



Whereas Joseph Farmer of Sydney in the Colony of New South Wales and of Finchley New Road in the Parish of S^t John Hampstead in the County of Middlesex Gentleman hath represented unto the most noble Henry Charles Duke of Norfolk Earl Marshal and Hereditary Marshal of England Knight of the most noble Order of the Garter that it appears upon an examination of the Records of the College of Arms that Armorial Ensigns have not been duly recorded to his Family and being unwilling to use any without lawful authority He therefore




