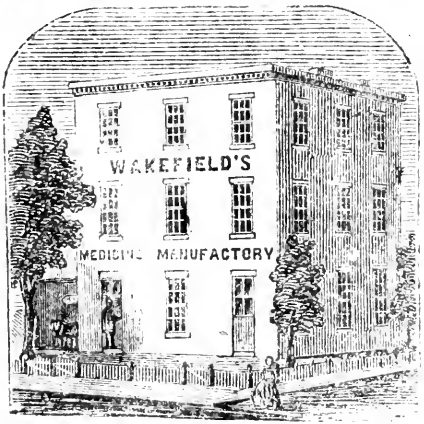





Dress warm, and take as much of the pure out door air as possible, and avoid, when you can, the dead air produced by air tight stoves; grates and open front stoves being more wholesome. Keep the shoulders back, to expand the breast, and give free action to the lungs.

I will give them in small doses and continue their use until they cleanse the system. Small doses seem to act as mildly and more thoroughly than an Alterative Syrup."
