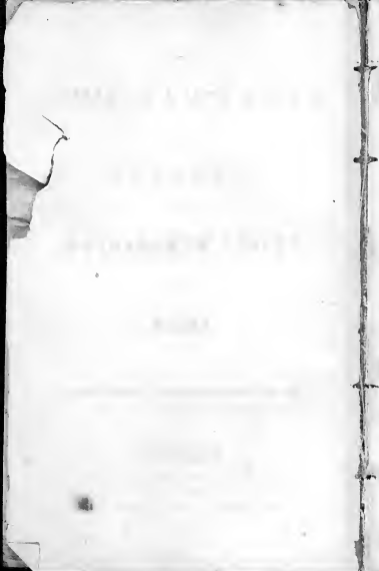

TO THE PUBLIC.

THERE are numerous difficulties always occurring with men of business, as also with the mechanic, wherever they trust apparently small and unimportant items to their memory alone, as they are often obliged to do, when transacting business at a distance, and when their regular accounts are not near at hand. Being aware of this, the Publishers were induced to present to the Public something that would serve to obviate the difficulties, and they trust that the following work will not be unacceptable to them in their business transactions.

The *Astronomical Calculations*, by J. L. DOWNES, are calculated for Boston and New York, will answer for any part of New England, and will be explained by referring to the top of each page.

On the last page will be found a *Table of Valuation of all those Coins which were made Legal Tender by Act of Congress of 1834*, both according to the New and the Old Standard. This Table will be of great service to persons in all kinds of business, and can be depended upon as being correct.

The letters M. m. denote Morning—A. a. a. Afternoon.

TIDE TABLE.

The time of high water of that tide which arrives when the moon is nearest to the meridian, is given for Boston; the time at either of the following places may thence be readily found by adding or subtracting as the case may be, the difference to or from the time at that city. The time of the tide which happens when the Moon is farthest from the meridian may also be easily ascertained by the addition of half the difference of the times of high water on the preceding and following days.

ECLIPSES IN 1836.

There will be four Eclipses the present year, two of the Sun, and two of the Moon.

May 1—*a* partial eclipse of the Moon, visible at Boston, beginning 2h. 20m. M.—and at New York, beginning 2h. 5m. M.

May 15—eclipse of the Sun, visible at Boston, beginning 7h. 25m. M.—and at New York, beginning 7h. 14m. M.

October 24—*a* partial eclipse of the Moon, in the morning, invisible throughout the United States.

November 8—*a* eclipse of the Sun, in the evening, invisible in the U. States.

VALUE OF COINS, — LEGAL TENDER,

AS ESTABLISHED BY ACT OF CONGRESS, JUNE, 1834.

By the new law passed by Congress, June, 1834, all the Gold Coins of England, France, Brazil, Colombia, Mexico, Portugal and Spain, are made legal tender, and no other, but all is raised 6 2-3 per cent in value. The United States' new coins will be readily distinguished by a head of Liberty disencumbered of a cap. On the reverse, the surplus motto, 'E Pluribus Unum,' which for many years has occupied a portion of the disk above the figure of the eagle, is now omitted; the Eagle and half Eagle of the new coinage, will be less in diameter than those of the former emissions, and that in greater proportion than the diminution of weight would indicate.
