



REGULATIONS

Appointed by the Trustees of the River Cart, to be observed relative to the traffic on the said River, and the use of the harbours and quays of the same, and the navigable cut or canal at Inchinnan, 10th October, 1837.

1. On the arrival of any vessel in the harbour, the harbour-master shall immediately ascertain her name and tonnage, the kind and quan-

7

tity of goods on board, with the name of the owner, and enter these particulars in a book to be kept for the purpose; and he shall assign to each vessel such station or berth as he may think proper; but no vessel, except when loading or unloading, shall be allowed to retain an inside berth.

II. No ballast, sand, lime, or rubbish, shall be allowed to be put into or taken out of any vessel, except under the superintendence or orders of the harbour-master, who, if any such articles are to be laid upon the quay, shall give directions for the place of deposit, which shall be at the distance of three feet at least from the edge of the quay; and such articles shall be removed from the quay immediately after being laid down by the owners or others having charge of the same, or at their expense, by the harbour-master, in case of undue delay in the removal. Canvas shall be used to prevent any of the said articles from falling into the water.

III. All goods put on board, or taken from vessels at the quay, shall be laid at the distance of Ten feet from the edge of the quay, and shall be so laid as not to interfere with the loading or unloading of any other vessels. All goods to be removed from the quay within Fortyeight Hours after being deposited; and if not removed within this period the harbour-master shall cause the removal to be made at the expense of the owners.

IV. Vessels taking in or discharging coals shall use a rhone, or canvas, to prevent the coals from falling into the river.

V. Rafts of wood are not to exceed Thirty feet in breadth, and Three Tire of Logs in depth, and shall not be allowed to lie at the quay, or in the canal, or at any narrow part of the river, longer than Twenty-four hours.

VI. The practice of congregating at the harbour, and of throwing stones into the river, and otherwise interfering with and interrupting the harbour-master in the execution of his duty, having of late much prevailed, the harbour-master is instructed to enforce the payment of penalties exigible by the Act against offenders.

VII. All persons contravening these regulations, or interfering with the harbour-master in the discharge of his duty, shall be subject to the penalties provided by the Act, intitutled, "An Act to amend an Act for improving the Navigation of the River Cart, and for deepening and extending the Harbour of Paisley in the County of Renfrew."

VIII. The harbour-master is empowered to dispense with, or modify such of the foregoing regulations as the special circumstances of any case at the time may appear to him to warrant.

If the owners of goods or passage-boats, or their agent are not willing to pay the rates and duties contained in the above table, then it shall be competent for the collector to demand the maximum amount of the dues authorised to be levied by the Act of Parliament, passed 17th June, 1835, entituled, "An Act to amend an Act for improving the Navigation of the River Cart, and for deepening and extending the harbour of Paisley, in the County of Renfrew."

Re-directed Letters are liable to new rates of postage, but though the new postage should not be paid on the re-posting of the Letter, it will be charged only the prepaid rate on delivery.

NEWSPAPERS with Impressed Stamp sent by post must be made up in covers open at the ends, having the stamp visible. They may be transmitted and re-transmitted through the post within the United Kingdom free of postage for fifteen days from the date of publication.

Newspapers for Foreign parts and Colonies, if posted later than 15 days after publication, are charged Letter Postage.

BOOKS. &C.—Printed Books, Pamphlets, Magazines, Reviews, &c., whether British, Foreign, or Colonial, may be forwarded by post between places in the United Kingdom (made up in the same manner as Newspapers), if prepaid in stamps, at the following rates :—

Under 4 oz., 1d; under 8 oz., 2d; under 12 oz., 3d; under 16 oz., 4d. And 1d for every additional 4 oz.; no parcel to exceed 24 inches any way. but may contain any number of separate Books, Maps, or Prints, and any quantity of Paper, Vellum, or Parchment, and may be either printed, written, or plain.

Books, if prepaid in Stamps, are also forwarded by packet, if unwritten on inside or in the cover, at the rate of 3d under 4 oz. to British Colonies.

The British registration fee on every registered letter posted in the United Kingdom addressed to any British Colony or Foreign Country is now 4d.

The same reduction has taken place in the fee chargeable on any newspaper or book packet addressed to a British Colony or to the Kingdom of Italy, which the senders may desire to register.

Registered letters, however, addressed to France, or to any Foreign Country, the correspondence of which is sent in the French mail, will continue chargeable with a registration fee of the same amount as the postage to which they are liable.

Bye-Laws and Regulations for Hackney Carriages. No licence shall be granted, or afterwards renewed, unless the carriage, horse, and harness, shall have been examined by the superintendent of police, inspector of hackney carriages, or other person appointed by the magistrates, and reported in writing to the magistrates, to have all the requisites, and to be in a fit state to be licensed. No carriage will be licensed unless it be provided with lamps, and have roof, springs, wheels, cushions, lining, pannels, doors, and windows, clean, and in good repair, and the steps of entry safe and convenient. and the skin, rope, or coir mats, or other matting equally comfortable, are provided for passengers' feet.

The owner of each licensed carriage shall have the same ready to take a fare at the stands appropriated as public stands, from nine o'clock in the morning until ten o'clock at night, and, within their respective yards, coach-houses, or stables, after being called upon, between ten o'clock at night and nine o'clock in the morning of every lawful day.

Every driver shall deliver to the person hiring his carriage—if demanded—a ticket, having printed thereon the number of the carriage, the name of the proprietor, and the following words :—"Reference in case of incivility, loss, or overcharge,"

If any owner or driver shall refuse or delay to take a fare if not before engaged; or if any owner or driver, having agreed to take any fare, at any time, or from any place, shall delay, neglect, or refuse so to do, every person so offending, shall forfeit and pay for each such offence a sum not exceeding twenty shillings; and for every offence subsequent to a first offence, a sum not exceeding forty shillings.

No person shall be permitted to act as driver of any such carriage who is under seventeen years of age, or who is not known to the owner to be of good behaviour, and to have had experience in driving, and to be capable of such employment; and no person shall act as driver without the consent of the owner,

In every case of any property being inadvertently left in any carriage, by any person or persons who may have hired or used the same, such property shall be taken and delivered up to the person or persons who have left the same, or shall, within twelve hours, be taken in the state in which it was found to the police office, and there delivered to the chief officer on duty, with the name of the owner and driver, and number of the carriage.

No owner or driver shall canvass or importune for employment nor shall carriages be taken from their station in search of employment, but shall wait their chance in proper order.

No driver of any such carriage shall take any person to ride upon the box, or in or upon any part of such carriage, without the permission of the person or persons hiring the same, first obtained, under a penalty not exceeding twenty shillings.

Every driver shall keep his carriage lamps lighted while driving after sunset and before sunrise, during the months of October, November, December, January, and February, and ready to be lighted when on the stand during these months.

No owner or driver of a hackney carriage, used for conveying passengers, shall knowingly carry or convey therein any person affected with any infectious or contagious disease, or any dead body.

The following places are hereby appointed public stands, viz. :-

I. County Square.

II. Egress gates of Caledonian, Glasgow. and South-Western, Glasgow and Paisley, and Renfrew Railway Stations.

III. Smithhills opposite Abbey gate.

IV. East end of Gauze street.

V. West end of Wellmeadow.

The number of carriages at each of the stands, or division of stands, and the space to be occupied, shall be fixed from time to time, as may be found necessary. There shall always be a clear space, equal to the length of two carriages, left in front of the railway stations to take up and set down passengers.

All carriages shall take their stations on the stands in the order of their arrival, and at such distance from each other as that persons walking may conveniently pass between them. And when any carriage shall be called or driven off any stand, the carriage immediately behind shall draw up to the place vacated, and any other carriage behind in the like order.

All carriages ordered back for a party at any place, shall have the preference of drawing up near to the door or entrance of any such place in the order of arrival, but there shall be left opposite to the door or entrance a space sufficient to allow a carriage to drive up to take its fare.

All carriages let out on any station or place for hire shall be subject to the stand rules; as also carriages when met with, if not at the time actually engaged.

It shall be in the option of the hirer to engage any hackney carriage, either by time or distance, providing this be done at the time of hiring.

Whether the fares are by distance or by time, the hirer pays tolls.

For shopping, making calls and the like, when the driving is not continuous, the charge shall be one shilling for the first half hour, and sixpence for every additional quarter of an hour or part thereof.

The distance to which any hackney carriage may be driven, nnder these bye-laws, shall be five miles from the post office in Gilmour street.

The following rates or fares to be allowed for carriages conveying passengers by distance. The charge in the table shall include going from the nearest stance to the hirer's residence and waiting ten minutes. —Sixpence chargeable for every fifteen minutes detention thereafter :—

Half-fare returning—which the hirer shall have the option of doing. Where parties return, and the fare going is one shilling, the carriage shall wait ten minutes without any charge for waiting; when one shilling and sixpence, fifteen minutes; when two shillings and upwards, twenty minutes. If the carriage be detained longer, a charge shall be allowed for waiting at the rate of sixpence for every twenty minutes, or part thereof, commencing at the period when the free waiting. expires. When a carriage is called, but not used, a charge of sixpence shall be allowed, if the place to which it is called be under half a mile from the stance, and one shilling if beyond that. Waiting as in section' twenty-nine.

From eleven at night till two in the morning, fare-and-half shall be exigible; from two till five morning, double fare; and after five o'clock the ordinary fare.

No charge for driver.

SUNDAY FARES. - Within the Parliamentary Boundaries, double fare.

When a difference occurs between the driver and hirer, and the driver found correct, the hirer shall be bound to pay all expenses incurred in such disputes.

Owners or drivers may agree to drive at lower fares than those fixed. In that case, should they demand more than the fare agreed upon, they shall be liable as for an overcharge.

No charge for luggage unless it exceeds 100 lbs. weight, when not more than three persons are carried, or 75 lbs. when more than three, and in no case shall the charge exceed sixpence The driver to assist in loading and unloading in all cases when required, without any extra charge.

Every person who shall contravene, or fail to conform to and implement the foregoing bye-laws, or any of them where no specific penalty is hereby enacted, shall, for each such offence, forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding twenty shillings; for a second offence, a sum not exceeding forty shillings; for every offence subsequent to a second offence, a sum not exceeding sixty shillings; and in imposing any of these penalties the magistrate shall also have power to suspend or withdraw the license—and all penalties shall be levied in a summary manner, in terms of "The General Police and Improvement (Scotland) Act, 1862;" and parties offending and failing to make payment of the penalties and expenses thereby incurred, shall be subject to the terms of imprisonment provided by the said Act, for offences committed in contravention thereof.
