History: The manuscripts belonging to the American Oriental Society (AOS) are housed in the Beinecke Library; the Hodgson collection (not yet transferred to Beinecke) is from the library of William Brown Hodgson, an early 19th century resident of Savannah, Georgia. It was donated to AOS in 1965 by the Telfair Academy of Arts and Sciences in Savannah.

The Salisbury Collection was presented to Yale in 1870 by Edward Elbridge Salisbury (1814-1901), professor of Arabic at Yale from 1841 to 1856. A number of these manuscripts were once in the collection of Antoine Isaac baron Silvestre de Sacy.

The Landberg Collection is one of several collections assembled by Carlo count Landberg (1848-1924) and presented to Yale in 1900 by Morris Ketchum Jessup.

The open Arabic collection is made up of manuscripts acquired by Yale by gift, purchase, or exchange from various sources. Notably, some 300 manuscripts formerly in the Wellcome Historical Medical Library, London, acquired by

Hans P. Kraus in New York were sold by him to the library in 1949.

The Rescher Collection was purchased from the library of Oskar Rescher (1883-1972) in 1970.

Catalogue: The holdings of AOS (excepting the Hodgson MSS) are briefly listed in the Catalogue of the Library of the American Oriental Society (see number 3 below); the Beinecke holdings are listed by Leon Nemoy (number 1 below), excepting additions after 1956 such as the Rescher MSS. This survey was sponsored by the American Council of Learned Societies and funded by the Council on Library Resources. It presents an account of the location and general contents of selected collections of Arabic, Persian, and Turkish manuscripts in North America.

Four earlier surveys have been made. The collections selected for inclusion are basically those listed in the most recent survey, augmented by those developed since its completion. For the earliest survey, the Library of Congress asked a large number of American libraries to report their holdings in 1942. The resulting information was deposited with the Orientalia Division of the Research Department of the Library of Congress.

In 1950 Mortimer Graves undertook for the American Council of Learned Societies a second survey. This effort produced a typed report (dated 15 August 1950) entitled, "Collections of Arabic manuscripts in the United States and Canada: a first report of a rough survey made in July 1950."

A third survey was carried out by Gurgis Awad, Director of the National Library of Iraq; the results were published in volume 7 (1951) of the journal Sumer. Awad based his findings on visits to several collections in the United States; occasional reference is made to the earlier report by Mortimer Graves. Published listings and catalogues are cited, along with the titles and authors of manuscripts of particular interest to Awad.

The fourth survey formed part of a broader approach taken by Professor James Douglas Pearson of the London University School of Oriental and African Studies.

Oriental Manuscripts in Europe and North America (Zug, Switzerland: Inter-Documentation, 1971) treats manuscript collections in all oriental languages on both continents. This work is primarily a listing of publications which cite or itemize collections. For Arabic, Persian, and Turkish manuscripts in North America, Pearson relied on the three previous surveys; he also added observations made during his visits to the United States and information acquired through correspondence.

Although the most recent, and the most complete of the four earlier surveys was published in 1971, much of the information Professor Pearson presented was gathered more than thirty years ago. Collections have changed hands, grown, diminished and even disappeared. versity of California, Los Angeles, for example, purchased in excess of seven thousand manuscripts during the 1960's. The University of Toronto, within the last five years, has acquired some twelve hundred. The Hodgson collection, formerly owned by a small private academy in Georgia, was given in 1965 to the American Oriental Society and is housed in Yale s Sterling Memorial Library; listed some years ago as containing one hundred thirty manuscripts, the collection now numbers twenty-five. Thus there can be no doubt about the present need for an up-to-date survey.

Of particular interest to Islamic scholars and palaeographers are the large-scale microfilming projects of

foreign holdings which have been undertaken by American institutions. Notre Dame University has completed the microfilming of the manuscript holdings of the Ambrosian Library in Milan. Microfilms of all the Islamic-Arabic manuscripts in the Vatican Library are housed at the State University of New York, Binghamton. St. John's University in Collegeville, Minnesota, has begun microfilming manuscripts in European libraries, especially monastic collections; work in Austria has been completed, and work is now in progress in Malta and Spain. Another project, microfilming the holdings of monastic libraries in Lebanon, has met with financial difficulty; but copies of the results are in the Library of the University of Utah.

For the present survey, letters were mailed to the one hundred fifteen libraries listed by Pearson as holding Arabic, Persian, and Turkish manuscripts. Librarians and curators were asked to verify and bring up to date the information which Pearson set forth. Institutions with relatively large collections, and those whose holdings have increased significantly in recent years, were then visited. Useful information was frequently acquired as a result of discussions with personnel closely identified with the various collections. Visits were made to Yale, Hartford Theological Seminary, Harvard, Boston Museum of Fine Arts, McGill, University of Toronto, University of Michigan, University of Chicago, University of Utah, UCLA, and to twelve libraries in the New York, Washington, and Philadelphia areas.

In the letters, respondents were invited to offer brief comments about the history of their collections, and those who replied did so. The larger collections of several universities and public libraries contain a preponderance of manuscripts of interest for their textual content or their palaeographic importance. On the other hand, art museums have collected miniatures, illuminations, or illustrative calligraphy, usually in separate leaves. Large-scale collecting now seems to have ceased in North America, if not throughout the world, because of

spiraling prices and diminishing supply. While some continued growth is likely in museum collections, manuscripts containing rare or significant literary texts are not likely to be offered for sale often.

Separate listings for each of the one hundred seven institutions included are arranged alphabetically, by state, in the pages which follow, with Canada entered last. A typical entry is provided with a distinctive number and offers, after the name and address of the institution, a count and a brief description of Arabic, Persian, and Turkish manuscript holdings, in that order. Brief comments on the history of the collection are included, if the curator provided them. Next comes an identification and a short description of the catalogue, if one exists. There follows, under "bibliography", a list of the publications which describe the contents of part or all of the collection. Some of these, it should be noted, are dealer or donor descriptions. should find particularly useful the identification of the contact for each institution from whom scholars can seek additional information concerning the institution's collection. Even though librarians and curators seem almost as mobile as academics generally, this information should be of assistance during the next few years. An index of titles, subjects and collections associated with an individual is appended.

The reported statistics and the information concerning subject matter, as well as some so-called catalogues, are not in all instances completely reliable. As noted above, identifications and attributions have been taken from the unverified notes of sellers and donors. Even within listings compiled by professionals at various institutions, a varying degree of accuracy is achieved.

Not included in this survey are the sometimes extensive bibliographic records maintained by many museums to indicate use of or citation of their manuscripts in published scholarship.

I would like to thank the Council on Library Resources and the American Council of Learned Societies for funding and for other assistance. I am also grateful to the Department of Near Eastern Languages and Literatures of New York University, which afforded me facilities as well as an appointment as Research Associate for the period of the project. Without the aid of these organizations this survey would not have been possible.
