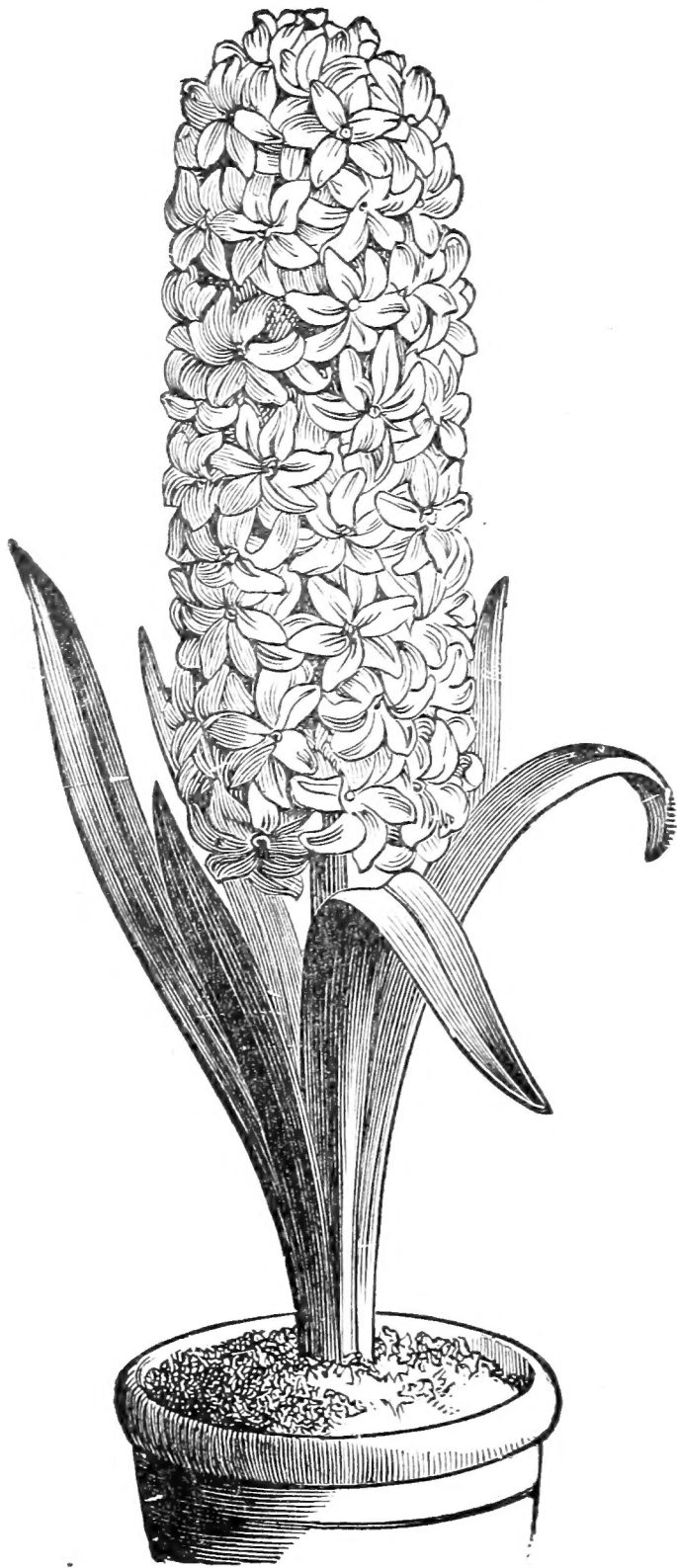

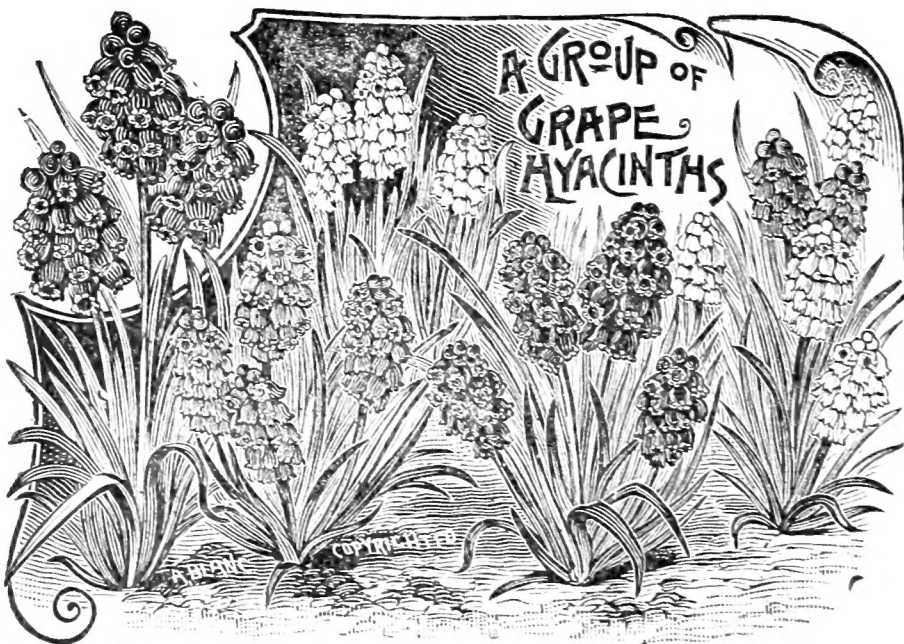
SCILLA SIBERICA.

LILIUM.

They should be planted from October to March, in good, rich, loamy soil, about four inches deep. After planting they require but little care, and should not be taken up for several years, as they bloom more freely than if taken up annually.

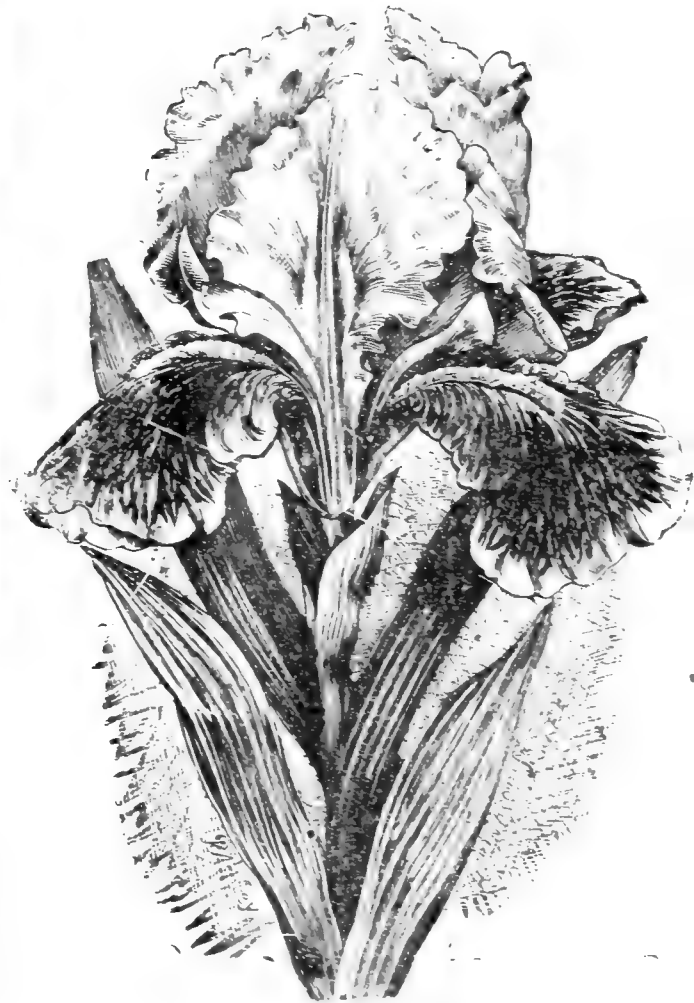
