

ALUMINUM SULPHATE Azaleas, Rhododendrons, Bluebernes, Cornus Florida, Heather, Kalmia and many other plants require an acid soil. Acid-forming organic mat-ler, such as well rotted oak leaves helps to in-crease acidity. Aluminum Sulphate is a good chemical for increasing soil acidity by using 1/4 to 1/2 pound per square yard.
