## To Henry C. Wayne,

 Adjutant \& Inspector General.General:-Having been charged by His Excellency, the Governor, with the duty of receiving and issuing to Soldiers Families in the State, the salt received under the State contract with Messrs. M. S. Temple \& Co., from the Virginia Salt Works, in addition to the duties of my office proper, I have the honor to transmit herewith, first, my Fi nancial Report marked " $A$ " showing the receipts and disbursements of money on account of the same, from the: 31st day of July, 1862, to the 1st day of November, 1S63, both days inclusive; Second, Abstract "No. 1", showing the quantity of salt received and paid for by Capt. J. R.. Wikle, Agent of the State at the "Virginia salt Works"; and third, Abstracts Nos. 2, 3, 4 and 5 , showing the issues of salt by this department and to whous made, embracing the same periods.

From my Financial Report, marked "A" it will be seen that, in the aggregate, I have received on account of salt issued $\$ 242,26600$; from the State Treasury, on Exccutive Warrants, $\$ 200,00000$; from Ben May, Treasurer State Road, $\$ 20,00000$ and from State Agents on settlement, $\$ 43150$, my receipts in the aggregate amounting to $\$ 462,-$ 69750 , which amount has been disbursed as follows: Turned over to J. R. Wikle, State Agent at Saltville, $\S 200,69092$; to Salt Agents in the State. $\$ 54,24794 ;$ paid oll account of freights, $\$ 47,63454$; paid to Ben May, Treasurer State Road, $\$ 30,00000$; paid salaries to Agents, $\$ 7,55736$; paid incidental expenses, $\$ 1,19324$; leaving a balance in my hands on the 1st instant of $\$ 121$.$0: 3750$, and showing that the actual amount expended out of the funds received from the State, by this department up to the ist instant, on account of the salt contract with Messis. Temple it Co., has been only $\$ 95,96250$. The payment to Ben May, Treasurer of the State Road of $\$ 30,-$ 00000 , was made to re-imburse to him an advance madeto this office of $\$ 20,00000$; to Cipt. J. R. Wikle, Agent. $\$ \$, 00000$; on freight account $\$ 1,00000$; and to Dr. J. W. Lewis, $\$ 1,00000$, while acting for the State, as its agent, and which was properly disbursed, having been expended for the benefit ol the State.

Abstract "No. 1" shows the monthly receipts of salt by

Capt. J. R. Wikle, the State Agent at Saltville, and the several amounts paid for the same. It will be seen that in the months of January, February and September of the present year, no salt was received from the contractors by the Agent at Saltrille. This was owing, as reported to this oflice, in the two former months, to the want of wood and other unavoidable causes, and in the latter month to theatenerhaids of the enemy in the vicinity of the Salt Works. total number of bushels of salt received by the Agent at Saltville, up to the 1st instant, it appears, was $84,3941-2$ bushels, for wheh he paid $\leqslant 182,54575$; his payments embracing an extra compensation to the contractors of $\$ 100$ per bushel, by order of the Governor under a resolution of the legislature, on $50,0 \pm 3$ 1-2 bushels.

Abstract "No. 2" embraces a statement of the quantity of salt issued to Soldiers Families, under an order of His Excelleney the Governor, dated July 31st, 1862. This abstract shows that the soldiers families who applied for it, in every county in the State, were supplied with salt ; 3,670 widows of deceased soldiers receiving, each, one-half bushel of salt, free of charge, and $37,32.4$ wives of soldiers, and widows having $a$, son or sons in the service receiving, each, one-half bushel for one dollar, making a total of 40,994 persons, who were the recipients of 20,497 bushels of salt under this order.

Having completed the distribution of salt throughout the State under the provisions of the first order of the Governor, and, haviug notified him of the same, I was directed hy him, on the 16 th of December, 1862 , to proceed to issue to each family in the North-Eastern, including Dade county of the North-Western, Section of the State, with one bushel each, at $\$ 5,00$ per bushel. This order was executed, as you will perceive, by reference to Abstract "No. 3", from which it will be seen, that in the eleven counties therein embraced, $\mathrm{SS12}$ families were supplied with the same number of bushels of salt, for which I received the sum of $\$ 44,06000$.
$\Lambda$ bstract "No. 4," shows the quantity of salt issued under special orders received from the Governor at rarious times, from August 26 th, 1562 , to November 1st, 1563.

Abstract "No. 5" shows the quantity of salt issued to soldiers families under the Governor's order dated July 24 th, 1863 , up to the 1 st instant. This Abstract embraces the number of widows of ceceased soldiers, the number of wives of soldiers, the number of widows laving a son or sons in military service, the number of other families dependent on soldiers in service for support, and disabled discharged soldiers, in 114 counties in the State, who have applied for, and who lave received one-half bushel of salt, each, at $\$ \pm 00$ per half bushel, to-wit: 5,949 widows of deceased soldiers, 27,594 wives of soldiers, $4, \mathrm{SS2}$ widows
having a son or sons in service, 1,005 families dependent on soldiers, and 550 disabled discharged soldiers, making in the aggregate, 39,950 persons who have received salt under this last distribution, and for which $\$ 160,25400$ have been paid into this office as per abstract. Since the 1st instant eight other counties have applied and shipments ordered to them, which are not included in this Report.The remaining ten counties will be supplied as soon as the list of names and money are received.

You will perceive in Abstract "No. 1" that Capt. Wikle, the State Agent, reports having received and paid for S4,$394 \frac{4}{2}$ bushels of salt, at the Salt Works in Virginia. From shipments which he has made, this department has received 72,626 bushels as per his invoices, less the wastage. The several Abstracts herewith presented show that 49,637.2 bushels have been issued under the several Executive orders up to the 1 st of November, 1563 . The remainder, not issued, is in the hands of the several Agents at different points in the State. The balance of the salt purchased by Capt. Wikle is, I am informed by him, in transit to this place. The receipts and issues of salt under the contract with Messrs. Temple it Co., have been attended with responsibility and great labor. The agents employed in the State, and the one at Saltville, Capt. Wikle, I cannot too highly commend for the faithful manner in which they have respectively discharged their several duties to the State. Embarrassments of various kinds have attended its manufacture and transportation, and not so large a quantity has been received under the contract as was calculated upon at the time it was made. Nevertheless, I am gratified at being able to state, which I do confidently, that the issues of salt made through this department, to the widows, wives, and families of soldiers, were most opportune; were received gratefully by them, and reflects credit upon the wisdom and patriotism of the State.

For future reference, not only the reports of the Agents connected with the receipts and issues of salt through this department are on file in this office, but a complete book record has been kept of the same. Records have also beein made of the applications transmitted by the Inferior Courts of the several counties in the State, which embraces the names of the parties to whom salt has been issued, as well as of all receipts, disbursements and expenditures counected therewith.

With the request that this Report, forwarded in duplicate, be transmitted to His Excelleney the Governor, it is respectfully submitted.
