* NOTE, that Sir Edward Powell, Kut. and Bart. late of Fulham, in the County of Middlesex, and of Pengethley, in the County of Gloucester, was the father of William Hinson his heir and executor, and did settle and bequeath his estate, in land and goods, upon him, on condition that he should enjoy the estate late of Sir Edward Powell, and was also since created Baronet by K. Charles II. anno 1661, by the name of Sir William Hinson, with a bordure Ermine, which bordure was granted to Thomas Hinson, father of the said Sir William, 1644, by Ulster, King of Arms, in Ireland and Ermine.
