed. That we justify our existence as a vocational school aside from the question as to whether it should be devoted to farm training.

He praised our Board comprised of capable educators, philanthropists and representative business and professional men; whose President gratuitously gives full time to both School and office.

He includes a truism, that farming in some sections for various reasons is not prosperous, yet never in our history have individual farmers had the success they now achieve. That the need of American agriculture is for better trained farmers, with an ability to produce, and love for farm life. That our School is situated in a territory where for many years there will be a demand for its graduates at satisfactory wages, and from his own experience, he knows that farmers want to employ our graduates.

The need, value and successful growth of this unique School, amplified in Dr. King's report, stand as a monument to the name of its Revered Founder. The results of Dr. Krauskopf's initial conception are, in themselves, a living tribute to the many sacrifices he so courageously made in building up this great Institution.

On October 1, 1929, our School sustained an irreparable loss in the death of its National Chairman, Trustee and Benefactor, Abraham Erlanger. For over six years, this good man gave unstintedly of himself and of his means for the promotion of this Institution. Becoming actively interested almost simultaneously with the death of our Founder, his desire to help underprivileged lads, and keen business judgment, made him an outstanding

leader. In his death, the School has lost one of its greatest friends, the Board of Trustees their adviser and beloved associate. He was my dear personal friend, whose taking away I deeply mourn.

The death of Joseph Bunford Samuel on January 1, 1929, removed another good friend from our midst. As long as The National Farm School stands, the name of Mr. Samuel will be known as its benefactor and friend.

In conclusion, we offer our sincere appreciation for your past generosity and support. We hope we have merited your approval and patronage, and that we may gather new friends, to the end that this worthwhile endeavor—training city boys as agriculturists—may continue to expand.

NEWSPAPERS PRAISE FARM SCHOOL

The editorials reprinted below are but two of many appearing in the press throughout the country, praising the work and aims of The National Farm School:

Farm School and Machinery

Dedication of the new \$75,000 Administration and Mechanics Building as part of the thirty-second harvest festival and anniversary celebration of The National Farm School, near Doylestown, is a significant event in denoting the modern trend of agriculture.

Rapid mechanization of the farming industry, and observation of the results where adequate use of modern machinery and electrical appliances are being made, confirm the President, Mr. Herbert D. Allman, in his belief that the successful farmer of the future will be "a combination business man and technician." Therefore it is that the Trustees are adding a Mechanics Building for the sole purpose of training the students in the use of the latest agricultural machinery, and electrical appliances for the farm and home.

In this recognition that the greatest of the nation's basic industries is undergoing transition, The National Farm School points the way to the solution of the farmer's problems in a manner that legislative nostrums, debentures, price-fixing and the like cannot avail. Methods are being transformed to such a degree that production of crops enormously increases while the

rural population diminishes, the net loss to the farm population last year being estimated at 400,000.

Mr. Allman speaks as an expert who takes a comprehensive view of the situation, where he flouts such expressions as "farm depression" and "farm relief," and suggests that it is time they should be banished from the public consciousness. Farming, as he intimates, is well able to hold up its head, secure in the sound business structure of the nation.—*Editorial appearing in Philadelphia Evening Bulletin, October 22, 1929; one of the largest circulated newspapers in the United States.*

Honoring the Founder at The National Farm School

Mr. Herbert D. Allman, President of The National Farm School, did well at the Founder's Day exercises last Sunday to emphasize the fact that originally as conceived by its founder, the late Dr. Jos. Krauskopf, the School was intended as a Jewish educational institution. Founded in the true spirit of democracy and of tolerance it was natural that provision should be made for the admission of students not of the Jewish faith. Primarily, however, The National Farm School was to be a Jewish training school for those Jewish boys who would follow agriculture as a career.

The exercises at The National Farm School last Sunday were in keeping with the spirit of the founder. Proper emphasis was laid upon the importance of training students for agricultural pursuits. In this the record of the School is exemplary. The late Dr. Krauskopf was among the first to preach farming as a career for a large number of the Jewish youth of America. What has transpired in the course of the last quarter of a century—the agitation in favor of placing Jews on the farm in some of the countries of Europe as well as the increased Jewish farming population here and their stability on the land—fully justified the vision and persistence of the founder, and gave to The National Farm School a position unique in American Jewish life.—*Editorial from the prominent Jewish weekly, The Jewish Exponent, of Philadelphia, June 7, 1929.*

On the first day of October, 1929, Abraham Erlanger, National Chairman, Trustee and benefactor of The National Farm School, was relieved of all earthly cares by the decree of an All-Wise Providence. The officers, members of the Board of Trustees, Faculty and student body of The National Farm School, all of whom mourn in the passing of UNCLE ABE, the loss of a beloved friend, make this tribute.

For over six years this wise and generous man, with modesty and self-effacement, coupled with great zeal and determination, gave unstintedly of himself and generously of his means for the promotion of the best interests of the School. He devoted and supported the great vision of the founder, Joseph Krauskopf, with all his heart and soul.

The School has lost one of its greatest friends and the Board of Trustees their adviser and beloved associate. It is hereby

RESOLVED, That this minute be suitably engrossed as a permanent memorial to be placed on the walls of the Administration Building of the School, and a copy be given to the family; that it be published in the press of Philadelphia and New York; in the Year Book of The National Farm School, and be spread upon the minutes of the meeting.

The "Presentation of the Hoe," a symbolic ceremony, was made by Leon Rosenzweig, President of the Graduating Class, to the President of the incoming Senior Class.

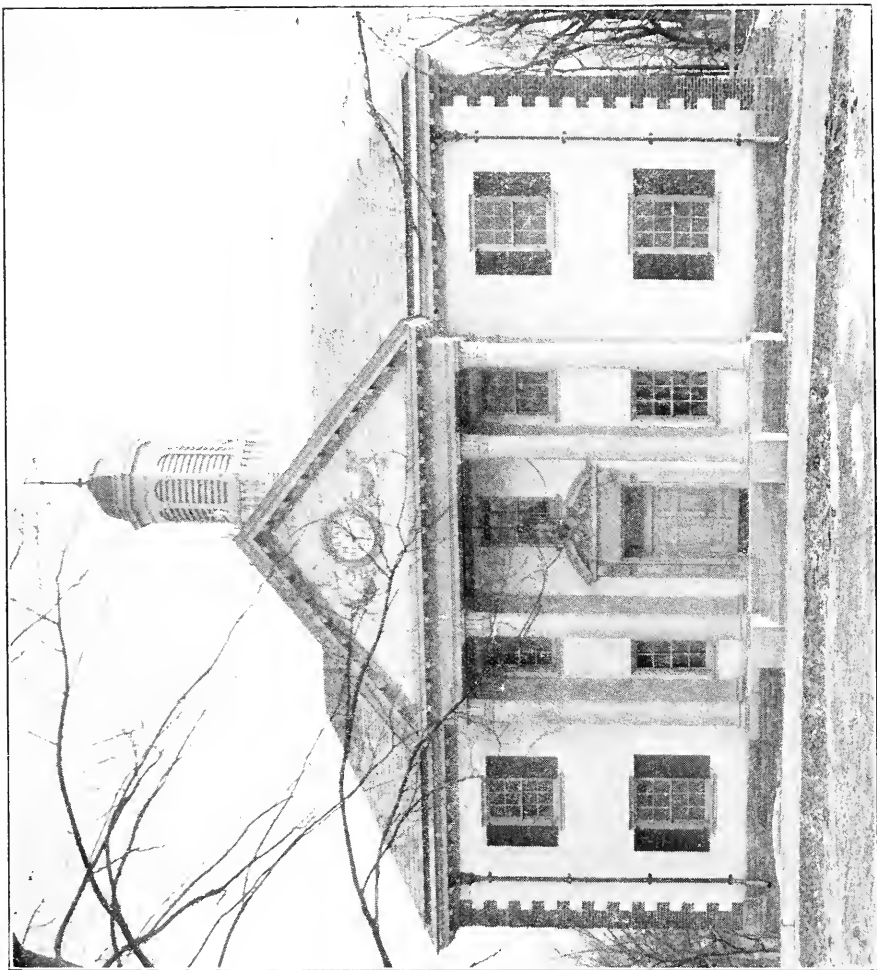

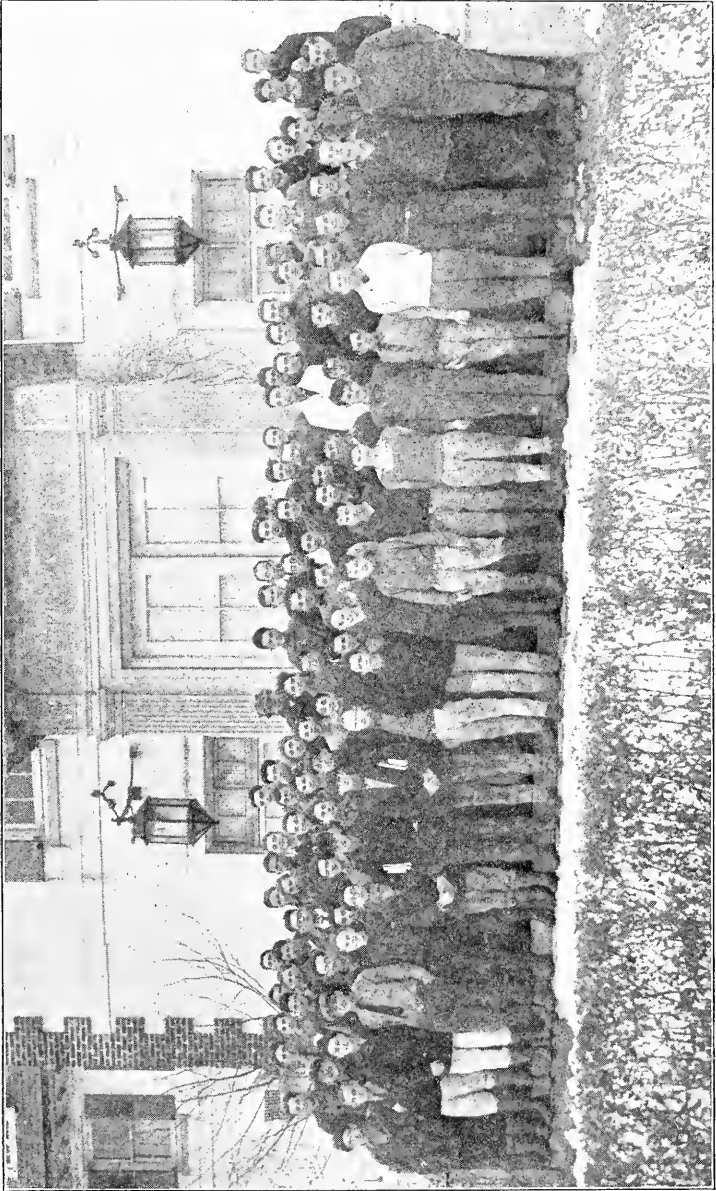

FOUNDER'S DAY**Sunday, June 2, 1929**

The Annual Founder's Day Exercises of The National Farm School were held on the School grounds, June 2, 1929, in a grove of trees forming a charming natural auditorium.

In addition to honoring the memory of the founder, Dr. Jos. Krauskopf, to which Founder's Day is especially dedicated, the exercises included the celebration of the Thirty-second Annual Spring Exercises; Tree Consecration; and breaking of ground for the proposed new Farm Mechanics and Administrative Building.

Hon. Harry A. Mackey, Mayor of Philadelphia, the guest speaker of the day, devoted his address to an appreciation of "the splendid work being accomplished by The National Farm School."

Dr. Wm. H. Fineshriber delivered the Tree Consecration Address, dedicating fifty-one Memorial Trees, planted in memory of friends of the School, and a number of Festive Trees, to commemorate various occasions. Concluding his beautiful dedicatory address, Dr. Fineshriber said, "Dr. Krauskopf's great dream of the good to be accomplished by a school such as this, is coming true. The finest citizenship in the United States has come from the farm. The trouble with agriculture is that the average farmer does not realize how much he must know in order to be successful."

Herbert D. Allman, President of the School, in welcoming the hundreds of visitors from nearby cities and towns, and neighboring States, said in part: "It is my privilege and pleasure to extend greetings and a hearty welcome to you, to join in the observance of Founder's Day, to honor the memory of our illustrious founder, Dr. Joseph Krauskopf.

"It is now six years since Dr. Krauskopf's death. His co-workers, comprising the Board of Trustees, indulge the hope, their endeavors, in co-operation with the Dean and Faculty, in carrying on and enlarging the purposes of this School, have proved successful. What has been accomplished?

"Our capital assets have increased threefold since 1923. It is true we have a large deficit in our Maintenance Fund, which accumulates because we accept more boys than we should, owing to the growing pressure of so many worthy applicants.

"Six years ago, the enrollment was 98; today it comprises 183. In 1923 we graduated 32 students—in March of this year

58, all of whom have been advantageously placed in branches of agriculture in which they majored. Since 1923, many buildings and plant improvements have been made, through the generosity of patrons. Ground is being broken today for the erection of a combined Administration and Farm Mechanics Building, the first building for instruction in farm machinery in this part of the country. Satisfactory working arrangements between Penn State College and our School are efficiently functioning in soil and fertilizer experimentations.

“This School, as originally conceived by Dr. Krauskopf, is a Jewish educational philanthropy, encouraging Jewish boys particularly, to make some branch of agriculture their vocation. It was the purpose of this man of great vision, to discourage racial intolerance; therefore, a proportion of non-Jewish boys has always been welcome.

“Our graduates are equipped with brain, brawn and training, enabling them to make their way creditably through life. They are better qualified as citizens, mentally, morally and physically, because of the training received at our School.”

Prof. C. L. Goodling, Dean of the School, in a brief address, declared that the future success of agriculture depends more than ever on efficient operation of the farm itself—more, even, than upon any legislation which may be passed in aid of the farmer. The crying need of the country today is for scientifically trained men to supervise and manage farming lands, and in this aim the Farm School stands forward in remarkable fashion.

Mr. Justin P. Allman, President of the Federation of Jewish Charities of Philadelphia, greeted the gathering in a few brief remarks. Dr. Geo. P. Ettenger, Dean of Muhlenberg College, also made a short address.

Mayor Mackey, Herbert D. Allman and Leon Rosenbaum, Chairman of the Building Committee, assisted in the ceremonies incident to the breaking of ground for the Farm Mechanics and Administration Building.

Mr. Harry B. Hirsh, Chairman of the Board, presided at the Exercises. Music was furnished by the student Band under the direction of Lieut. Joseph Frankel, Musical Director.

REPORT OF THE DEAN**C. L. Goodling****To the Thirty-second Annual Meeting, October 20, 1929**

In accordance with custom, I have been asked to make a report as Dean of the School for the year just ended. I shall confine myself to a few brief remarks relative to the operation of the School.

It has been our increasing purpose, during the past year, to weed out, after a fair trial, those students who gave evidence of not being fitted for agricultural work, or who did not fully measure up to the standards of the School. We believe that in order to make our graduates what we hope to have them, we must work only with the boy who shows a real interest in his work. With the object in view of consistently turning out better trained men, we have raised our entrance educational requirement to completion of at least nine years of school work. This was done only after due thought and consideration. When studying the records of previous years, we found that in nearly every case the boy who entered with only a common school training, had difficulty in grasping the work, and in only a few cases did he remain until graduation.

The student organizations have been functioning even better than usual, and a number of new clubs have been formed during the year. This work is being encouraged by the Administration, especially with a view to increasing interest in clubs pertaining to agricultural endeavors.

It has been our belief that if our students are to receive the full benefit of our training we must follow the modern-day method of teaching; namely, that of teaching by example. This we have started and hope to improve on our methods in the future. I can probably best illustrate what I mean by giving you figures as to the workings of the School during the last several years. There apparently existed an erroneous impression that because we are a school, and because we are teaching boys who have had no previous farm training, it is impossible to make our farms show profits. This, I think, has been a serious mistake, for if we cannot demonstrate in practice what we are trying to teach in theory, our teaching is bound to fail. With this thought in mind, we have endeavored to improve our farming conditions, thereby stimulating interest in the work among the student body, and

prove that even under our adverse conditions of inexperienced student labor, sometimes resulting in expensive breaking of tools, implements, loss of valuable stock, etc., it is not necessary to run at a loss. The figures which I will quote will bear out this statement. These figures relate to farm operations only. The income from farm operations, 1926-27, was \$32,469.45 and the budget expenditures \$33,949.91, making a deficit of income under budget expenses of \$1,480.46. In 1927-28, the income was \$40,823.75, and budget expenditures \$38,197.80, or a net gain of \$2,525.95. 1928-29 shows an income of \$44,015.21 and budget expenditures of \$33,965.63 or a profit of \$11,049.58, making a net gain over 1926-27 of \$12,530.04. I would call your attention to the fact that this gain was made not under an increased expenditure but at a reduced expenditure, the operating expenses of the farms during this year being \$5,000 less than in the previous year. Barring any unforeseen drop in prices, this present year ending April, 1930, should produce \$55,000, with an increase over expenses of \$20,000. This brings me to another point on which I want to touch briefly; namely, that the success and future of agriculture depend more upon efficient operation and proper organization, than probably on any other factor. I believe much can be done to put farming on a profitable basis by proper co-operation. That is work on which our National Agricultural Farm Board, recently appointed by President Hoover, is now concentrating, their scheme being to form small co-operative organizations, uniting them into larger groups and finally combining these larger groups into one central unit. This seems to me to be a sensible idea, for as stated before, organization and proper management, are without doubt the secret of successful farming.

I again want to point out that the above figures refer to farm operations only. As during the three years' course we give our students tuition, books, laboratory supplies, board, room, laundry and other necessities free of charge, our budget for maintenance, education and property up-keep, while economically operated, is still a large one. Our School is also different from other schools, in that we operate twelve months in the year, carrying this expense throughout the year, whereas most schools operate only eight to ten months.

Another feature which we have established at the School has been that of conducting various experimental projects. There is only one to which I will refer here; namely, the co-operative

fertilizer experiment between Pennsylvania State College and The National Farm School. While this experiment has not been running sufficiently long to give detailed information, nevertheless, we have been able in the last two years, to show increased yields as high as 40 per cent., due to proper fertilization. An expenditure of \$3.50 per acre increased our wheat yield to a value of \$15.00 per acre. This is quite an item when we consider the millions of acres of wheat grown annually. It is this kind of practice we are trying to teach our students. I believe things of this kind will create and stimulate interest which will make young men remain on the farm.

We have not confined our work only to farming, but are also endeavoring to make our live-stock show profitable production. With this idea in view, we have secured some high-bred cattle, and when I point out to you that our dairy herd last year made a net profit of over \$9,000 you can see that this should be encouraging to men who want to follow that profession. The dairy produced last year 579,827.8 pounds of milk.

You will, no doubt, be interested to know what is happening to our graduates. Of the 57 men graduated in the spring of 1929, 52 were placed in positions at an average salary of \$69.50 per month with board, room and laundry. We have endeavored to keep in touch with our graduates during the past year, and have published a monthly News Letter which was sent to each of them, in which we tried to encourage and help these young men until they have more thoroughly established themselves. We have also received very many complimentary letters from their employers. Within the last two days I have been in communication with one of the largest farms in the eastern part of the United States, and have been told by the manager that the young graduate of the Farm School employed by him is the most efficient and capable man in his employ. I have also received many letters from graduates themselves, expressing satisfaction with their work. It is our hope that we may continue to encourage these young men and keep them on the farm.

Our under-graduates are doing very much better classroom work under the system of instruction introduced last year, than was possible under the old system. At present we have only one or two in poor standing, the number of conditions among the student body being reduced approximately to 100, which is an excellent showing for a school of this type. We are also glad to report that through the good judgment of various

classes, hazing has been practically eliminated from the School. These young men are to be commended upon such a step, and I want to compliment them publicly for this manly act.

I do not want to create the impression that we are only teaching agriculture. Much time and effort is given to ethical training, character building, and the turning out of good citizens, which after all is more essential than any profession.

The physical improvements in the School you can note for yourself, and will be discussed in other reports. The Mechanics Building we are dedicating today is one of the most forward-looking steps that The National Farm School has taken, and it shall be our endeavor, with the additional training we will be able to give our students, in all branches of farm mechanics and modern farm machinery and appliances, to turn out graduates who can take their places as efficient farm managers on most any farm project.

THIRTY-SECOND ANNUAL MEETING AND HARVEST FESTIVAL

Sunday, October 20, 1929

A perfect autumn day greeted the large gathering of friends of The National Farm School, who assembled on the School grounds on Sunday, October 20, 1929, to participate in the Harvest Festival and Thirty-second Annual Meeting of the Institution.

The outstanding event of the day was the dedication of the new \$75,000 Farm Mechanics Building, the first of its kind in the East, for instruction in modern farm machinery and electrical appliances, so important on the farm today. The dedicatory address was made by Edwin H. Silverman, a member of the Board of Trustees, and designer of the building.

New Entrance Gates, erected in memory of Ida Hirsch Silverman, by her husband, Isaac H. Silverman, and family, and a new system of interior roadways, forming a valuable addition to the facilities of the Institution, were also dedicated, in a beautiful tribute to the late Mrs. Silverman, by Harry B. Hirsh, Chairman of the Board.

The Exercises were held in the Louchheim Auditorium, which was artistically decorated with autumn flowers and foliage, and School-grown farm products, presenting a colorful background to the occasion.

Adolph Eichholz, charter member of the School, and a prominent Philadelphia attorney, presided. Herbert D. Allman, President of the School, presented the President's Message (printed in full on pages 5-11 of this book), an important paper, dealing with present-day agricultural conditions, and citing the many improvements made by the School, in its physical and educational advancement.

Prof. C. L. Goodling, Dean, presented his annual report, stressing efficiency in cultivation and marketing, and indicating increased income from the farms during the year. (Published in full on pages 24-27 of this book.)

A tribute to the memory of Abraham Erlanger, National Chairman, Trustee and benefactor of The National Farm School, who passed away on October 9, 1929, was offered by Joseph H. Hagedorn, who voiced the sentiments of the meeting in expressing the love and esteem in which this good man was held.

The following officers were re-elected for a term of one year: Herbert D. Allman, President; Joseph H. Hagedorn, Vice-President. Members of the Board of Trustees whose terms expired were re-elected for three years as follows: Wm. H. Fineshriber, Joseph H. Hagedorn, Maurice Jacobs, Henry A. James, James A. Pratt, Mrs. Arthur K. Stern, Grant Wright and James Weintraub. The following new Trustees were elected: Isadore Baylson, Harry Burstein, Elias Nusbaum, Julian A. Hillman and Louis Schlesinger, the latter two having rendered valuable service for many years as members of the National Board.

The meeting also confirmed the appointment of Louis Schlesinger as Chairman of the National Board of State Directors, comprising 120 members, and representing every State in the Union.

Music for the occasion was furnished by Lieut. Joseph Frankel, of Philadelphia, and his band. The feature number played for the first time, entitled "The National Farm School March," was composed by Mr. Drue N. Allman, and dedicated to Mr. Chas. Kline, of Allentown, Pa., whose gifts made possible the formation of the student band of thirty-five pieces. The student band under the direction of Lieut. Frankel also rendered several numbers, including the "President's March," composed by Lieut. Frankel, and dedicated to Herbert D. Allman, President of the School.

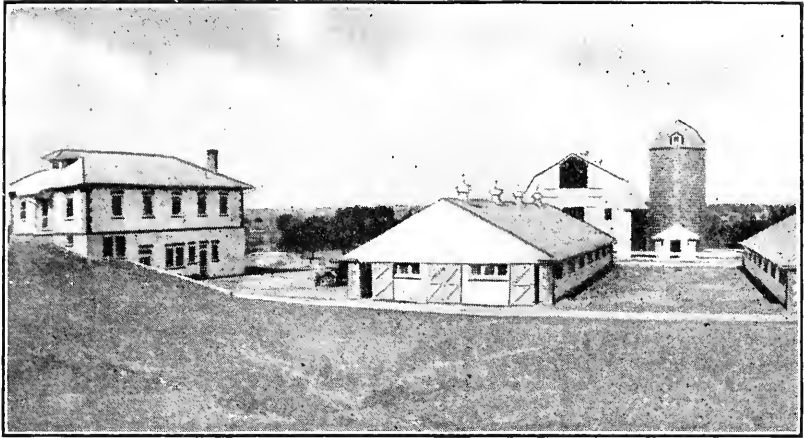

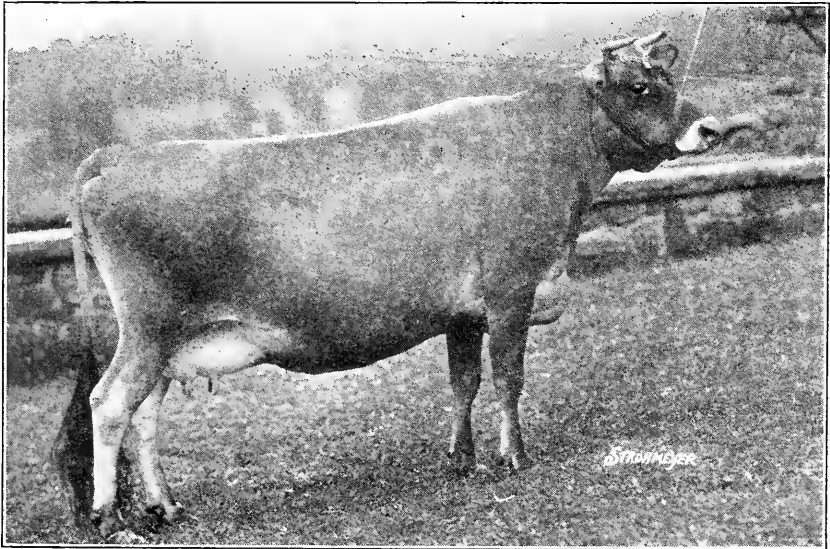

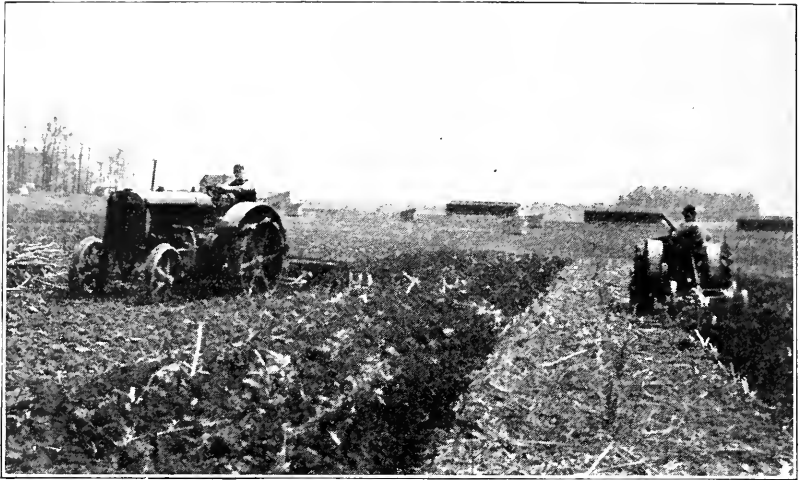

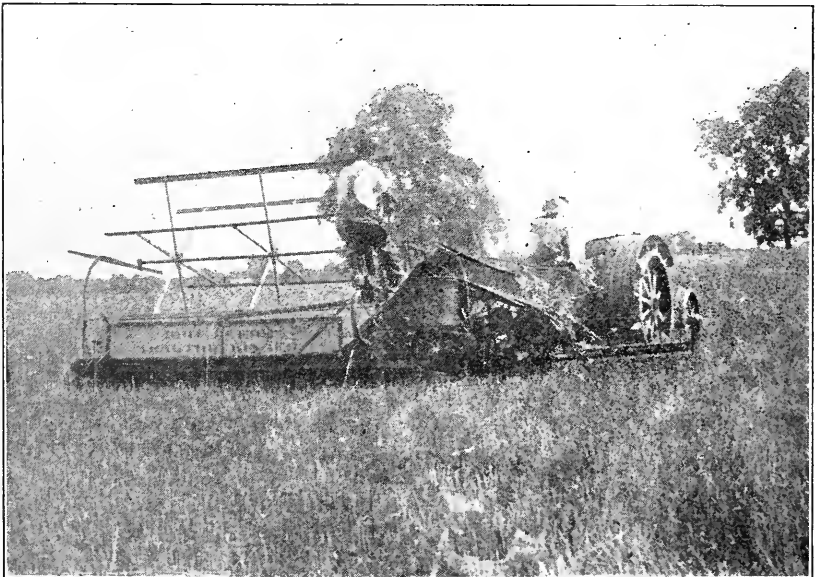

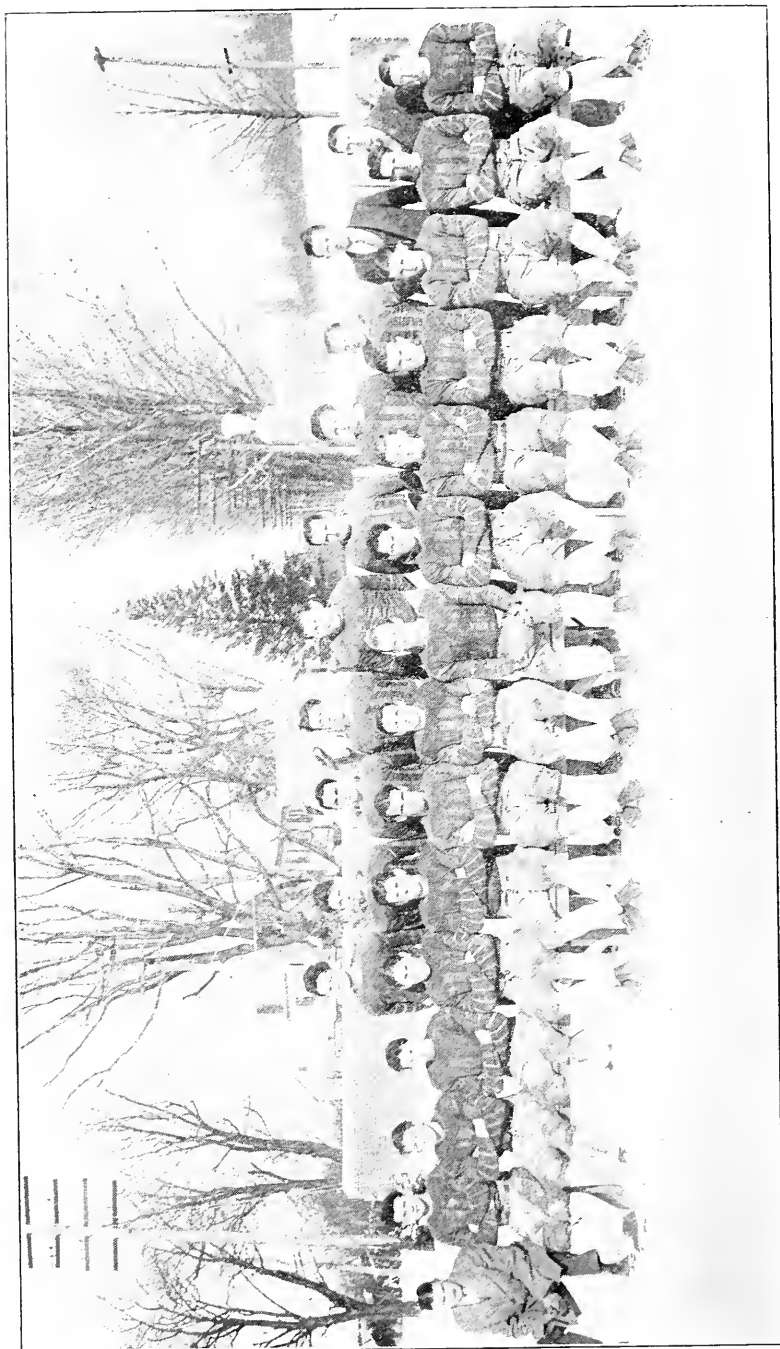

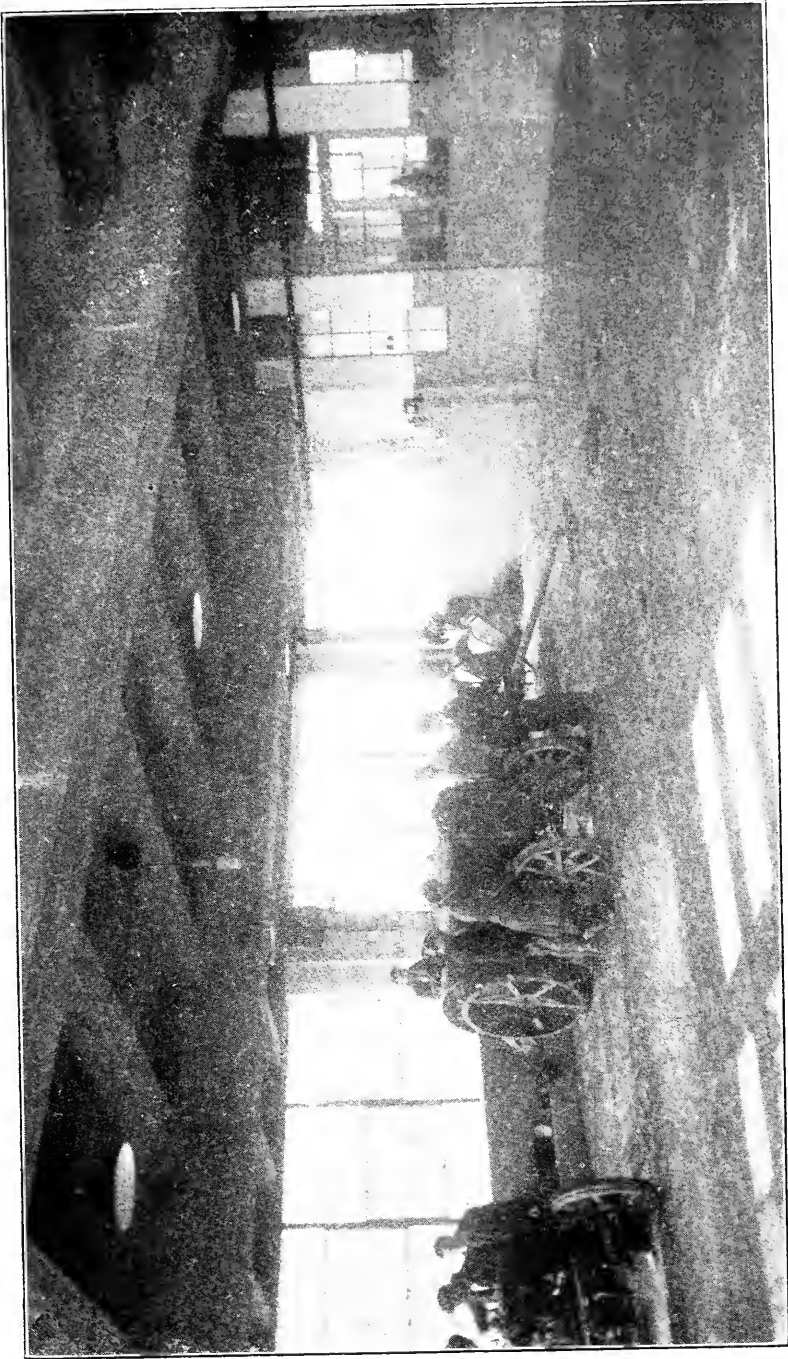

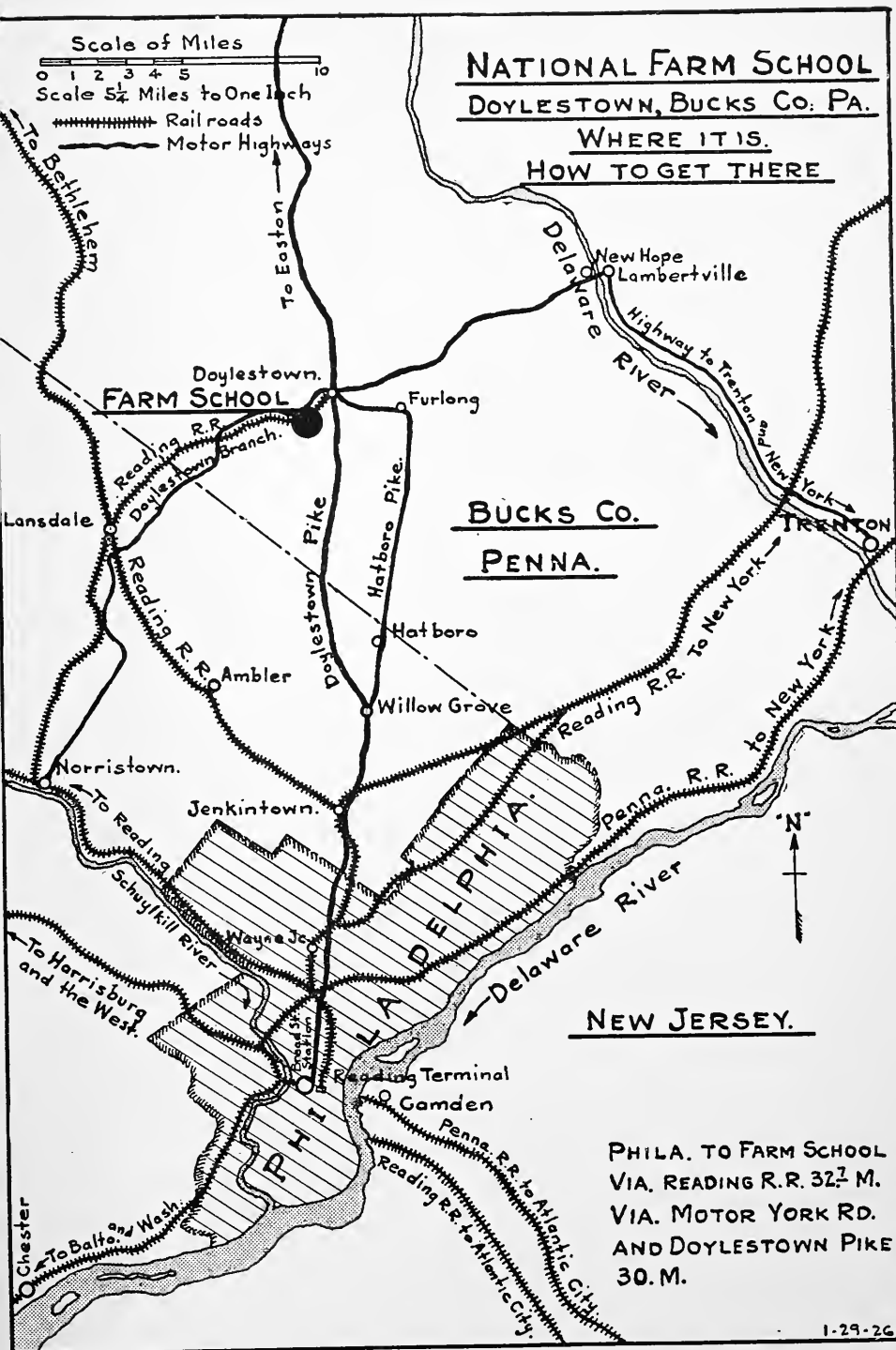
