



Elombe Brath has been involved with the liberation struggle for African people for nearly forty years. The co-chair of the mammoth 1990 Harlem reception for Nelson and Winnie Mandela, Elombe also emceed the rally for Fidel Castro in October at Abyssinian Baptist Church (pictures and more details in next month's Folio.) He was a consultant on African Affairs for Gil Noble's Like It Is, WABC-TV's Black public affairs program. For many years, Elombe Brath has presented Afrikaleidoscope on WBAI, and in December he will be joined by Diabel Faye in a new, expanded timeslot. Elombe told Folio,

"With the additional time, we'll be able to reflect in depth the experience of the African people throughout the world. I am an African internationalist activist, and have fought for the rights of people of color since I was 12, in 1948. The show will relate to today, presenting the truthful experiences and daily lives both in Africa and in America. Music, including many live performers, will be an important part of the show. Music is more than a commercial product; it functions as ceremony and commemoration. We must maintain the culture in the Diaspora."

Diabel Faye added, "I learned to love the music while growing up in Africa, and have now spent ten years developing a relationship with African musicians in New York. I've worked with clubs, festivals, and record companies, keeping the bands together and promoting the music, and now I'm happy to bring authentic African music to WBAI's airwaves."

Diabel Faye on Music, History, and Family

Diabel Faye is joining Elombe Brath to produce the new Afrikaleidescope, 4 p.m. on Saturdays. He gave Folio these thoughts about the music.

In Africa, being a griot is your license to play music. Each non-griot family has their own griot. The griots of my forefathers stuck with my family for centuries, passing our stories and history from generation to generation. My parents knew that our society depended on the musicians. To some extent, the social trauma our countries are suffering is because we are overlooking the oral tradition that bound us together. The griots who had our history in their heads are no longer respected, and as they died, our family history fades out. Show me an African who cannot speak his mother tongue and I will show you an African who does not know about himself. Because his history is said through that language, a Ph.D. won't help. I advise you to go to your family griot and put him on tape because so much damage already has been done.

I am a "gueere", so according to tradition I am not allowed to play music, but the first time I went to a modern concert with a big stage, loud speakers, and electrical wires everywhere, I became fascinated. I would follow musicians from rehearsals to the smallest gigs, and listened to the radio shows from many countries. Musicians from different countries learned from each other (and successful Afro-Americans like James Brown), and so the music of the Fulani, Serere, Wolof and many others gave rise to Afrobeat. In Dakar, I made friends with many musicians who revolutionized the music.

In America, with few exceptions, African musicians must do odd jobs to survive, despite being part of a billion dollar industry. We are only on stage, while the managers, the record company staff, and most of the media are not African. I've been at after-concert parties where even the musicians who performed were pushed around by bouncers, not treated with the respect they deserved. I've done everything I could to support the musicians, from helping find gigs to lending my personal rent money to a band to pay for a rehearsal studio. I've organized regular jam sessions where musicians can play together, coordinated festivals around the country, worked with Island Records, and tried to master (and change) the complex financial relationships in the industry. We must fill in the gaps, and make musician's working conditions more acceptable.

programmer Lex Hixon to cancer. We hope his friends will contribute remembrances and pictures for the next issue of *Folio*, in which we plan a longer tribute. (Please contact Folio editor Dave Burstein at WBAI by the first week in December). Paul Gorman provided a few thoughts:

From 1971-1984, Lex Hixon produced *In the Spirit*, one of the most remarkable and certainly unique programs in WBAI's long history. Religious and spiritual life have never been Pacifica program staples. With *In the Spirit*, however, Lex brought to life most of the planet's great wisdom and faith traditions, presented with dignity and clarity, in conversation with teachers from all over the world. Lex himself was a "devotional religious scholar", intimately acquainted with world faith traditions as an author of seven books, a teacher, and a practitioner. He communicated from the "inside out" — inside his own studies and personal practice, inside the great texts, inside the authentic life of authentic spiritual communities. Many, many listeners testified, over these years, that Lex — and the station through him — had affirmed and nourished aspirations otherwise ignored or stereotyped by society. In tribute to his passing, Allen Ginsberg said. "From his years of broadcasting and authorship of volumes of mystic lore, Lex Hixon was a pioneer in the spiritual renaissance in America over the last four decades." He was a spiritual friend and teacher to tens of thousands ... cared deeply about WBAI and its listeners ... and offered many precious jewels in the station's stunningly diverse treasure box of rich gifts. *There will be a memorial in early December. Farewell, Abe & Debbie Weisburd

Abe Weisburd, lifelong radical and veteran journalist at WBAI and the *Guardian*, a great friend of WBAI, passed away August 2nd at age 88. With gusto, passion, and keen intelligence, Abe contributed his skills to movements for social change all of his life, as did his wife, Debbie, who passed away in 1994 at age 84. Abe and Debbie were deeply involved in solidarity work for Vietnam, Laos, Cambodia, and Cuba for over three decades. Abe introduced WBAI to Wilfred Burchett, the renowned Australian correspondent whose work did so much to spark the movement against U.S. intervention in Vietnam. The Weisburds were instrumental in raising the support that enabled Burchett to continue his seminal reporting. During the war, Abe co-founded Trade Unionists for Peace and Debbie represented Teachers for Peace in Vietnam. The Weisburds were strong supporters of the Native American movement, and engaged in education and outreach for Leonard Peltier and the American Indian Movement.

Abe's reporting was wide-ranging, covering prisons, Cuba, and struggles for justice by people of color. Abe worked with the Civil Rights Congress, and in the 1960s (at the suggestion of SNCC,) established White Americans to Support Black Liberation. Debbie, blacklisted from teaching for several years during the McCarthy era, went South and taught at a freedom school. Once members of the American Labor Party and the Communist Party, they both remained lifelong socialists. They were friends of WBAI and all who struggled for justice. CALLING THE SHOTS: How Washington Dominates Today's UN

The UN's 50th anniversary brought the world's attention to this often-ignored, often-disdained, often-condemned global organization. Since the Gulf war in 1991, the UN has most often been viewed as the scapegoat for local and regional conflicts and crises across the globe. Most of the time, it is "UN failures" that are condemned. What doesn't get talked about very much is the question of power at the UN— and the fact that since its founding in 1945 and until today, U.S. domination of the organization continues, and Washington continues to 'call the shots,' often setting the stage for what are then wrongly described as those "UN failures."

My new book, filled with behind-the-scenes anecdotes and the intrigues of UN politics and personalities, provides a thoroughly different approach. I look first at the UN's history, in which just-released classified documents reveal secret U.S. wiretapping of every delegation to the founding conference in San Francisco. Then I examined how Bush used the Gulf crisis to bring the UN to centerstage of U.S. foreign policy. Subsequent sections examine UN peacekeeping, including how it works, how the U.S. exerts preeminent control, and how the widely discussed major failures, in Somalia, Rwanda, Haiti and Bosnia, took shape. The book also analyzes how the UN's new emphasis on peacekeeping, especially its military aspects, strips much-needed funds from desperately under-funded, understaffed humanitarian, development, health, human rights, and other projects. Finally, Calling the Shots looks at the issues of UN reform and anticipates how a future UN might be shaped for its second hundred years.






