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PREFACE.



HE attempt has been made in the following pages to bring the genealogical record of the Whiting family of Dedham sufficiently near the present time to enable the descendants now living to connect their own

families with the immigrant ancestor. The "Register Plan" has been adopted, not only because in the compiler's opinion it is the best method of arrangement for publication, but on account of its more general use in the best work of the present time.

The information herein contained has been personally gleaned from the public records and the usual sources of genealogical information, with the idea of making an especial feature of the abstracts of wills, deeds, etc. Reference by volume and page to the records in the various county registries is given in each case, as well as frequent cross references to published genealogies of allied families.

The matter of English ancestry has not been considered in the present volume, for the all-sufficient reason that nothing has been definitely proved.

The compiler heartily expresses his thanks to all who have aided and encouraged him in the work.

NATHANIEL WHITING.



UR ancestor is first mentioned in this country in the Salem Quarterly Court files, in the return made by the Proprietors' Clerk of the number of acres belonging to each of the landholders at Lynn in 1638; "Nathaniell Whiteinge 10." In

Lewis' History of Lynn the name appears as "Whiteridge," but the correct spelling has been given by later writers.

He is next mentioned on the records of the First Church at Dedham:—"Nathaniell Whiting was admitted into yo Church 30th 5mo 1641." He was granted the privileges of a freeman May 18, 1642.

He was by occupation a miller, and the first to operate a corn mill in Dedham.

One of the most important duties of the early colonists was to secure facilities for grinding their corn. Thus, in Dedham, on Feb. 21, 1736–7, at their eighth meeting, the townsmen voted to grant liberty to Abraham Shaw to erect a "Cornemill"; a month later a grant of sixty acres was made "to belong vnto ye sayd Mill soe erected provided allwayes yt the same be a Water Mill, els not." Shaw's death, late in 1638, delayed matters for a while. On March 25, 1639, it was

Ordered yt a Ditch shalbe made at a Comon Charge through purchased medowe unto ye East brooke, yt may both be a pticon

fence in y^e same: as also may serue for a Course vnto a water mill: y^f it shalbe found fitting to set a mill vpon y^e sayd brooke by y^e Judgem^t of a workeman for y^t purpose.

By this ingenious method a portion of the water of Charles river was diverted into Neponset river, and a sufficient supply and fall of water obtained. On the same day it was

Ordered y^t yf any man or men will vnd^ttake & erect a water Cornemill shall haue given unto him soe much grownd as was form^rly granted vnto Abraham Shawe for y^t same end & purpose wth such other benefitts and privelidges as he shold haue had in all Respects accordingly, provided y^t y^e sayd Mill doth grinde Corne before y^e First of y^e tenth month as it is Intended.

The records do not give us the date of completion of the dam and mill, but a committee was appointed on July 14, 1641, to lay out "a cartway to our watermill."

A grant of eight acres was made to John Elderkin and Nathaniel Whiting jointly on the south side of the millpond for a house lot. There is no date to this grant, but the next entries are:—

John Elderkin alienateth & Selleth to Nathaniell Whiteing & his assignes forever his part in the land granted for a house Lot to the mill with the house and buildings thereon & the part of the Damm & ditchings belonging to halfe the mill as appeares by a deed dated the 22 of the 9 month 1642.

John Elderkin alienateth and selleth to Mr. Jno. Allin pastor & Nathan Aldus and John Dwight and to their assignes for ever all his rights & interest in the Water Mill standing upon the East Brooke in Dedham wth the Mill house dams & works thereunto belonging viz: the one halfe of the sd premises and Twenty acres of upland yet to be layd out and Ten acres of Meadow not yet layd out all which sd premises are alienated as followeth: viz: the one halfe to Mr Jno Allin one fourth part to Nathan Aldus the other fourth part to John Dwight.

By the following deed, recorded in the Suffolk Co. Registry, iv: 285, Nathaniel Whiting completed his title to the mill:—

Bee it knowne to all men by these Presents that wheras wee John Alljn past Nathaniel aldus. John Dwite yeomen all of Ded-

ham were Joint. Purchasers of one halfe of the Water Mill in Dedham, wth appurtenances thereof, & also of ten, acres of meadow & twenty acres of vpland, some times belonging to John Elderkin as appeareth by the deede of the sajd John Elderkin made Vnto vs bearing date the 8 6m: 1642 Now wee the Sajd John Alljn. Nathan. Aldus & John Dwite for us & Euery of us our heires execcutors & administrators have vpon. Sundry good & Sufficient considerations. bargained & Sould Vnto. Nathaniel Whiting of Dedham aforesajd in the County of Suffolke in New England & to his heires foreuer all our right title & Interest in the Sajd watermill Standing vpon the East brooke in Dedham wth our rights & appurtenances Propprly belonging to the Sajd mill as also our right in three acres of vpland lying neere vnto the sajd mill reserving to ourselves & heires our Just rights: in tenn acres of meadow & seventeene acres of vpland wch was lajd out to vs by the Towne of Dedham as the rights & Priviledges. of, the said John Elde kin Which we Purchased of him In Wittnes, whereof wee the Partjes aforesajd haue set our hands & seales the. 29d of ye 7mo 1649

John Elderkin had also been a proprietor of Lynn in 1638, and had built the mill there. After leaving Dedham he built the mill in Reading, then removed to Providence, and in 1651, went to New Haven, where be built both the first church and mill. He finally, in 1664, settled in Norwich, Conn.

The mill privilege was retained in the hands of the Whiting Family until 1823, when the heirs of Hezekiah⁵ Whiting sold it to Jabez Chickering.

The printed records of the Town of Dedham contain many entries concerning Nathaniel Whiting, the mill, his tax-rates for town, county and school purposes, his grants of land and public services.

On Jan. 15, 1682-3, the very day of his death, the town empowered the selectmen to make the following agreement with Nathaniel Whiting and James Draper, Sen'r. (Printed Records of Dedham, v: 140.)

26—1—1683 Granted to Nathanell Whiting and to James Draper Sen⁷ and to their Heirs Liberty to Erect a fulling mill vpon the streem below the corn mills for the vse of this Town. Granted allso to the persons aforesaide so much Land adjoyning to the streem as thay shall have ocation to floud by their millpond and one rod broad from the Edge of the pond where the land will bear it and allso what timber they can finde vpon that land on the north side of the river that is sutabl and vsefull for their mill: and alls what wood, earth, and stones they shall have ocation to make vse of for the makeing and maintaining their damm from time to time

prouided the persons aboue saide have their fulling mill erected and at work by jun. 1.–1684 prouided allso that if the persons aforesaide or their successors doe not improue the vse of the saide streeme and land aboue granted for the benifit and to the satisfaction of the Town by a fulling mill or let their mill ly vnseruicable (except it be in case of som extreordnary prouidanc hindering its worke) for mor than six months together then the wholl hereby granted shall againe return to the town. prouided allso that if the town at any time se caves to set vp a corn mill vpon the place, they may so doe. vnles the persons aforsaid will doe. it at their own charge to the towns content. prouided allso that the right to the mill shall not be alionated to any person or persons not inhabiting in this Town without the Towns consent. To these propositions aboue writen the partyes aboue mentioned have set to their hands

He died at Dedham, 15: 11m°, 1682. His age is not given on the record, but he must have been at least sixty-two, as none were admitted freemen until twenty-one years of age. He was more likely of age in 1638, when he received the land grant at Lynn, and probably born about 1617, making him twenty-six when married and sixty-five or sixty-six at death.

The originals of his will and inventory are missing from the files, and the following copies are taken from Suffolk Probate Records, vi: 408, and ix: 117.

In the year of our Lord One thousand Six hundred and Seventy Seven the ffifteenth day of the third month, I Nathaniel Whiting of Dedham in the County of Suffolke in New England being aged and weake in body yet of ability in minde by the mercy of God, do make and ordein this my last will and Testament for the disposeing and Setling of yt Estate over which the Lord hath made me his Steward, wherein First I commit my Soule into the hand of my onely Saviour Jesus Christ and my body to the earth whence it was taken therein to bee interred after my decease in decent & Christian manner at the discretion of my Executrix, and in consideration of the largeness of my Family of Children and the various capasity they are in having bestowed Some of them in marriage already and others having attained to grown up yeares and part of them being yet in their tender yeares am not uncensible how hard and hazardous it wilbee for me to make a perticuler distribution of my Estate to the Satisfaction & content of all that are concerned and interest therein; and being also well perswaded of my wifes trustiness and fully assured that Shee will carefully and prudently endeavour the ordering and manageing of the affaires of my Estate and concern's of my ffamily as shall most conduce to the present and future comfort and benefit of her Selfe and Children, I do therefore proceed to make my will in manner and forme as followeth-Item: I do give and bequeath to Hannah my welbeloved wife my whole Estate and every particular part thereof whatsoever and do give her full power to order improve and dispose of the same from time to time and at all times to my Children as there shalbee occasion wth the advice and counsel of the Over Seers whose names are underwritten And I do appoint and ordein the aboves^d Hannah my wife to bee my sole Executrix for the due performance of this my last will in all Respects: Also I desire and Request my Respected Friends Brother Timothy Dwight and Thomas Metcalfe to bee Over Seers for the performance of my will in all respects

according to the true intent thereof. In Witness whereof. I the said Nathaniel Whiting have hereunto Set my hand and Seale ye. 15. of ye. 3. month One thousand 677.~

He married in Dedham, 4th 9m°, 1643, Hannah Dwight, daughter of John and Hannah Dwight of Dedham. She died in Dedham, Nov. 4, 1714, aged 89. She was therefore born about 1625, and about eight years younger than her husband. She survived him over thirty years, and appears to have managed his business interests and brought up their large family with rare discretion.

Her will, recorded in the Suffolk Registry of Probate, xviii: 396, follows:

In the year of Our Lord One thousand Seven hundred & Eleven the Eighth day of May I Hannah Whiting of Dedham in the County of Suffolk in her Majesty's province in New England, Widow, altho weak in Body, yet thro the Goodness of God, sound in my understanding, and of a Disposing mind of what God hath Entrusted me with of the things of this World And so first I do Commit my Soul into the hands of Jesus + my only Redeemer, and my Body to the Earth from whence it was taken to be buryed in Christian Buryal by the discretion of my Executors hereafter named - I do here repeal & make void all other & former Wills made by me or in my Name and Whereas by the Last Will and Testament of my late husband Nathaniel Whiting deceased, have given to me, and to my Dispose his Estate, with the Advice of the Overseers by him appointed in his said Will - Item I have by the advice of the aforesd Overseers already given into the hands & possession of each of my Children a Considerable part of my Estate Namely Samuel Whiting John Whiting Timothy Whiting Jonathan

Whiting Hannah Fairbank Sarah ffirington Abigail Draper Judah Lewis Ann Lewis, as may more fully appear in an Instrument Bearing date 25th September 1689 as it is there Apprized; and it is my Mind and Will that after just Debts and funeral charges be paid that then the remaining part of my Estate be equally Apprized, that so each of my Children may have an equal Share of my Estate, with what each of them have already received — Only for some reasons me moving thereunto I do Order and appoint my Executors to pay out of my Daughter Ann Lewis's share the sum of five pounds to John Eaton the Eldest Son of Ann Lewis, when she shall attain to the age of Twenty and One years. And I do order and appoint my son Samuel Whiting to have my Grist Mill with all the appurces and privilidges thereunto belonging And I do give and Allow three years day for such as may have to pay out to Equalize each or either of their shares I do Order and appoint my two sons Samuel Whiting and Timothy Whiting to be my Executors to this my Last Will and Testament Giving them full power as if my Self were present. ~ Sign

NATHANIEL² WHITING (Nathaniel¹) married, Dedham, Mch. 29, 1664, Joanna Gay, daughter of John and Joanna Gay. She was born, Dedham, 23 of the 1 mo., 1645, and died, Wrentham, Oct. 26, 1708, having married 2d, Dedham, 24: 1: 1678-9, John Ware. (See Ware Geneal., p. 26.) Administration on Nathaniel Whiting's estate was granted to widow Joanna, Oct. 31, 1676. (Suffolk Probate Records, xii: 113.) Their children, recorded in Medfield, were:

Samuel² Whiting (Nathaniel¹) died at Dedham, Dec. 4, 1727, aged 78 (gravestone in First Parish Cemetery). He married 1st, Dedham, 23d 9th, 1676, Sarah Metcalf, daughter of Thomas and Sarah (Paige) Metcalf. She was born, Dedham, Mch. 3, 1658, and died there June 11, 1701. He married 2d, Dedham, Apl. 29, 1702, Mary Fairbanks, daughter of Jonathan and Deborah (Shepard) Fairbanks. She was born, Dedham, July 24, 1667, and survived him. His will, dated

Dec. 28, 1724, probated Jan. 1, 1727–8, calls himself "miller" of Dedham, and names wife Mary, sons Jeremiah, Josiah, Zachariah and David Whiting, daughter Mary Whiting, brother Jonathan Whiting of Roxbury, and brother-in-law Jonathan Fairbanks of Dedham. TIMOTHY² WHITING (Nathaniel¹), died at Dedham, Dec. 26, 1728, in 75th year (gravestone in First Parish Cemetery). He married Sarah Bullard, daughter of Isaac and Ann (Burnap-Wight) Bullard. She was born, Dedham, 7: 11 mo., 1658, and died 1732. He received ten shillings from the constable of Dorchester in 1679 for killing a wolf. On May 13, 1700, the town of Dedham voted to assist him with the loan of the school money because his corn mill had burned down. (Dedham Hist. Register, ii: 51.) He was a selectman in 1707. His will, dated Dec. 18, 1728, probated Jan. 9, 1728-9, calls himself "fuller," and mentions his wife, sons Timothy, Nathaniel and Joseph, and daughters Sarah, Elizabeth and Mehitable. Her will, dated June 15, 1732, probated Sept. 1,

1732, names above six children and sons-in-law, John Baker, Ephraim Colburn and Joseph Colburn. (Suffolk Probate Records, xxvii: 17, and xxxi: 104.)

John² Whiting (*Nathaniel*¹), was a miller at Wrentham. He was married 1st, by Rev. Peter Thacher of Milton, Dec. 24, 1688, to Mary Billings of Dorchester. She died, Wrentham, Jan. 4, 1727–8. He had a second wife, Sarah ——. His will, dated May 29, 1729, probated Aug. 15, 1732, names wife Sarah, sons Nathaniel, John and Eliphalet, daughters Mary Mann, Jerusha Slack, Jemima Wight, Zabiah Ware, Hannah Fisher and Phebe Whiting, and grandson Lewis Sweeting. (Suffolk Probate Records, xxxi: 62.)

Jonathan² Whiting (*Nathaniel*¹), died at Roxbury, Sept. 4, 1728 (gravestone in First Parish Cemetery at Dedham). He married at Dedham, Dec. 3, 1689, Rachel Thorp, daughter of James and Hannah (Newcomb) Thorp. She was born, Dedham, "17th Agust, 1671," and died after 1728. POSTSCRIPT.

SINCE the preceding pages were printed, the discovery of the following Deposition requires a revision of the statements made on page 9 regarding our ancestor's age. It was found in the Middlesex County Court files for the year 1672, in the package marked "II" in pencil:

The Deposition of Nathaniell Whiteing aged about 63 and of John Bacon aged about 44 in refference to an account of what was founde about Zacharie Smyth after his death he being slayne by an Indian

we being prent at the Search and buriall of the Said Zachary did See found about him 20s or upwards in money and besides the Cloathes he was buried in ther was a short stuffe Coat, and Some other Smale things of his brought to Dedham all which wer delivered to a man who said he was brother to the said Zachary that was killed.

Taken upon oath 20: 7: 72.

Before me Elea: Lusher: Assist^t

Thus we learn from his own testimony that Nathaniel¹ Whiting was born about the year 1609, instead of 1617. He was therefore about twenty-nine years of age when he came to this country, thirty-four when married, sixty-three or sixty-four when his fourteenth and youngest child was born, seventy-three or seventy-four at death, and about sixteen years older than his wife.

It is hoped that this hitherto unpublished fact may assist in the search for proof of his English ancestry.
