ADDRESS

THE REV. DR. JOSEPH KRAUSKOPF

Founder and President of

THE NATIONAL FARM SCHOOL

ON THE OCCASION OF ITS TWENTY-FIFTH SUCCOTH HARVEST PILGRIMAGE OCTOBER 15, 1922

Somewhere, some poet said "every anniversary is the dispelling of a dream." Back of this utterance there may have been sad experiences. Our experience since the founding of The National Farm School, twenty-five years ago last June, has been far more favorable. Each annual gathering recorded a nearer fulfillment of the dream we cherished. We knew when we started that in the history of a project so radically new as the Farm School the time-element must not be stressed too hard. The sinking in of new thoughts is a very slow process, often requiring centuries before an enduring impression is made upon the masses. To have accomplished as much as this Farm School has in so short a space of time, spells to a historian not a "dispelling of a dream," but a very near realization of it.

We knew that we would have to travel a difficult road when we entered upon this new enterprise, and we found it as difficult as we had expected. Many were the obstacles that Past Doubt Dispelled and were placed in our way. Frequent were the times Recognition when the epithets "dreamers," "visionaries," Gained. were hurled at us for attempting what then seemed absurd, that of trying to make farmers of city lads. Small was the number of those who attended the Opening Exercises twenty-five years ago, and these, for the most part, attended more as a compliment to the Projector of the School than as approvers of it. Last June an audience that numbered many thousands was in attendance, whose enthusiasm was yet larger than their numbers, who gathered here from far and near to listen to speakers who ranked among the foremost, to men such as Adolph S. Ochs, the distinguished publisher of the "New York Times"; Samuel Vauclain, the President of the Baldwin Locomotive Works; Irvin S. Cobb, the world-renowned author and lecturer; Emile Berliner, the inventor; our former Minister to Japan, the Hon. Roland S. Morris; former Governor of Pennsylvania, Hon. Edwin S. Stuart; and a number of other men of light and leading, as distinguished as those named, each one vying with the other in praise of the good and needed work done by the Farm School, and prophesying yet greater things to be done by it.

Today, another large concourse of people has assembled to behold the partial fulfillment of the prophecy made four short months ago: the dedication of an Audito-Present Achieverium for the accommodation of the thousands of ments Prophesy people that gather here each year; a large Carna-Yet Greater Future. tion House, supplementing our Floricultural Plant; three spacious Laying-Houses, supplementing our Poultry Plant; all the free-will offerings of friends and believers in the work in which we are engaged. These new evidences of the hold the School has acquired constitute new prophecies—prophecies that the Farm School's hitherto difficult path is ending, that smoother and pleasanter traveling is before it.

We bear no ill-will toward those who opposed the starting of the Farm School, twenty-five years ago, or denied it their support after it had started. They were guided by An Old Error their light, as we were guided by ours. Laid Low. needed being convinced of the needfulness of a Farm School, and it was up to us to do the convincing. of them who were of the Jewish faith could not believe that the Jew, who is pre-eminently a city-dweller, could be turned into a farmer. They had obviously forgotten that the Jew pursued scarcely any other calling than that of tilling the soil, cultivating orchard and vineyard, shepherding herd and flock, as long as he inhabited Palestine, and that as long as he was thus engaged, the Holy Land overflowed with grain and fruit, with milk and honey. They had forgotten that many of Israel's prophets and kings, law-givers and bards, followed the plow, pastured the flock, pruned the vine, while leading or shepherding the people. They had forgotten that the Jew became a city-dweller only after he was driven from his native land, was bounded over the earth, was everywhere denied the right of tilling the soil, was compelled by cruel law to live in the cities and engage in trade. They did not know then, what is common knowledge today, that wherever the Jew re-enters upon his ancient pursuit, he proves himself, within a short time, as fit for agriculture as does the descendant of a long and unbroken line of rural ancestry, that mixing thrift and brain with brawn, he soon succeeds in making a satisfactory living out of the soil, as witnessed today by the Zionists on Palestinian lands which the Arab had long neglected and abused, or by the American Jewish farmers in the New England States, where they provide the population of New York and Boston with a considerable portion of their daily dairy and poultry needs.

Others there were who based their objection to the Farm School on different grounds. To them it seemed the height of

Charge Common That City Lads Will Not Follow Agriculture. stupidity to expect boys, born and bred in crowded cities, to forsake the attractions of the city, and isolate themselves in the country, at the very time when boys, born and bred in the coun-

try, were deserting it by the thousands. Farm-life, these objectors declared, has no attraction for the wide-awake city boy. There is neither money nor pleasure nor honor in it. As a calling, it is doomed. How and where and by whom food is to be gotten when the farmer does not furnish it, how a nation can hope to endure, can hope to preserve its moral stamina, without a healthy and happy peasantry back of it, these questions did not seem to bother the objectors.

There were, however, those who looked deeper and further into the matter. They were students of history and of econom-

Evils of City Congestion Recognized by Economists. ics. They remembered the decline and fall of empires which an attitude such as that of the objectors had brought about in the past. They remembered that it was the congestion of the

city and the desertion of the farm that caused the fall of ancient Rome. They recalled riots and rebellions and revolutions caused by want of bread. They looked into the moral and mental and physical diseases of present-day society, they inquired into the causes of the bitter contention between labor and capital, into the why and wherefore of the spread of tuberculosis, of the growth of atheism, anarchy, and crime. Tracing each, step by step, every inquiry brought the same answer: City Congestion and Farm Desolation.

They saw but one remedy, the raising against the loud cry: "Forward to the City!" a yet louder cry: "Back to the Farm!

Back to the broad and sunlit acres of the country! Back to where there is food enough, and work enough, and health enough, and happiness enough, for all! Back to the pure and simple life which the founders and pioneers of our country lived, and which made possible the greatness of our Nation! Away from city-snares and temptations, from city-exhaustions and breakdowns, from city vices and pollutions! Back to nature, and, through nature, to nature's God!"

To that proposition we heard two answers, one, bitter and derisive; the other, feeble and plaintive; the former coming, for the most part, from the prosperous of the cities, The Cry of the from those whose fortunes were coined out of City Submerged. the sweat and heart's blood of the city slaves, who branded the advocates of a return of the submerged of the cities "Disturbers of the Peace," "Meddlers and Mischief Makers," "Disseminators of Discontent Among the Laboring People." The other, the feeble voice, said: "Prepare ye the way for us. and we will come. Hasten, for we see nothing but misery and demoralization before us in the Ghettos and slums. We have not the means to make our way to the country by ourselves. Even if we had, we know not how to farm. Take our sons and teach them, and when they shall have learned they will lead us out of bondage into freedom, out of misery into happiness."

I was of those who were deeply stirred by that call, and resolved to do what I could in answer to it. I was greatly strengthened in my resolution by a lengthy dis-Tolstoi's cussion of that problem with the late farmer-Admonition. philosopher, Leo Tolstoi, upon his farm in Russia. I had pilgrimaged to him for help to check the enforced immigration to our shores of hundreds of thousands of refugees from Russian persecution. "I cannot end the Jew's misery in my country," said he, "but you can end it in your country. There is but one cure for these unfortunates. Do not allow Ghettos to spring up in your land. Ghettos invite slavery, poverty, discontent, labor troubles, godlessness, lawlessness, moral and mental and physical disease. You have broad acres and rich soil, more than you know what to do with. Millions of your acres lie idle, your arable land cries loud for workers. Lead the tens of thousands of people that congest and corrupt your cities to your idle, fertile lands, and you will bless not only them but your country, and spread a good name for your people throughout other lands, for, all the world honors and protects the bread-producer and is eager to welcome him. Begin with the young, and the old will follow."

Thus spoke Tolstoi. When parting from him he placed his hands upon my shoulders, and looking with his deep penetrating eyes into mine, he pledged me to do the work in my country which he did in his. The pledge he asked I gave, and gave it with all my heart.

That was in the summer of 1894. Shortly after my return, I entered upon founding the Farm School. I approached a number of wealthy people on the subject, from whom I obtained no money, no encouragement, but plenty of advice to keep my hands off so foolish an undertaking. I appealed to the public at large, for a modest starting fund, with yet more discouragement, and yet more advice as a result. I learned then what I have learned many times since, that when money is needed for a good cause, nothing is generally given as liberally as advice.

Hoping that, where the written or printed appeal failed, the spoken word might succeed, I journeyed from city to city, as far

\$30,000 Raised for Its Establishment in Tour of Country. as the Pacific Coast, and succeeded in raising the sum of \$6,500. To this I added the little Saving Fund of my own, \$3,500. With the \$10,000 thus obtained, I purchased our First Farm of 125 acres. The first step toward a

Farm School having been taken, recognizing the need of a building for the housing of students, and for the instruction of them, I started on a second pilgrimage in the interest of the Farm School, traversed other sections of our land, and returned with a second \$10,000, which was immediately spent on the erection of the first of our buildings, Pioneer Hall. Possessing farm and building, there was need of money for equipment of them as well as of money for the maintenance of a faculty, for the keep of the students, it having been resolved that these, irrespective of creed, were to receive not only their education, but also board, lodging, clothing, etc., free of all cost to them. And so, forth I went for the third time, and after a journey of many thousand more miles brought back enough money to equip the farm, furnish the building, engage an instructor, install the household, and enough annual membership-promises to render safe the opening of the School. That assurance was somewhat strengthened by the resolve that to it would be devoted thereafter fees received by me for lectures, marriages, funerals, and the like.

In the meantime, more and more believers in the cause began rallying around us, and on June 20, 1897, less than three years after I had given my pledge to Count Tolstoi, school June the School was opened with eight students, a small equipment of implements and stock, and a faculty of one instructor and a helper, myself volunteering my service as instructor in non-agricultural subjects.

It was difficult running at first, yet we ran. Wherever we turned, we felt the lack of funds. We would not borrow, that was one of the first resolutions made, and from which we have not deviated to this day. We were often obliged to put our hands into our pockets to meet current bills. Men who could have helped looked on, some with pity at our folly, others with glee because we had not heeded their advice.

These as well as the others began measuring it for funeral shrouds. Weak as it was in material wealth, it was spunky in spirit. It refused to die. With every year it School Prosgained new strength, new appreciation, new pered and Expanded Notwithfriends. It lived because it recognized that it standing Detractors. had a pressingly needed mission to perform. And when the graduates began to go forth, and to spread far and wide over the land as tillers of the soil, producers of bread, more and more of them, year by year, till they numbered by the hundreds, friends and supporters grew in leaps and bounds, and the voice of its detractors grew fainter and fainter till, today, it is scarcely audible.

The one farm has grown into four.

The faculty of one has grown to eight, supplemented by one assistant and two foremen assistants. Four members of the faculty are graduates of the Farm School.

The student-body of 8 has grown to 130.

The original 125 acres have grown to 475.

The original three farm buildings have grown to almost two score.

The one cow has grown into a herd of 83 milking cows, 2 bulls, 53 head of young stock—138 head of cattle in all.

The 2 horses have grown to 27.

The few chickens then have grown to 1,980 laying hens.

The plant, which on the day of the opening of the School was valued at about \$25,000, is today, conservatively estimated, worth \$500,000, without a cent of indebtedness upon it.

Probably the strongest evidence of the public's change of sentiment toward us was given last June not only by the large

Evidences of School's Nation-wide Popularity. turnout of people from far and near, representatives of different creeds and classes and stations, assembled in honor of the Twenty-fifth Anniversary of the Founding of the School, but more

especially by the Jubilee Fund that was started on that day, under the leadership of Mr. Harry B. Hirsh, vice-president of the School, with a subscription by the Board of Trustees of the School of some \$50,000. This princely subscription they supplemented with a pledge that they would increase that amount to \$200,000 by soliciting subscriptions from other Philadelphians. They resolved, moreover, that, with the beginning of fall, they would enter upon a nation-wide campaign for \$800,000, making the Silver Jubilee Fund \$1,000,000, one-half of which sum to be expended on greatly enlarging and improving the plant, so as to enable it to teach and house and care for a student-body many times the number hitherto enrolled annually, and the other half to be placed in the Endowment Fund, the interest of which is to lessen for the Founder the necessity of scampering about for

money to keep the Farm School going, as he has been obliged to do during the past twenty-five years.

As fervently as the Founder of the Farm School believed, twenty-five years ago, in the people's ultimate recognition and

Success for Its \$1,000,000 Silver Jubilee Fund Predicated on People's Faith in It. support of it, so firmly does he believe today that before another year shall have sped, every dollar of the \$1,000,000, which the Jubilee Campaign Committee has taken upon itself to raise, will have been subscribed. He bases his belief on what seems to him unerring signs and

tokens. When more than \$30,000 was subscribed for the Farm School when it was still but an ideal, when it owned not as much as a foot of ground, when not a single student had yet enrolled, shall it not succeed in raising \$800,000, in addition to the nearly \$200,000 which Philadelphians have already subscribed, after twenty-five years of honorable and useful existence, after it has proved that it can do, and do well, what it has undertaken to do, after it has won for itself heartiest endorsement of many of the foremost expert agriculturists and educators, and other men and women of light and leading in all walks of life, after it has turned hundreds of its students into practical and scientific farmers, dairyists, horticulturists, florists, truckists, orchardists, after it has opened the way of many others of its students to becoming instructors and specialists in agriculture, among them such men as Dr. Bernhard Ostrolenk, a student at our School from 1902 to 1906; later Director of the Agricultural High School at Canby, Minn., and for the past five years the remarkably able Director of this School, his Alma Mater?

Shall we doubt that the Jubilee Campaign Committee will meet with success when The National Farm School counts among its many graduates one as distinguished as Prof. Jacob Taubenhaus, Chief of the Division of Plant Pathology and Physiology at the Texas Agricultural Experiment Station, author of numerous text-books on agricultural subjects in use in many of the agricultural schools in the land, author of scores of articles in scientific magazines, discoverer of a scientific process that bids fair to save the cotton crop of Texas some \$25,000,000 annually?

Shall we doubt that the Jubilee Campaign Committee will meet with success when the School is in frequent receipt of let-

On the Satisfaction of Their Employers. ters from employers of Farm School graduates, such as the one which, a short time ago, it received from Senator Carter Glass, of Virginia, formerly Secretary of the Treasury in President Wilson's Cabinet, reading as follows:

"Morris Daniels, a graduate of The National Farm School, who has been employed as second herdsman at my Montview Farms in Virginia, resigned his position with me on yesterday in order to take service nearer his home, which is at Newark, N. J. It may interest you to know that Daniels did his work at Montview Farms in a most satisfactory way. His habits were exemplary; his interest in the herd was always keen; he was straightforward, truthful and industrious. We all regret that Daniels should feel obliged to leave Montview Farms notwithstanding my offer to increase his wages in order to retain him."

Shall we doubt that the Jubilee Campaign Committee will meet with success when the Farm School receives letters from its graduates such as it received the other day from I. Braunstein, of the Class of 1920, employed on a Poultry Farm in Stoughton, Mass., reading as follows:

"I am getting a salary of \$160 a month and board. I am certainly glad I am in farming. My intention is to stay here till I shall have saved enough to go on a farm of my own."

Or a letter such as that received from Leo Buskin:

"My work with Haines & Wilcox, Florists and Nurserymen at Bedford Hills, N. Y., is most gratifying. I am getting \$24 weekly, work 8 hours daily, have a day off, and go home week ends. I am deeply grateful for all that I was taught at the Farm School."

Or a letter such as that received from Abraham Krotoshinsky, one of the real heroes of the late war, the saviour of Col. Whittlesey's "Lost Battalion," who, upon the conclusion of the war, entered the Farm School as a student, from which he graduated with honors, and after graduation, aided by Mr. Nathan Straus of New York, went to Palestine, where he has had a small colony assigned to his care by the Jewish Colonization Association, and where he is doing splendid work with the men under his charge.

Or a letter such as that received from Lewis I. Fox, telling of his employer's great satisfaction with his work, on a Duck Ranch in Long Island, of the splendid wages he receives, of having established so good a name for Farm School graduates that he was able to find good positions for a number of fellow-graduates, and of the good work they are doing, and the good wages they are earning.

Or letters such as those received from Samuel Robbins, of Warrington, Pa.; Jack Goldfield, Norma, N. J., and Charles Abrams, Centerville, Md., who during the past year, entered upon their own farms, are working them hard, and are looking forward to genuine success.

Shall we doubt that the Jubilee Campaign Committee will meet with success when we consider the handsome gift to the School, four years ago, in the form of our spacious and stately Domestic Hall, costing some \$100,000, donated by the Lasker Family, in memory of their husband and father, Morris Lasker, of Galveston, Texas, presentation of which to the School was made by the Hon. Mr. Albert Lasker, Chairman of the Shipping Board?

And if yet more proof were needed for the reasonableness of our belief that the Committee will succeed in raising the Sil-

Hon. Isador Sobel, Director of the Silver Jubilee Campaign Fund. ver Jubilee Fund of \$1,000,000, we would but need to cite that it has succeeded in securing for its Campaign Director, the Hon. Mr. Isador Sobel, former Congressman of our State, former Postmaster of his city, the city of Erie, a leader in its

civic and communal activities, a noted attorney, member of the Executive Board of the American Jewish Committee. Notwithstanding his busy life at home, notwithstanding the many exactions made on his time and labor, his love of the Farm School, his firm belief in its usefulness and its ability for yet greater usefulness if in command of greater resources, he has resolved to set aside all other duties and obligations, and devote himself for the next six months exclusively to completing the \$1,000,000 Silver Jubilee Fund.

For several other reasons we believe that every cent of the proposed \$1,000,000 Farm School Silver Jubilee Fund will be raised. One of them is the need, increasingly and pressingly realized in every large city of our Mere Palliative Charity. land, that something must be done, and speedily, to lessen the constantly growing need of charity. Never in the history of man have such enormous sums been expended, and such hosts of people been employed for the alleviation of the sad lot of the poor, as at the present time. Millions are added upon millions, buildings upon buildings have been erected, organizations upon organizations founded for the care and cure of society's diseased and dependent. For the poor we sew and dance and play, for them we write and speak and pray, for them we beg and scold and legislate-yet the poor continue poor, and grow in number. From every direction comes the cry for more money, for more workers, for more institutions.

It could not well have been otherwise. Our intentions were good; our execution was worse than bad. Instead of removing the

unfortunates from the Ghetto, where it was but Wisdom of too evident that they could remain only to their Preventive Philanthropy. undoing, we permitted them to remain, and to sink deeper and deeper into the quagmires of misery. We contented ourselves with nostrums when we should have applied radical measures. They needed a change of habitat, a change of air, of work, of diet, of environment, and we put charity plasters upon them, and are surprised that they did not get well. There was but one cure, the cure that would not have cost one-thousandth part which the other attempts and failures have cost, the cure that would have taken the poor out upon the broad fields where there is room and work and health and wealth for many thousand times the number of those who now congest the Ghettos and fall victims to the miseries of the slums.

That many hundreds of youths who came to the Farm School, weak in strength and hopeless in outlook, and later went forth from it vigorous in brain and brawn, and took their places upon the land, and saw the work of their hands prosper, have opened the eyes of the people, have made them to see that not in the increase of city charity but in helping young people to get an agricultural training in the country, and in aiding them to train agriculturally other denizens of the Ghettos, lies the nearest solution of the ever-vexing, ever-growing charity problem that has yet been suggested.

Yet another reason for believing that the Million Dollar Jubilee Fund will be raised we find in the fast-growing conviction that, unless something is speedily Million Dollar effectively done to stop city congestion Jubilee Fund Must Help farm desolation, the future of the United States Direct Tide will be in jeopardy. As late as 1880, only 15 per From City to Country. cent. of the population of the United States lived in cities; 85 per cent. dwelled healthily and happily on farms. Today, 52 per cent. of our population live crowded in the cities, where they engage in keen competition for the needed bite of bread, and for the necessary room to live, while in the country farm buildings are abandoned and rotting, and weeds cover the untilled fertile acres that surround them. The result is insufficiency of food for all the American people. The staples of life are constantly increasing in price. Some of them, such as meats, are with each year becoming more of luxuries. The price of fresh eggs has already passed beyond the reach of the average laboring man. A dozen or more years ago, when farm desertion was not as bad as it is now, the late Mr. J. J. Hill, of Minnesota, a man of remarkable constructive brain, and farseeing eye, declared that, unless we bring about a more rational distribution of our population than now obtains, unless we set ourselves earnestly to work to provide for an increased food-supply for the Nation through an increased farming population, there will not be food enough to satisfy the hunger of the American people fifty years hence, when the population of the United States is likely to be 200,000,000 souls.

Yet other reasons there are for believing that entire success will attend the nation-wide effort about to be made to raise for

With Larger Means It Will Effect Greater Good. the Farm School the One Million Dollar Jubilee Fund, toward which nearly \$200,000 has already been subscribed by Philadelphians, by the people who, throughout the twenty-five years of its ex-

istence, have stood nobly by it, have borne most of its expense. Relying upon the signal success it has hitherto attained, relying upon the larger and wider recognition of the needfulness of a larger farm population, we firmly believe that what has hitherto been achieved is but the prelude of the much greater things to be accomplished in the near future. Once in possession of the needed dormitories to enable us to accommodate many times the number of students we now can house, and of the money required for the care and keep of a greatly increased student body, once in possession of the necessary larger faculty, larger acreage, increased school rooms, light and heat power plant, once in possession of the urgently needed School Building, Chemical Laboratory, Modern Dairy and Barn, of the needed equipment for teaching the higher branches of scientific agriculture, once in possession of a fund needed to help our graduates to acquire and equip farms of their own, once in possession of these, all that has hitherto been achieved will be as nothing compared with the greater things that will be accomplished.

The war and the aftermath of the war have demanded unprecedented sums of money of us. We answered the call gen-

Generous Support Will Insure Brilliant Future. erously, often self-sacrificingly. We gave tens of millions of dollars. But, well spent as was the money we gave, there is nothing to show for it. A generous answer on the part of the Amer-

ican people to the comparatively small sum asked for by the Farm School will bring into existence a group of buildings to which, for generations to come, they will point with pride, to which they will send for education in the noblest of all callings

TWENTY-FIRST ANNUAL GRADUATION

February 22, 1922

The largest class in the history of The National Farm School was graduated on Washington's Birthday, February 22, 1922.

The exercises were held in Segal Hall, and were attended by a large gathering of friends of the School.

Dr. Krauskopf addressed the class. He urged them to follow the example set by Washington. He spoke of the sterling qualities of the Father of our Country, of his success as a farmer, as well as Commander-in-Chief of the army, and later as President of his country; the determination and persistence that made for his success in whatever role he played.

Other speakers were Dr. Edwin C. Broome, Superintendent of the Public Schools of Philadelphia; and Mr. Richard Spillane, editor of the "Public Ledger" Business Section. The latter contrasted former-day methods of farming with those of today; Dr. Broome pointed out the advantages enjoyed by the youth of this generation starting out in the world. He spoke most earnestly, and emphasized especially the value of working the brain to obtain results, in conjunction with the hand.

Thirty-four young men received diplomas, Dr. Krauskopf making the presentations. The names of the graduates, all of

whom completed the full three-year course in practical and scientific agriculture, are:

Post-graduate certificates were awarded to Harry Morris Corenzwit and Abraham Zinn, for having specialized in Farm Management on the School's experimental farms.

Dr. Bernhard Ostrolenk, Director of the School, announced the award of prizes. The Pennsylvania State Scholarship was won by Casper Blumer, or Philadelphia; free post-graduate courses at Farm School were awarded to Otto Wenger, of Philadelphia, and Simon L. Cohen, of Massachusetts. Simon L. Cohen won the Massinger Prize for excellency in the study of veterinary science.

SILVER JUBILEE AND TREE CONSECRATION EXERCISES June 4, 1922

A more glorious day than was provided for Sunday, June 4th, as a setting for the Silver Jubilee exercises of The National Farm School, could not have been desired. Taking advantage of the rare June day and lured additionally by an unusually attractive program, the largest and most representative assemblage in the history of the School gathered on its broad and beautiful acres, to attend the celebration of the rounding out of a quarter of a century of signal service in leading some of the surplus city

population back to the land. By special train and automobiles came the friends of the School, until they numbered several thousand.

The program was an all-day affair. The Rev. Dr. Henry Berkowitz, who had taken part in the opening exercises twenty-five years ago, offered the invocation. Dr. Joseph Krauskopf, Founder and President of the School, then introduced Judge Harman Yerkes, of Doylestown, another of the surviving few who had participated in the School's initial exercises, and had been the presiding officer at that occasion. Judge Yerkes spoke of the pleasure with which he had watched the School's progress from a modest beginning to its present splendid proportions. He then presented the Presiding Officer of the Jubilee Exercises, the Hon. Edwin S. Stuart, former Governor of Pennsylvania.

After a very graceful introductory address, in which he lauded the School as the lifework of Dr. Krauskopf, ex-Governor Stuart presented the speakers of the day, who were:

Julius Drachsler, Professor of Economy and Sociology, Smith College, Mass., and lately appointed instructor in these departments at the University of New York; Adolph S. Ochs, New York, publisher of "The New York Times"; Samuel M. Vauclain, Philadelphia, President, Baldwin Locomotive Works; Emile Berliner, Washington, D. C., inventor of the loose contact telephone transmitter, and of the first talking machine; John M. MacFarlane, Philadelphia, botanist, University of Pennsylvania; Hon. Roland S. Morris, Philadelphia, former Ambassador to Japan; Irvin S. Cobb, Ossining, N. Y., author and lecturer.

Prof. Drachsler spoke feelingly and at length concerning the merits of the School. He declared Dr. Krauskopf's service to the Nation was the heritage of practical education given the youth of the country through the Farm School.

He was followed by Mr. Vauclain. After asserting that no other avenue of endeavor offers more in return than agriculture, Mr. Vauclain declared that the present immigration laws prevented many persons from coming into this country who would, if permitted, turn hundreds of thousands of acres of idle land, which are now merely a liability, into real, productive assets.

Mr. Berliner had but the highest terms of praise for the work of the School and its founder.

Mr. Ochs spoke of the opportunities existing in this country for the farmer, with the automobile, telephone and radio, among other things, in making country life comfortable and enjoyable. Dr. MacFarlane delivered the Tree Consecration Address. He knew his subject, and told in language most beautiful and appealing of the loftiness and poetry, but more particularly of the practicability, of planting trees as memorials to the dead and in honor of the living. Mr. Morris paid a brief tribute to the late Prof. Morris Jastrow; Rabbi Solomon Foster, of Congregation B'nai Jeshurun, Newark, N. J., delivered a tribute to Dr. Gotthard Deutsch, distinguished Hebrew scholar and leader.

More than 300 Memorial and Festive Trees were consecrated. (The list of names is published in full on pages 22-25 of this book.)

Mr. Cobb paid his meed of praise to the School and to Dr. Krauskopf. His sparkling wit permeated all he said, and what he had to say was so genuine and warm that he won his audience to a man. It is not frequent that such real humor and at once such sincerity are combined. Mr. Cobb praised the School's work. He predicted for it an illustrious future. Having tried farming on his own account, he declared that he can appreciate more than many another a training such as the School gives.

Mr. Harry B. Hirsh, Vice-President of the School, read numerous letters and telegrams of congratulation from people from all parts of the country. He announced the inauguration of a Jubilee Fund, in honor of the 25th anniversary of the School's opening, \$51,000 of which had been subscribed by the Directors of the School alone. Before the meeting was over the subscriptions totalled \$166,000. The major portion of this was given by Philadelphians, and the gifts marked the beginning of a campaign to raise \$1,000,000 from cities throughout the country.

The afternoon program included an Agricultural Pageant, participated in by the students of the School, exhibiting livestock, implements and machinery used on the School's 475 acres, and in the raising of poultry and the production of dairy and market products.

Later, there was a charming open-air play, depicting the Biblical Story of Ruth. It was presented on the lawn in front of Segal Hall, by the pupils of the Religious School of Temple Keneseth Israel, Philadelphia.

TWENTY-FIFTH ANNUAL SUCCOTH HARVEST PILGRIMAGE, OCTOBER 15, 1922.

In keeping with the observance of its Jubilee Year, The National Farm School attached special importance to its Twenty-fifth Harvest Pilgrimage Exercises, held on Sunday, October 15, 1922, and continued its strain of rejoicing begun at its Exercises in June, when there was inaugurated a special Jubilee Fund, for the perpetuation of the School's work. Even though clouds threatened to lower, and make the day, as far as weather conditions were concerned, unpleasant, a gathering that counted many hundreds journeyed out by train and automobile from Philadelphia, New York, and other points nearby, and were rewarded by smiling skies upon their arrival at the School.

The morning Exercises were called to order in the Rebecca F. Louchheim Assembly Hall, a memorial gift on the part of the sons and daughter of Mrs. Louchheim, the dedication of which was part of the program. The comfort afforded the guests and the spaciousness of this building, justified Dr. Krauskopf's oftrepeated plea for a structure of this kind that could amply accommodate the School's visitors on its public occasions, and shelter them in the event of inclement weather.

Samuel Untermyer, Esq., of New York, occupied the position of presiding officer, and paid high tribute, in his opening remarks, to Dr. Krauskopf's gift of vision in founding the School. He declared his interest in the School to be especially keen because of his regarding it as an institution directly serving the Nation. He believed it to be the strongest argument against the charge that the Jew shirks his obligations as a contributor to the world's work.

Dr. Josiah H. Penniman, Provost of the University of Pennsylvania, brought greetings from that institution, and expressed his personal esteem of the Farm School's efforts in promoting a truly needed and heretofore greatly neglected phase of work, in instructing the youth in the art of agriculture.

Dr. Krauskopf then presented his Annual Message, recalling the days of the School's founding, the struggles endured against bitterest prejudice, the hardships encountered in securing funds for the project, and the ultimate winning of the people's confidence and affection. He drew a vivid word-picture, contrasting the early humble properties and proportions of the School, with its present splendid growth and future possibilities. (The Annual Message is printed in full on pages 5-17 of this book.)

The afternoon program opened with the dedication of a number of buildings donated to the School. Prof. Samuel Weiller Fernberger, nephew of Mrs. Rebecca F. Louchheim, presented the Auditorium to the School in the name of the Louchheim family.

Mr. Jos. H. Hagedorn dedicated the new Carnation House, the gift of Dr. and Mrs. Krauskopf, in honor of the joint occasion of the silver anniversary of their marriage and of the founding of the School. Mr. Hagedorn was equal to the occasion. He chose his words fittingly and beautifully. He complimented Dr. and Mrs. Krauskopf highly on their sentiment in erecting this Carnation House. He made a stirring appeal for the Million-Dollar Jubilee Fund. He held up the happy picture of the boy on the farm "with gratitude in his eye that men and women have at last determined to kill the slums, and all the evils and poverty they breed, through supporting a School like this."

To Mr. Hagedorn was also assigned the presentation, on behalf of Mr. Wm. Hyman, of Philadelphia, of three new laying houses in the Poultry Department.

Five-minute greetings were brought to the Exercises by representatives of the daily newspapers of Philadelphia, in the persons of the following:

At the close of the Exercises, an opportunity was afforded the visitors to inspect the 500 acres of the School's grounds, its greenhouses, barns, dairy, poultry plant and other outhouses.



REPORT OF THE DIRECTOR Bernhard Ostrolenk, Ph. D.

In giving an account of the responsibilities entrusted to the Director and Faculty by the Board and contributors to The National Farm School, it is not always easy to distinguish the progress and development of one year from those of the preceding years. The spirit, the work, and the development of our School, have been cumulative: much has been built on the years of past experience, much has developed spontaneously and some has been consciously introduced as innovations during the past few years.

The Development of the Teaching Staff

Of prime importance for the effective and efficient work of the School is an aggressive, permanent, scholarly, purposeful teaching force. It is to that end that a great deal of attention has been given by the Board and by the Director in recent years. The first step helpful in this direction was in the introduction of a definite salary schedule with definite increments of increases for various groups of teachers within the School. This in itself, it was hoped would have a reassuring and encouraging effect upon the teaching staff, as it would not only assure them permanent positions, but also definite increases of salary if their work proved satisfactory. The concomitant danger of having teachers settle down to a good job with reasonable assurance of increases of salaries without at the same time increasing their efficiency by constant renewal of, and additions to, their scholarship, was avoided by grouping the teachers after a certain period of years at the School in accordance with their efficiency as teachers. While it is by no means hoped that a teacher can be stimulated to his best work by promises of increases in salary only, his consecration to his high calling always being the prime stimulus, it was hoped, however, partially to reward the progressive and conscientious teachers in this way.

A second step in the development of our more permanent teaching force was taken when the Board made provisions in the way of refunds for certain faculty members who married and could not accommodate their families in the group of School buildings. This step was further augmented when faculty homes were provided as far as the facilities of the School permitted. In the past few years, the Farm House was equipped adequately for two families and the house on Schoenfeld Farm No. 1 was given

over to a faculty member. The erection of a Director's house is in line with this policy.

A third means of encouraging the teaching staff to widen their scholarship and increase their usefulness was taken when the Board provided means whereby our staff may visit, observe or take courses in other institutions, part of the expense being paid by The National Farm School. The Board increasingly looks to our teaching staff to be the guide and inspiration of the future development of the inner work of the School, and it is hoped that these few measures will at least in part encourage the development of a loyal and efficient corps of teachers at The National Farm School. It is, at this time, too early to say how far these provisions have been effective in the development of better teaching at the school.

Development of Student Body

It has been felt that the type of students who come to The National Farm School must be a superior type. Increasingly it has been noted that some failures of the School have been due to improper selection of students rather than improper methods at the School. As a result of continued observation along this line the requirements for entrance have been continually raised. The physical entrance examination of the candidates for admission has been supplemented by additional physical examinations under the very able supervision of Dr. Bernard Kohn. This additional examination has enabled us to detect several applicants who, physically under no circumstances, could have made good farmers. It is regrettable to state that apparently accredited physicians gave these students, under a misguided sense of kindness, perfect health certificates. The cost of keeping such students for any length of time and then discovering their inability to pursue farm work, was thus avoided. It was also found that the eighth grade certificates often presented by candidates for admission, did not completely tell the truth of an applicant's mental attainments. An additional test of the mentality of the applicant was, therefore, given during the past year. While it was fully appreciated that such a test is only a sample of the young men's minds and is in many respects wholly unsatisfactory for the purposes demanded at the school, it was, however, found that a considerable percentage of the applicants did not seem to have the capacity to partake of the intensive kind of training given here and we were, therefore, able to eliminate such of the applicants who appeared by these tests, unsuited to the School.

To maintain a high student morale, once the candidates are admitted, is naturally the problem of the internal organization of the School. Student government has had various trials and has been in some years successful and some years indifferent and in some years a failure. It is difficult to account for the enthusiasm that will some years pervade the student body to maintain a morale of a very high order and the apathy in the same direction in other years. Under all conditions, however, persistent pressure on the part of the faculty to maintain scholarship, discipline, enthusiasm and interest in the School is necessary with any kind of organization of the student body. Each succeeding year has seen definite progress in some of these lines. Insisting that every student perform a definite task every day, that every student recite in every class every day, that every student contribute to the work of the school every day has, in some sense, made much of the teaching work automatic. There is room, however, every day for the initiative and renewed enthusiasm of both faculty and students.

Development of School Equipment

A great teacher is a great teacher in any environment. Even Pestalozzi, however, had a very definite equipment and a very definite environment that were part of the educative process of his pupils. The National Farm School is fortunate in the wonderful agricultural environment in which it has placed its students. Not a day passes but that students walk through woods and fields and must observe the many changes that the fields undergo from day to day. The very plan of the School of having all the agricultural work done by students has created a most fortunate environment, especially since the students change frequently and regularly from department to department and under the stimulating direction of teachers are made conscious of the progress of the work. During the past year the agricultural equipment of the School has been augmented by the erection of three poultry houses given by Mr. Wm. Hyman, and a new greenhouse given by Dr. and Mrs. Joseph Krauskopf. Both of these are valuable additions. More equipment along these lines would be welcome. Particularly do we need more land and more of the modern machinery such as tractors, corn harvesters, tractor implements, additional grain and hay machinery, etc. Teaching as we do by doing, we find that the best method to be pursued is by giving each student as much opportunity as possible to perform the various farm operations, such as plowing, tilling and planting. With

a limited acreage such as we have, we find that many students do not get the opportunity to become fully proficient in these operations. All farm work is seasonal. Corn planting can not be started before May 10th, but must be completed by May 30th, allowing only 20 days, which must moreover be reduced by the intervening Sundays, Saturdays and rainy days to about 15 days. The School plants not over one hundred acres of corn. Assuming a third of our students to get annual instruction in corn planting, the limited opportunity given them can be appreciated. Under a most perfect organization the students could be given no more than two acres or a half day's work with the corn planter. At the rest of the planting he would have to be an onlooker. As a matter of fact, for proper teaching each student should be given at least two or three days' work on the corn planter to make him properly efficient with the adjustments, operation and exigencies that might arise with planting of a field. Similar arguments hold for other operations on the farm.

We feel ourselves severely handicapped in an important branch of agricultural education by the lack of a proper dairy barn. At the present time no facilities are provided in the school to teach a class stock judging, butter making, milk and cream testing, bottling, feeding cows for records, and handling milk in an economic and sanitary way. The present barn and dairy equipment of the School are both economically and educationally inadequate. One of the things we must look forward to is a new dairy barn better to round out our teaching.

Another phase of lack of equipment at the School seriously hampering the work of our teachers is the improper school-room facilities, and it is to be hoped that before another annual report is made by the Director, it will have become possible for the School to provide class rooms, giving adequate seating capacity to our students with proper lighting, heating and ventilating facilities. One would hesitate to make a guess how far the lack of proper class environment has detracted from the class etiquette of the school, and has injured its morale and its work.

Development of Work Among Alumni

Graduates of The National Farm School have in the past found only two types of opening. One was to enter college and fit themselves through that medium for agricultural leadership, and the second, to equip themselves as soon as possible to purchase their own farms. Graduates by and large have not stayed

in the field of agriculture for any length of time unless they followed one of these lines. In fact, no opening exists in the agricultural field for a permanent career either as manager or farm hand in agriculture unless a student aims for his own farm. The success of our graduates in the agricultural field and the preponderance of numbers that have adhered to it is no doubt one of the factors that have brought our School to the favorable attention of the public. In order to assist those students who have several years of apprenticeship on some other farms as dairyman, assistant or superintendent, and have improved their capacities and saved some funds of their own to purchase their own farms, the Board has set aside the Chas, C. Baker fund to be loaned to graduates. This is a step in the right direction. However, the fund should be increased and this line of work should be developed. In fact we have already so many graduates on farms that the employment of a traveling instructor for the present on part time at least, would not be out of order. This would also be valuable in assisting us to locate the proper kind of positions for our graduates, positions which are at present located by correspondence only and in many instances have proven disappointing and expensive experiences for the young men whom we have trained here at considerable expense and trouble

The National Farm School Silver Jubilee

With the completion of twenty-five years of work of The National Farm School, it is well to take a glimpse back as well as forward. Looking back it is felt that the general direction in which the work has been carried on at the School has been sound. No great change in the principle of educating city boys for farm life laid down twenty-five years ago has been made during that period. The work has been refined, we have kept abreast of modern developments, we have utilized the best teaching, but we have adhered to the general principle of placing students under conditions and environments of farm life and have them learn by self-teaching. The very inspiration of this work has originally come from Dr. Joseph Krauskopf and today continues to emanate from him. The effort of the Board of Directors in getting a larger portion of the public interested in the School by raising a million-dollar fund for the School. places additional, grave responsibilities upon teachers, students and alumni of the School. The contributing public looks to them

for continued development and for responsible leadership in directing city boys, especially Jewish boys, to farm life. This is the ideal of the founder of the School and has overwhelmingly become the mandate of those who have learned to value his wisdom and vision. Dr. Krauskopf's faith in the School and his unselfish services for the School have made those who are associated with him proud of The National Farm School, and humble in the responsibilties they carry. Faithfully to consecrate all elements of the School to his ideal is the inspiration to be drawn from the last twenty-five years of successful work of The National Farm School.

SILVER JUBILEE COMMITTEE REPORT

The twenty-fifth anniversary of the founding of The National Farm School, which is being observed this year, will be commemorated by the establishment of a One Million Dollar Five-Year Fund for the development and perpetuation of the institution. This Building and Endowment Fund will be raised by means of a nation-wide campaign, conducted by local committees in cities throughout the country, beginning February 28th and ending March 20th. Philadelphia has already oversubscribed her quota of \$250,000.

The Fund will be a testimonial to the work of Dr. Krauskopf, largely through whose efforts the School has progressed to be one of the leading institutions of its kind in the country. The campaign and the School have been heartily endorsed by President Warren G. Harding; Secretary of the Navy, Edwin Denby; Secretary of War, John W. Weeks; Secretary of Commerce, Herbert C. Hoover; Secretary of Agriculture, Henry C. Wallace: Postmaster General, Hubert Work; Assistant Secretary of the Navy, Theodore Roosevelt; Luther Burbank, one of America's foremost naturalists; Mortimer L. Schiff, son of the late Jacob H. Schiff: Samuel Gompers, President of the American Federation of Labor: Governor Alfred M. Smith of New York; Governor Silzer of New Jersey; Governor Gifford Pinchot of Pennsylvania, and numerous other prominent officials and personages.

Over two hundred and fifty cities throughout the land are organizing Silver Jubilee Committees and meetings. Men and women prominent in all walks of life are taking an active and enthusiastic interest in this Jubilee celebration.

At this writing the Jewish community of Philadelphia has given over \$200,000, and the non-Jews of the city \$60,000. Among the latter group the large contributors are: Samuel M.
