


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PREFACE.

This, the fourth published volume of Watertown Records, comprises the only two volumes specially devoted to ecclesiastical affairs now extant. The records of congregational and precinct affairs are in the one book, entered the one at the beginning, the other at the end of the book which has been reversed. The pastors' records are those of a book kept by the Rev. John Bailey, Henry Gibbs, Seth Storer, Daniel Adams, Richard R. Elliot and Convers Francis. The many pages of the record devoted by Pastor Bailey to his pious meditations, ejaculations and hints upon Bible texts, the Committee has not deemed to be of sufficient present interest to be now reproduced. Of the many pages occupied with his remarks made at Communion services, only a few selected portions are given, to indicate their general character. As he intended them to serve only as private memoranda, he wrote them in a much abbreviated form, using the common abbreviation of "y" in place of "th" with most all words beginning with those two letters, using the Greek "X" i.e. "Ch" for Christ, "I. X." for Jesus Christ, and "H. G." for Holy Ghost, and others then readily understood by him at least.

East Precinct Congregational Affairs.]*

[2] AT a great and Gen¹¹ Court, or assembly for his majesties Province of Massachusets-Bay in New-England, began & heild at Boston upon Wednesday the 20th of May 1700-and Continued by feverall Prorogations untill Wednesday the 12th of February following, for accommodateing and Issuing the differences relating to the support of the ministrey in the middle and easterly parts of Watertown, Refolved and Ordered that there be a fubscription throwout the whole town of Watertown, The farmers excepted, In order to the support of the ministre in the old and new meeting-house, that there Persons & Estates who subscrib for support of the ministrey at the Old meeting-house be liable to be assessed thereto and no where elfe, and that there Persons and estates who fubscribe for support of the ministre to the middle-meeting-house be liable to be assessed thereto and no where elfe, that such who refuse to subscribe to the ministre at either meeting-house shall be liable to pay to the ministrey of the meeting-house standing within the bounds of the military Precinct where thay dwell, that each fociety be Impowred to Choose a certaine number of men to assess them, and those to be upon oath that the severall subscribers shall enter their names at or before the twentieth of may next before Sam¹¹ Hayman and Tho: Brown Esq¹⁵ two of his majesties Justices within the County. S¹ Justice Hayman to appoint the time and Place in fd: town to take the fubfcribtion of such the Inhabitants as shall be prevented of subfcribing at the time, or times fo to be appointed as aforesd by reason of their being then ought of town, or detained by fickness, shall have liberty to subscribe before the town Clarke at any time before the twentieth Day of August next coming, that this order Continue in force untill the end of feven years next, or untill the Inhabitance of both faid parts of the town shall mutually agree to support the ministre in any other manner, and that all actions suets & controversies Relating to the meeting-houses, or ministre in the said town of Watertown Doo cease untill the accomplishment of such subscribtions confented to.

The town being called together by order of the comitte aboves^d The town did then Declare by a vote, That, if a number of Perfons would build a convenient house to entertaine the minister in neer to this meetinghouse, that then the town will pay them that build it Rent for the s^d house, untill the town doe agree and have actually Removed this meetinghouse, or built another in the Room of this more convenient for the Inhabitants somewhere else where the town shall agree upon.

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At a Gen'll town meeting by adjornment the 14th of October, 1600: The town by there vote did manifest their earnest defire that Mr. Henry Gibbs might be treated with in order to his being a constant help to the town, not only for the Present, but for the futer also, so that thay might not be destitute of the word nor Ordinances of Christ if god shall pleas to Continue him amongst us.

Voted by the town that the Deacons together with Capt Sher-

man & Leut. Bond shall treat wth mr Henry Gibbs, and to Returne

his answer at the Gen¹¹ town meeting next ensuing.

At a Gen'l town meeting Novembr the 3d 1690: At this meeting Capt Sherman & Leiut Bond together with the Deacons being sent to treat with Mr Henry Gibbs about his being a help to the town in the worke of the ministrey and his answer is as followeth to wit. that he locketh upon it as a call from god, that hath Inclined the town to be fo unanimus in their calling of him, and therefore is willing to attend the fd. worke as god shall enable him, The town also accepts his answer herein, and did by a vote of the town declare that this Day his time began as unto his fallerry, as is above written.

At a Gen¹¹ town meeting by adjornment the 16th of Novembr 1691. Voted at this meeting that the town doe renew their call unto the Reverend M' Gibbs That he would Continue to carry on the worke of the ministrey amongst us, according unto there former Call, as appeares upon Record. The town by their vote, choose M^r William Bond, Cap^t Warren, Simon Stone, for to treat with the Revd Mr Henry Gibbs to come amongst us to carry on the ministrey.

Being fensible that there is great difsatisfaction in the town with Refference to the meeting wherein those votes wer passed, I feare it might prove uncomfortable should I accept my Compliance therewith and accordingly I am advised to decline the matter, till such time as caer be taken to remove the sid dissattisfaction, not doubting, but that this being effected which I earnestly pray that god would in his own time grant it would much conduce to the mutuall comforte and advantage. Jan^r 8th: 1696/7 The Brethren and Inhabitants of the east end of Watertown, being assembled did by Vote make Choice of Simon Stone to keep a Record of all votes that passed that Day, and so from time to time of what might be voted in after meetings by the above s^d Company.

Item. Voted at the same meeting that thay would still continue to maintaine the Revd Mr Henry Gibbs, as thay did for the last year, Provided he will continue with them in the worke of the Ministrey in order unto a settlement with them in the office of a Paftor (as foon as God in his Providence Shall make way for the

fame) in the old Meeting-house.

Item: It was Voted in order to the promoteing of a fettlement, that fome Persons be Chosen & Impowred to act for the sd Society in moveing to the Neighbour Churches for advice & affistance, and any fower of those Prsons to call a meeting when they shall fe occation, the Prfons fo chofen were, Capt Nathaniel Barsham, Lieut John Hammonde, Mr Richd Norcrofs, Dr Palsgr. Wellington, Joseph Sherman, Natll Bright, and Simon Stone.

Octobr 1697 At a meeting of the fubfcribers to the maintenance of Mr Henry Gibbs, Joseph Sherman, Natll Bright, and Sergt Thatcher wer Chosen to be affessors for Mr Gibb's salary, and also Robert Goddard was Chofen Commission to take their Invoice.

Item. It was voted at the fd Meeting that every Poll should be Rated at 121b. Cattle according to the Countrey Invoice, Plowing land and Mowing land at ten shillings pr acre, Housing ye highest not exceeding fower pounds, the lowest not less than ten shillings.

It was voted that 121b be allowed for wood for Mr Gibbs, Item. and that fuch as brought in wood should be allowed for walnut

eight shillings, and for oak feven shillings pr Cord.

Item. It was voted at sd Meeting that every one bring in his money by Contribution Paperd, and that all lose money should be Reconed for the use of the society when thay shall call for it.

Octor ye 5th 1698. At a meeting of the Inhabitants of the Easterly part of Watertown vizt Those who subscribed to the maintenance of the Ministrey there.

Simon Stone was Chofen moderator for fd Meeting.

Item. A fallary of fixty five pounds besides houseing & fireing was Granted to Mr Gibbs according to agreem for the Enfuing year.

Item. Mr Nathaniel Bright, Sergt Thatcher, and Corpl Sherman wer Chosen assessors, also Robert Goddard was Chosen to

take their Invoice.

Item. It was voted that the 65th aboves fhould be paid by Contribution and that every on should put in their money paper'd, and that what money came in Loofe or unpaper'd Should be to the use of the Society.

Item. Capt Barsham & Sergt Bond wer Chofen Collectors. Item. It was voted at sd Meeting that 1216 Should be added to the 6516 abovesd to Provide Mr Gibb's with wood and to be put in the rate therewithall.

Item. That the abovesd fumms should be proportioned ac-

cording to the Rules observed the last year.

Item. It was voted at the aboves meeting that one fixt part of sd fums be pd by ye middle of next November.

Feb: 4: 1700/1 Item: Then paid in to Mr Henry Gibbs in full of what was granted to him for the carriing on the work of the ministrey for the year begining October the fift 1698, being fixty five pound with housing & firewood according as is above granted.

Novemb^r the 7th 1698. At a meeting of the Subscribers aboves^d, Voted that Joseph Grant should mend the glass, and Joseph Child the Casements of the meeting house, and bring in their accounts at the next meeting and that the Society would se them paid for the same.

Item: At the s^d meeting there was granted to Serg^t Chadwick for looking after the Meeting-house for the year past and ensuing three pounds.

Novembr ye 16th 1698 At a Meeting of the Inhabitants of the east end of Watertown.

Voted, First that we will elect appoint and authorize, fome Prsons from among orfelves to transact fuch matters as relate to our further fettlem^t wth respect to maintaining of the publick worship at the old meetinghouse which Persons shall have power either to Petition on our behalfe, when & to whome they shall fe needfull, or to answer in or name to any such Petitions, or complaints which may be offered & exhibited to our disadvantage.

Item: We Elect, appoint & authorize for ye ends aboves Capt Barsham, Corp¹¹ Sherman, W^m Shattuck, D^r Wellington, Lieut

Bond and Nathan^{II} Bright.

Octobr yº 4th 1699 At a meeting of the Inhabitants of the east end of Watertown to agree upon the way of gathering Mr Gibb's maintenance there being granted to him as his fallary & for wood 77th There was then Chofen Simon Stone Moderator. Chofen to take an Invoice Nathan Fiske, Chofen afsefsors. Nathan Fiske, Sergt Beeres and Sargt Thatcher, chofen Collectors Deacon Barsham and Deacon Bond.

Item. Voted that the meeting be adjourned untill monday the 23^d Instant that care may be taken for the Pastors wood, and to agree how to raise the s^d Rate, and take account of the Collectors of the money p^d into the Pastor the year Past.

Novembr ye 27th 99 At a meeting of the Inhabitants of the east Congregation in Watertown for the raifing of the ministers

Sallary It was voted that every head should pay fix shillings.

Item: That the rate should be raifed as to Chattles & lands as it was the two former years.

April 19th 1700 Then p^d to the Revd. Mr Henry Gibbs: for his carriing on of the work of y^e ministrey as it was granted October the 4th 1699 the sum of fixty five pounds, with sufficient fire wood which was in sull according as it was granted.

Octobr 2d 1700 At a meeting of the Inhabitants of the east-end of Watertown to agree upon the way of gathering Mr Gibb's maintenance, Chosen moderator Simon Stone.

It^m: Voted that we do grant to the ministers maintenance this year enfueing the fum of 771b a fixt part being for wood at the same price as formerly.

Itm: That each head shall pay fix shillings and all other rateabl

estate according to the contrey Invoice.

Chosen to take the Invoice Sergt Coolidg.

Chofen afefsors, Sergt Beeres, Enfn Thatcher & Corpl Fiske. Chosen Collectors Deacon Barsham & Deacon Bond.

Novembr ve 27th 1700 At a meeting of the Inhabitants of the

east-end Precinct by adjournment.

Voted that we will meet at the house of Sergt Ric: Collidg on the 18th day of Decembr next ensuing for to have an account of the arrears of the ministers rate of the two last years, and to se what the Company will doe concerning the desposing of the lose money, and also to Chose a Clerke.

Decembr 18th 1700 At a meeting by adjournment Enfn Samll Thatcher was Chofen clerke, and the meeting adjournd untill

Jan: 14th 1700/1.

Jan: 14th 1700/1 By adjornt At a meeting of the Inhabitants at the east end of Watertown, It was voted by sd Society at the abovesd meeting that the loofe money according to our former votes to be disposed of by the Cociety and now in the hands of the Collectors be given to Mr Gibbs—except fo much of it as to Clear the Rates of those removed, which cannot be obtained, but are certainly lost and the rates of those who appear to be certainly

unable to pay the same.

Also Doct Palsgrave Wellington, Lt Jonas Bond and Corpli Nathan Fiske were Chofen & appointed to Joyn wth the Collectors to effect the difpofial of sd moneys according to the above written vote, and for further bifiness which may accur it was voted that the meeting be adjornd to be heild at at the house of Mr Nathaniel Bright on the fecond Monday in Febr 1700/1 at five of the Clock afternoon, and Capt Nathan Barsham was Moderator of the abovesd meeting.

Febr 10th 1700/1 Nathanll Bright was Chofen Modertr and the meeting adjorned untill Febr the 17th next at fix of the Clock afternoon at the house of Capt Barsham, to finish the abovesd

Perfuant to the abovesd vote Jan 14th 1700/1 Doct Palsgrave Wellington Lt Jonas Bond and Corpl Nathan Fiske wer Chofen & appointed to Joyne wth the Collectors to examin and effect the desposall of the loose money — there returne is as follows.

An account of the desposall of the money gathered for the maintenance of the ministre of the east end of sd town, both that which was loofe, and that which was papered, and that which was given in by rate, and that which was given in otherwife.

Febr ye 10th 1698/9 Then paid by the abovesd Collectors, and comitte by order of sd company out of the loofe money to Mr Henry Gibbs for the making up his fallary for the year past, two pounds thirteen shillings and fix pence, and of the rate money fixty two pounds fix shillings and fix pence, which maketh fixty five pounds, which is in full fattisfaction and wood to content for faid year, and there yet remaines ungathered for the use of sd companey, in arreres of sd year fix pounds, ten shillings and three pence.

For the rate made in the year 1698-9 for the maintenance of the ministry in the east end of Watertown, was made 77^{lb} 14^s-08^d and ought of the same rate was paid 60^{lb} 5^s 2^d and ought of the loofe money 04lb-14s-10d which maketh fixty five pounds in money and wood to full content, and there yet remaines in arrears ungathered for the use of said Companey, nine pounds thireteen

shillings & fower pence.

voted In exsplaination of the vote made Octobr the 2d 1700 that the rate to be made shall be raifed as followeth, that Poles shall be rated at fix shillings Pr head, horses at three pounds Pr head, oxen at three pounds Pr head, cowes at two pounds Pr head, swine and sheep at fower pounds Pr fcore. Improved land at ten shillings Pr acre and west land at five shillings Pr acre, and houfing at fower pounds the highest, and the lowest not under ten shillings, and the rate to be made for mending the meetinghouse glass, and the paying the fexton's fallary to be made by the assessors Chosen for the Present year.

Itm Voted, that when and fo often as there shall be occation for the Inhabitants of the east end Precinct of Watertown to be called together, it shall be in the power of Mr Simon Stone, and

Cap^t Nat^{ll} Barsham to call them together.

Feb. 17th 1706-7 Paid to the Reverend Mr: Henry Gibbs in part of what was granted to him for carrying on the work of the ministrey as it was granted Octobr the 2d 1700. the sum of sixty pounds, fixteen shillings and eight pence.

Octobr ye 1st 1701 At a meeting of the Inhabitants of the easterly Precinct of Watertown, being orderly to grant a fallary for the upholding of the ministre in sa Precinct, and for the Chosing of assessors, Collectors and other officers. Mr Simon Stone was Chofen Moderatr to cary on the worke of sd meeting.

Itm Voted that each head shall pay fix shillings.

Itm: Voted, that we do grant for the ministers maintenance for the year enfuing the fum of 77th a fixt part being for wood.

Itm. Voted, that the remainder that the heads do not amount to shall be raifed by the same rules the province tax is.

Itm: Chosen for assessors Nathan Fiske, Lt Jonas Bond, and Samll Livermore.

Voted, That Capt Natll Barsham & Deacon Wm Bond be colectors for the ministers rate.

It^m: Munings Sawin Chofen Clerk for s^d fociety, John Chadwick fn^r Chofen to looke after the meeting-house, and to be al-

lowed for it one pound and ten shillings.

Voted that all those that will cary in wood to Mr. Gibb's doe it by the first wednesday in Novembr and if that do not sufficiently bring in a supply, then the Deacons to take money out of the Salary granted and buy wood for his sesonable supply, unless Mr Gibbs will supply himselfe, and take the money as it comes in.

Octobr ye 20th 1701 Voted, that Capt Barsham carry the afsefsors before lawfull authority, to be fworn to the faithfull dif-

charge of their offices.

Itm: Voted, that the s^d Rate be p^d in as formerly, by a Conftant Contribution on every Sabbath day (only all p^rfons to come down to the table, to the box) and all money to be paper'd.

It^m: Voted, that Munings Sawin lay ought three shillings of the s^d focietie's money to purchase a booke to keep the s^d Societies Records, and to transcrib there former Records into s^d Booke.

It^m: Voted, that the s^d fociety take caer and order all there youth, that at the publique worship of God on the Sabbath Days, thay fit in the feats appointed for that end, so that they may be

under the inspection of the tything-men.

It World that this meeting he adjorned

It^m. Voted, that this meeting be adjorned to the first monday of Decemb^r next at fower of the clock in the afternoon, to be at the house of M^r Nathⁿ Bright, In order to heer the accompt of the Ministers Rate.

Decemb^r y^e 1st 1701. At a meeting at the house of M^r Nath¹ Bright, the account of what was unpaid in the ministers rate in

sd Precinct and there remained unpd. 1316.

Also the rate made for the year ensuing was then brought and Read to the cociety, which amounted to the sum of seventy sive pounds, and sive shillings, and it was comitted into the hands of the Collectors to gather, vizt Deacon Natll Barshan & Deacon Wm Bond, according to the vote at the meeting octobr the 1st 1701.

Feb. 17th 1706/7 Then Paid to the Rev^d M^r Henry Gibbs for his carying on of the worke of the ministrey amongst us in the year. octob^r the first 1701, as it was granted, paid in part of the sume of fifty nine pounds two shillings and three pence, and in fier wood according as it was granted.

Octobr ye 7th 1702 At a meeting of ye east-end society for the granting of the ministers sallery. Voted that we will give to the ministers maintenance 77th a fixt part for to provide wood.

It^m Voted, that the Rate to be raifed for s^d money shall be according to the rules the Prvince tax was ordered to be made by (excepting heads;) which are to be fet at fix shillings Pr head.

Lieut Jonas Bond, Saml Livermore, and Mr Natl Bright wer

Chosen assessors to make sd rate.

Deacon Natll Barsham & Deacon W^m Bond wer Chofen assessors to gather s^d Rate, and pay it in to the minister of s^d Society.

Munings Sawin Chofen Cler.

Serg^t Jn^o Chadwick Chofen to locke after the meeting-house, and the s^d fociety to allow him for his fervice one pound and ten shillings.

It^m: Voted, that the youth which attend y^e Publick worship of God on the Sabbath days ftill continue to fitt in the places

appointed for that end.

It^m: Voted that there shall be a rate forthwith made of fower pounds, three pound whereof to pay ferg^t Chadwick for locking after the meeting-house for the year past, and the year ensuing, and twenty shillings for the mending the meetinghouse glass this Prant year.

It^m. Voted, that the s^d assessors make s^d rate, and comitt it to Dan^{ll} Benjamen, who is chosen to gather it and pay it in for y^e

uses aforesd.

It^m. Voted, that Serg^t Jn^o Chadwick and Dan^{II} Benjamen take caer and get the meeting house glass mended and to be p^d ought of the rate made for mending the glass, voted, that y^e s^d rate be p^d according to the way stated the last year.

It^m Voted, that one fixt part of the rate granted for the ministrey be p^d in at or before the first monday of Decemb^r next for

to provide wood.







[October 6 1686]

I coming for N. England, after fome time, was fett apt for ye church of Watertown viz on Oct. 6. 86—wt out ye Imposition of hands, I preached, others prayed &c I Pmised to be of wt vse I could dureing my continuance amongst ym &c. ye particulars are

too long &c.

The first Sac^{mt} by me in W. was on ye 31 of Oct. 86. many yr &c. I preached on Cant. 8. 6, on ye first Doct &c. At ye begining I exhorted ym to ye right Sanctifying of ye name of gd in this Ord. wt was sd at it I have forgotten, esp because I purposed never more to putt down wt I sd, & wt I may do for ye suture shall be very short. After ward I exh ym to walk as ye redeemed of ye Ld, & as such as had renewed yr Cov & in particular these 3 things, viz yt yr wid lay in, for sufferings, & lay vp for death, & lay out for gd in ye places gd had sett ym & yn spake to ye Spectators (who were very many) as king ym some Questions, as whether yr had no need, no love, no feare, no shame yr Father ptaking in yt place, & yt ye place, linnen & cups shid rise vp in Judgmt agnst ym, it was blesed for much good &c we sung ye Song of ye Lamb.

The 9 Sacrm^t we had vpon ye 20th of November '87. ye weather proving better yn I thought for &c, very many yr, from Dedham, Wooborn, Baftable, Cambridge, old church in Bofton, & ye New church in Bofton, Cambridge Village, Concord, Dorchefter, Roxbury, Newbury, Charlstown, Waymouth, &c ye text was in Col. 3. 11. ye dayes being short I only fd before we begunn, yt our work was now to Remember X, & it ought to be 2 wayes, viz wth Joy, & wth Conformity &c Gal. 6. 24. After we had donn (for I passe by wt was dropped all a long over ye Elemts) I spoke both to Partakers & Spectators in one, viz This was Crying blood, as all blood is, & it cryes these 3 wayes, (1) It cryes after y, here I stood vp & spake to ye Spectators (weh were very many on every side) & held ye cup in my hand, & sd this blood cryed to ym, and yt for 3 things (which were pressed) viz yt ye wid Come to it, yt ye wid drink of it, yt ye wid wash in it, it cryes as in Pv. 9. 2 to 8 v. I sd, can y be saved wthout this blood? This bleeding X cryes come, drink, wash & be pardoned, sanctifyed & Saved for

ever. Its y^e blood of G^d y^t cryes after y all both on y^e right, & left hand & before me in both Galleryes, & will y, can y, dare y refuse this X, & his blood, y^t this bowll shall rife vp in judgm^t agnft y, & fo shall also this good company, and y^r poor Minister &c. Is y^r any vnbeleeving Thomas amongst Y, This Dear X saith, come & thrust in y hands vp to y^e Elbowes in my blood &c—come, oh come all Watertown to this blood, come tho y^e worst of sinners, y are Welcome—G^d, X, y^e H. G. Angells, Ministers, & all good xtians bid y welcome—And if y will not come, yⁿ y^e blood shall go for it—oh let all these seates, posts, & galleryes bear witnesse agnst y, & all y^e old Fathers of this ancient church take notice of this 20 of Nov. 87 y^t I thus invited y to X, nay let all y^e young solks y^t have been admitted of late bear witnesse y^t y will not come to y^e blood of X—I besech y, nay charg y by all y^e loves of X, y^e beautyes of X, & his bitter Agonyes y^t y come in to X.

(2) This blood cryes for y, now to ye doubting communicant, tho y fins speaks high, & sometimes y can say nothing for yfelf,

it cryes for 3 things, viz pardon, peace, & purging &c.

(3) This blood will cry agnft y, if fleighted or refused by y, it esp cryes agnft 3 things (yt were opened) viz Indifferency, Infidelity, & Enmity, oh saith X, yt are some here yt have slain me (i. e by yt rash & vnworthy ptaking) & others have sleighted me, as if I were not worth ye minding—& to all y yt sleigh his son, & ordinances, Gd saith or may say My curse be on yt, & my sons blood &c.

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oh faith all heaven, let y^m never profp in y^r bafkett nor ftore, in foull nor body, time nor eternity y^t despife such a matchles offer of love. Heaven, Earth, & Hell cryes out Anathema &c, let y^m be damned sayn & damned for ever y^t sleight such blood, y^e all pray as I may so say agnst y, y^e H. G. saith, L^d shall I never strive wth y^m more &c, y^e Angells saying, shall I go & take off y^r heads of these dead doggs, & Devills incarnatt &c—y^e very Seates & galleryes crying shall I let y^m fall & break y^r necks, & let y^m go quick into y^r pitt, &c y^e devills saying, let us have y^m, we never sinned agnst this blood thus, oh y^t I had good ground to Imagin, y^t y are all thinking to say, oh Dear Sir, y have sd enough, say no more of it, we will go home & close wth X & wash in his blood &c—yⁿ will I say no more. But I leave all this wth I. X. to take an Answer from y this night, whether y will receave or reject him &c.
