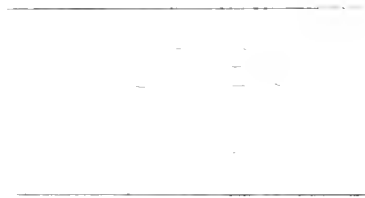

François Vaillant of St. Mary-le-Strand, London (formerly of Paris and Saumur, France); born in Paris; fled to England in 1685; received Letters of Denization 15 April 1687; died, aged 77, bur. at St. Mary-le-Strand, London, 20 February 1729. Will dated 19 September 1715, proved 25 March 1721 (P.C.C. 62 *Buckingham*).

Jacqueline, bur. at St. Mary-le-Strand, London, between 1713 and 1715.

Paul Vaillant of the Rue de Buci, St. Germain, Paris, and afterwards of St. Andrew's Street, Soho, London; born in Paris; fled to England in December 1681; received Letters of Denization 24 August 1684; died, aged 83, bur. at St. Anne's, Soho, 17 October 1722. Will dated 20 September 1709, proved 15 October 1722 (P.C.C. 204 *Marlboro'*).

Marie Madeleine Boursin, born in Paris; accompanied her husband to England in December 1681, and returning to Paris in June 1685 was imprisoned in the Bastille from 14 July to 21 December following, when she again fled to England; executrix to her husband 15 October 1722; died, aged 77, bur. at St. Anne's, Soho, 25 February 1729. Will dated 27 January 1725, proved 1 April 1729 (P.C.C. 120 *Abbott*).

Middlesex, 24 December 1759. M.I. Administration granted 8 January 1760 (P.C.C.) 2nd wife.

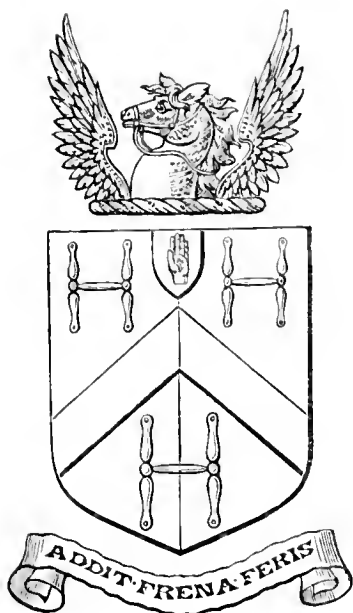

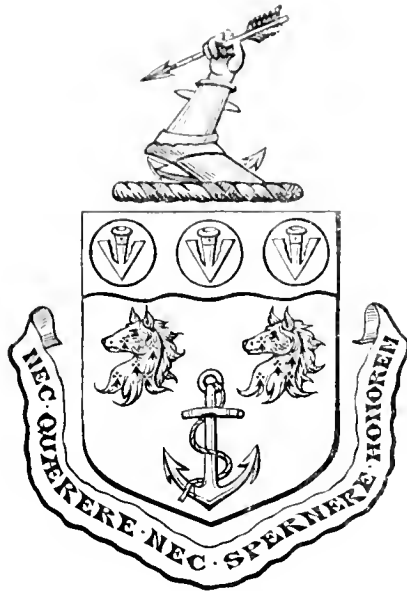

Whereas Caleb Fletcher of Liverpool in the county Palatine of Lancaster Merchant hath represented unto the Most Noble Charles Duke of Norfolk Earl Marshal and Hereditary Marshal of England, that his family was originally established at Broughton in the County of Cumberland but for many years past in the said County Palatine of Lancaster,

and being desirous of having Armorial Ensigns registered which may distinguish his said family from all others of the name He therefore requested his graces warrant to the Kings of Arms for their devising granting and exemplifying such arms as may be proper to be borne by him and his descendants, with due and proper differences according to the Laws of Arms: And forasmuch as the said Earl Marshal did by warrant under his hand and seal bearing date the first day of April instant authorize and direct Us to devise grant and exemplify such Armorial Ensigns accordingly. Know ye therefore that we the said GARTER and NORROY, in pursuance of the consent of the said Earl Marshal, and by virtue of the Letters Patent of our several offices, to each of Us respectively granted under the Great Seal of Great Britain, Have devised and Do by these Presents grant exemplify and confirm to the said Caleb Fletcher, the Arms following that is to say Azure in Chief two horses heads erased Ermine, in Base an Anchor erect with Cable gold, on a chief wavy or, three Hurts each charged with a Pheon, point downwards, Argent. And for the Crest, on a wreath of the colours a Dexter Arm embowed in Armour proper garnished or the hand grasping a dart barbed and flighted also proper, the arm surmounting an anchor as in the arms as the same are in the margin hereof more plainly depicted to be borne and used for ever hereafter by him the said Caleb Fletcher and his descendants, with due and proper differences according to the Laws of Arms. In witness whereof We the said Garter and Norroy Kings of Arms have to these Presents subscribed our Names and affixed the seals of our several offices, this third day of April in the Forty second year of the Reign of our Sovereign Lord GEORGE the third by the grace of GOD of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland King Defender of the Faith &c. and in the year of our LORD one thousand eight Hundred and two.

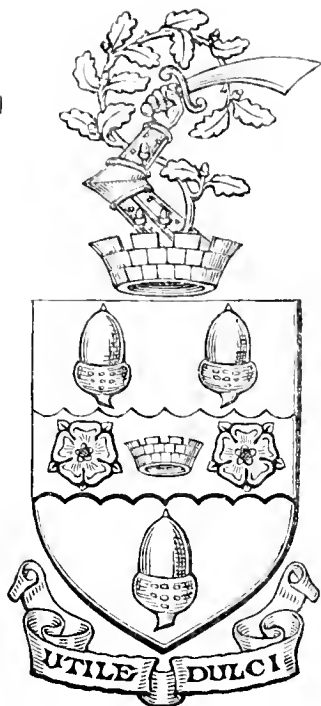

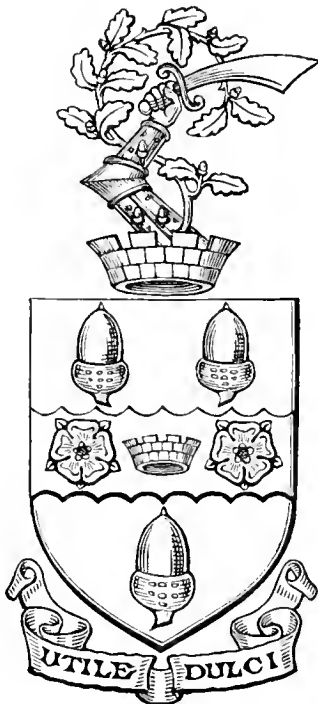

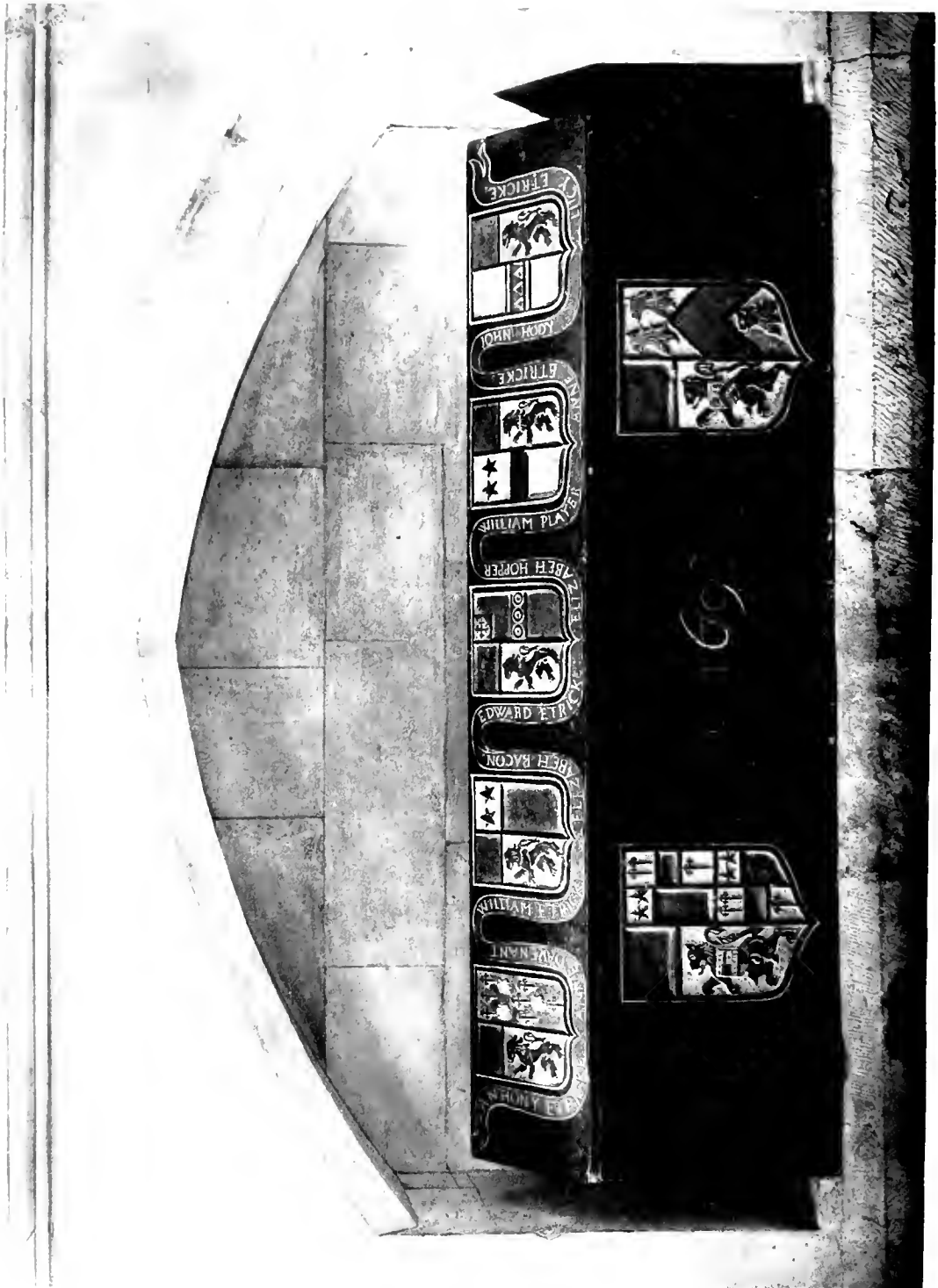

The Ettricke Coffin.

Coffin of thick slate, iron-clamped and painted, in the wall of the South Chancel-aisle of Wimborne Minster; its position is said to be due to the declaration of Anthony Ettricke, when offended with the inhabitants of Wimborne, that he never would be buried either in their church or churchyard; and persuaded that he would die in 1691, he caused that date to be cut, which was afterwards changed to 1703. The arms depicted are:

Argent a lion rampant and chief gules, ETTRICKE; impaling, Gules three escallops argent between seven crosses-crosslet, fitchec or, DAVENANT.

ETTRICKE impaling, Gules on a chief argent two mullets sable, BACON.

ETTRICKE impaling, Argent on a fesse gules three annulets or on a canton gules a cross-crosslet or, HOPPER.

Argent a fesse gules in chief two mullets sable, PLAYER; impaling ETTRICKE.

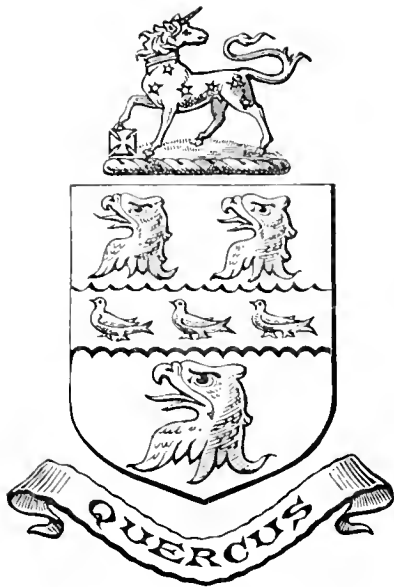

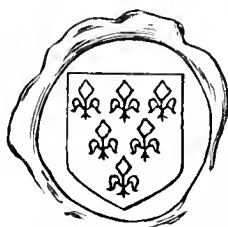
