JOHN MOTLEY MOREHEAD

Rather than attempt to list the numerous accomplishments and gifts of Mr. John Motley Morehead. I am going to try to tell something about the man as his adopted "nephews" saw him

The most striking quality of Mr. Morehead's was his ever abundant humor. When addressing the scholars every October, his stories and puns would bring resounding laughter which, if one thought about it long enough, could probably still be heard ringing from the marble columns and panelled walls of the beautiful Morehead Planetarium dining room. Also, if you thought long enough you might recall the joke he told about a physics professor when he was here. It seems that Mr. Morehead needed a certain grade and that that physics professor had a favorite dog, which mysteriously disappeared.

Mr. Morehead also wanted to know what he was paying for when he awarded the freshmen their scholarships and insisted on weighing them as a group and figuring the cost

per pound.

All in all, there was a certain magnetism in Mr. Morehead due. I imagine, to his humor and to a certain humility which drew one to him. There has never been another man like him. The world has lost a great man and the scholars a benevolent uncle, but he will never be forgotten.

He had that same humor and genial personality which seem inherent in the Morehead family, and the scholars flocked to him.



Chancellor of the University of North Carolina







He served in the United States Marine Corps and holds the rank of major in the reserve. A Tanner Award winner, he teaches courses in American history and Modern Civilization. Presently he is interested in the abolitionists as studies in psychology and history.

WELDON THORNTON, Ph.D., 1961 (University of Texas), is Assistant Professor of English. His main field of interest is modern British fiction, specializing in D. H. Lawrence and James Joyce. He also teaches a course on the literature of the South. Dr. Thornton has published several articles on James Joyce. His future plans include taking a leave of absence during the spring semester to work on a complete allusion list for James Joyce's *Ulysses*.



JOHN DOUGLAS EYRE, Ph.D., 1951 (University of Michigan). Chairman of the Department of Geography, takes an active interest in urban and economic geography of the Far East. This is evinced by his many research grants to study in such areas as Japan and Malaya, by his approximately fifteen professional articles in such journals as *Economic Geography* and *Geographical Review*, and by his popularity among students as foremost in the teaching of Regional Geography of Asia. Dr. Eyre is currently concerned with growth characteristics and patterns of Japanese cities. Balancing his Oriental slant is his preoccupation with a young family of three children.





JAMES DICKSON PHILLIPS, J.D., 1948 (University of North Carolina), was recently appointed Dean of the Law School, after serving as Professor of Law since 1960. He graduated Phi Beta Kappa from Davidson College, Dean Phillips' primary interest is in the field of teaching and he continues to instruct several courses in procedural law. Currently, he is a member of the North Carolina Courts Commission which is drafting legislation to implement the 1962 constitutional amendments for reconstructing the state court system. In his leisure hours, Dean Phillips enjoys fishing and hunting.







INTERFRATERNITY COUNCIL


The Interfraternity Council serves as the unifying and governing body for fraternities at Carolina. The Council is composed of the president and the elected representative from each of the twenty-three chapters on campus, and acts as the legislative branch. The L.F.C. Court, with the President and Vice-President sitting as ex-officio members, maintains a self-imposed discipline among fraternities. This body serves as the judicial branch. Under the leadership of the Executive Committee, made up of the major officers, the L.F.C. plans and coordinates all phases of fraternity life. The work of the L.F.C. is done through use of the Rush. Publicity, Greek Week, Scholarship, Rules, and Activities Committees. These groups strive to promote the lofty ideals of the entire fraternity system.

This year has been as full as any in the past. The overriding problem was deferred rush, attempted for the first time at Carolina. It was hoped that this new method of rush

would benefit the whole system. The Activities Committee, in addition to other projects, sponsored an I.F.C. Work Day on December 10, when fraternities joined in a cleanup of the entrances to Chapel Hill. The I.F.C. also helped to provide refreshments after the Christmas Carol Sing. And as it has since 1948, the Council awarded the Andrew Bershak Scholarship, worth \$2,400, to a deserving student.

To encourage competition among member fraternities, the I.F.C. awards several trophies each year. These include the R.B. Ilouse Trophy for the best fraternity, the Scholarship Trophy for most improved scholarship, and the Sturm Trophy for the year's best pledge class. The competition for these awards furthers the goals and aspirations of the Interfraternity Council.






Coach Hickey ponders strategy during an intense moment of play.

N. C. STATE 14 CAROLINA 13

The favored Tar Heels opened the 1964 season with N. C. State before a hometown crowd of 45,000. But an ever alert Wolfpack turned two pass interceptions into touchdowns and an upset victory. An attempt for a two point conversion failed with fortyeight seconds remaining in the game and the Tar Heels were left on the short end of the score.

After a scoreless first period, State end Tony Galmant intercepted a Danny Talbott pass and ran 45 yards for a touchdown, giving the Wolfpack a 7-0 halftime lead. Carolina came roaring back in the third period and climaxed a 75-vard drive with a nine vard run by Ken Willard. Dave Braine's extra point tied the game 7-7. The Wolfpack intercepted a second Talbott pass and scored two plays later on a 38-vard jaunt by Falgarano to lead 14-7. Stopped twice by the Wolfpack defense, the Tar Heels completed an 80-yard drive with a touchdown pass from Talbott to Willard. The pass for two points was batted down, leaving State with a 14-13 lead. Carolina recovered a Wolfpack fumble. but the clock ran out before the Tar Heels could put a scoring threat together.




Hard-driving Ken Willard goes over for six points as the Tar Heels out State's lead to one.

Sophomore Danny Talbott led an impressive looking Carolina to its first victory ever over a Big Ten opponent before 40,000 happy fans. The win, the Tar Heels' first of the season, was sweet revenge for the defeats of the past two years at the hands of the Spartans. Carolina displayed a powerful offense and a defense that allowed Michigan only four first downs in the first half.

A pass interception deep in Spartan territory provided the Tar Heels with another scoring opportunity early in the fourth period and Talbott scored his

second touchdown of the day on a one-yard plunge. Braine's kick was good and gave the Tar Heels a 21-0 lead. At this point Michigan exploded, scoring two touchdowns in six minutes. But fierce defensive play plus two pass interceptions deep in Tar Heel territory enabled the Heels to withstand the Spartan attack and capture a hard-earned victory.

A WAKE FOR THE DEACS


The undefeated Deacons of Wake Forest were rudely halted by a Carolina team that could do little wrong as the Tar Heels posted their second home victory. A vaunted Deacon offense made little headway against a Tar Heel defense that permitted only one first down in the first half, and only six in the entire game. An equally powerful Tar Heel offense scored in the first period on

a six-yard jaunt by sophomore Danny Talbott, giving Carolina a 7-0 lead. The Deacons were unable to move against a Tar Heel defense that permitted them to cross midfield only once in the first half. The second Carolina touchdown came on a fourth-down run by Ken Willard as he twisted over right guard for the score.




Players listen attentively as on-the-spot instructions come down from the stands.

As Ken Willard gives protection, Max Chapman ties the game with a 25-yard field goal in the third period.


L. S. U. 20 — CAROLINA 3

MARYLAND 10 — CAROLINA 9



Bob Hume makes a spectacular catch against the Terrapins in the Oyster Bowl.




U.S.C. HALTED AT HOMECOMING






Tar Heel John Atherton looks good on a 13-yard run midway in the first period,

It was a sad day in Athens as the Georgia Bulldogs stymied Carolina's ground attack and ran through the Tar Heels' defense for a 24-8 victory. Georgia's immovable line forced the Tar Heels to take to the air and the Heels completed 20 of 35 passes for 207 yards. The Tar Heels' only score came late in the fourth period on a 10-yard smash by halfback Ken Willard that capped a 72-yard drive. Black's pass to Axselle was good for the two-point conversion that ended Tar Heel scoring for the afternoon. The victory gave Georgia a 13-12 lead in the series which started in 1895.

THE TAR HEELS PUT THE TIGERS IN THEIR TANK

On a sunny day in "Death Valley," the Tar Heels spoiled Clemson's Homecoming and recorded their first victory ever on the the Tiger home field. The Tar Heels matched an alert defense with a balanced offense to completely overwhelm the Tigers. A first period Clemson fumble quickly became a Carolina touchdown on a one-yard run by Gary Black. After stopping the Tigers cold, the Tar Heels marched 60 yards in fourteen plays and scored on

Kicker Dave Braine missed his second extra point of the season, but a safety added two more points to the Tar Heel total. The Heels last score came late in the fourth period on a 69-yard pass from Gary Black to Ronnie Jackson.






THE CAVALIERS SQUEAK PAST THE TAR HEELS

The Cavaliers snapped a six year losing streak to the Tar Heels as they won a free-scoring Homecoming game in Charlottesville. The exciting game saw the lead change hands four times and the score tied three times before the final outcome was decided.

Virginia scored first, but the Tar Heels came right back as Ken Willard capped an 80-yard drive with a diving touchdown. The Tar Heels took the lead early in the second period on a 39-yard pass from Black to Jackson, but the Cavaliers stormed back to tie the score. A 30-yard pass from Gary Black to Bill Darnall gave the Tar Heels a 21-14 halftime lead. On the third period's only score, Virginia capped an 82-yard drive for a touchdown. The Cavaliers went ahead early in the fourth period, but couldn't contain the Tar Heel attack, as Gary Black passed 15 yards to Darnall for Carolina's fourth score. The extra point failed, giving Virginia a one-point lead. The Cavaliers increased it to four points on a 43-yard field goal with 1:45

remaining in the game. The Tar Heel passing attack sputtered, and the Cavaliers wrapped up their first victory over the Tar Heels since 1953.




Hard-driving Ken Willard soars over the goal line as he scores the Tar Heels' first touchdown of the afternoon,

VICTORY WAS SWEET

It was "THE" game of the year, and Seniors Ken Willard and Eddie Kesler won it for the Tar Heels before 45,500 cheering fans. The powerful Carolina running attack plowed through the Dook line for 315 yards while the Tar Heel defense held the Blue Devils for a rushing total of 58 yards. But the day belonged to the halfbacks as Kesler and Willard ran for 279 of the Tar Heels' 315 yards.

Kesler set a U.N.C. rushing record, breaking the 1946 mark set by Charlie Justice. Willard's 107 yards enabled him to become the second Carolina player in history to amass more than 2.000 yards on the ground. His three year total of 2.041 is second only to Justice's four year total of 2.814.



Gary Black hands off to Eddie Kesler behind the beautiful blocking of Carolina's forward line.


The Tar Heels took a first period lead as Willard rammed through for the score. On a nine-yard pass from Black to Axselle, the Tar Heels scored for the second time and gained a 14-3 halftime lead. Following Dook's score early in the second half, the Tar Heels drove 72 yards in four plays for their third score. Carolina held off Dook threats following a fourth period score and wrapped up the victory in the fiftieth meeting between the two teams.

Charging fullback Eddie Kesler is shown as he gains some of his




TAR BABIES HAVE AN UNDEFEATED SEASON

The 1964 edition of the "Tar Babies" had their first undefeated season in many years. Under the direction of Coach George Barclay and his able assistants Tom Cabe, Barry Westfall, and Gene Westfall, the young squad of 44 boys indicated that they would be of great help to the varsity in the coming years. The season began with a 20-14 come-frombehind win over the Maryland "Turtles." The game showed the sensational Tar Baby defense led by linebackers Bill Spain and Mike Horvat, and the explosive offense featuring quarterback Tim Karrs passing to Charlie Carr and Len Duncan. Next, the Tar Babies defeated the N. C. State "Wolflets" 26-0 in the annual Shrine Bowl game in Raleigh. Many of the fans were greatly impressed with the fine running of David Riggs and Jim Masino. The third game was one of the toughest on the Tar Baby schedule, and the defensive team had to put up a goal line stand more than once to halt the "Deaclets" from Winston-Salem. Jim Vota and Joe Bailey bolstered the secondary in the 14-12 victory. The game with Virginia was played in a sea of mud, and neither team could do very much. A key pass interception by Jack Davenport helped the Tar Babies to a 14-0 win. The last game of the season was the sweetest for the players and the fans: Tar Babies 30—Blue Imps 28. Going into the fourth quarter, the Tar Babies held a 30-7 lead. but a fired-up Dook team narrowed the margin to only

HARRIERS TAKE STATE CHAMPIONSHIP

An 8-1 season plus the State Championship title is a record to be proud of, but the 1964 season was a letdown for Coach Joe Hilton's fleetfooted team. The U. N. C. Harriers were turned back by strong Maryland runners in their hid for an unprecedented fifth straight A. C. C. title. Injuries to senior star Charlie Little kept him from reaching peak form as Co-Captain Jim Meade (2nd in A. C. C.) and Art Maillet (7th in A. C. C.) led the Tar Heels, with Senior Co-Captain Jerry Smith, junior Bill Janowitz, and sophomores Trip MacPherson, Drummond Bell, and Eddie Daw adding depth to the team.

The Harriers opened the season by swamping South Carolina 17-40, and Georgia Tech 19-46. As the season progressed they took perfect wins (15-50) over North Carolina State and Duke. Other wins included Wake Forest, East Carolina, Clemson, and Virginia. The only losses came at the feet of Maryland, 25-30 in a regular season dual meet, and 45-72 in the Conference Championship Meet. Though placing second in the A. C. C., the Harriers were victorious in a post-season meet against nine North Carolina college teams and once again took State Championship laurels.






Park McGinty controls the ball.








Jim Talbot and Will Polak are in hot pursuit of the elusive ball.








DOLPHINS SURGE TO EARLY SEASON SUCCESSES


Swimming at Carolina has come a long way since 1939 when the university lost the first intercollegiate swimming meet in the school's history to Virginia by a 45-30 score. Since that time the Tar Heels have met thirty different opponents and compiled a record of 209 wins against 37 losses. This season the tankmen under Coach Pat Earey appear to be reaching for higher goals as the mid-season mark is passed.

Five All-American swimmers, Co-Captains Harrison Merrill, Davis Roberts, juniors Fred Lipp, Rick Forum, and John Sheldon returned from the 1963-1964 team that defeated every A. C. C. opponent, finished third in the Eastern Regionals, and was ranked sixth nationally. The biggest loss from last season was three time All-American Thompson Mann, Mann was last year's eo-captain who went on to win a gold medal in the 1964 Olympics, setting a world record in the 100 meters backstroke. The addition of several talented sophomores to the team, including nationally-ranked Pete Worthen, has eased this loss, but the Tar Heels still remain somewhat weak in depth.


The U. N. C. swimmers have gotten off to a fine start this season, compiling a 9-1 record through the first semester. This spring should see the lleels once again in the National Championships.








Other performances of the band included representing the


THE CAROLINA PLAYMAKERS

The Carolina Playmakers enjoyed one of their most successful and well-received seasons during the 1964-65 academic year, presenting five major productions and three bills of student-produced, one-act plays. The season opener, "My Fair Lady," was presented for four nights in Memorial Hall. This production proved to be one of the most popular efforts in the Playmakers' history, playing to over 5,500 theatergoers and breaking all Playmakers attendance records. The December production of "Hamlet," presented in commemoration of the 400th anniversary of the birth of Shakespeare, enjoyed an extended run of nine performances in the Playmakers Theatre.

The 1964-65 season, the Playmakers' 47th year of presenting both original and standard dramatic works on the U.N.C. campus, also included major productions of "Oh Dad, Poor Dad, Mama's Hung You in the Closet and I'm Feelin' So Sad," "Billy Budd," and "A Streetcar Named Desire,"

A popular Playmakers innovation has been the "Student Night" performances, in which the opening performances of each play are reserved exclusively for U.N.C. students and









their dates. Tickets for these performances are made available at reduced rates.

Serving as a community theater as well as a laboratory theater for students in the Department of Dramatic Art, the Carolina Playmakers also sponsor an active Student Workshop Theatre in which experimental productions are presented.





FINE ARTS FESTIVAL

For the first time since 1944, the Carolina Fine Arts Festival was given rebirth on campus. The first was held by Richard Adler, noted composer of Broadway musicals; but the movement died soon afterwards because of the Second World War. It was revived at a meeting in May, 1962, when interested students met to discuss its placement on a permanent basis. A decision was made on its formulation for the Spring of 1965 with a subdivision of six areas: Art. Drama, English, Radio, Television, and Motion Pictures, Journalism, and Music. The visiting lecturers, performers, or critics for the respective departments were Ben Shahn, Lecturer of Art; Robert Chapman, commenting on the screenplay for Billy Budd; the Literary Symposium, sponsored by Esquire magazine: Robert Crowther, movie critic of the New York Times: William Schuman, President of Lincoln Center and noted composer: Peter Nero; Jacques Barzun of Columbia University in addition to other noted guest scholars.


In the last fifteen years there has been a great expansion of interest in the role of the arts in modern society. Although there has always been a place for the arts, particularly music, in American life, it is only recently that they have ceased to be the property of a small group and have become truly popular. A very large part of the credit for this new popularity has been the universities. Already at Chapel Hill we have the beginnings of a significant collection of painting and sculpture in the Ackland Museum, and a working program for the production of work of high quality in these fields by students and faculty. Performances of distinction are given by the Music Department and by the Playmakers. A great deal of interesting and able work is being done in the area of Radio, Television, and Motion Pictures. In the field of creative writing, we are happy to have, in addition to the permanent staff. Writers-in-Residence who join our community for shorter periods, during which they engage in creative writing and offer formal instruction and encouragement to students.

The purpose of the 1965 Carolina Festival was twofold. A series of first-rate performers and performances focused attention on the high level of what is being done here now in the fine arts and provided inspiration for further progress. The Playmakers produced Billy Budd. The Music Department produced a concert; there was a showing of significant recent films, and an exhibition of paintings in the Ackland Museum. In many cases, prominent performing artists were invited to Chapel Hill to add strength to our local talent. In addition, a group of distinguished scholars and critics will be invited to discuss some of the problems arising out of

STUDENT GOVERNMENT ESTABLISHES RESIDENCE COLLEGE SYSTEM

The phenomenon of a mushrooming University with all its complexities has been a new, major problem facing Student Government this year. Mass registration, mass classes, mass intercollegiate sport activities, and mass housing accommodations are the necessary characteristics of a University which encompasses more than 11,000. The student gets the impression that he amounts to no more than a few holes punched in an IBM card: he feels a sense of anonymity heightened by the lack of significant personal involvement in the academic community.

Student Government officers were led by President Bob Spearman. Vice-President Don Carson, Secretary Madeline Gray, and Treasurer Jim Light. They were aided by Presidential Assistant Mike Chanin. Press Secretary Miriam Dorsey, Miss Williams, the Executive Secretary, and by more than 600 students holding positions on over 35 Student Government Committees. Working continuously for the improvement of the academic, cultural, and social life of students, they combined forces with the administration and faculty to meet the challenges of our massive University.

The concern of Student Government about the growing University led to the beginning of a Residence College System. Residence Halls located closely together are being grouped into self-governing colleges in an effort to bring a more significant group life to the residence hall, through an increased emphasis on academic, cultural and recreational concerns.

Student Government also co-operated with the University administration in setting up several social rooms including the Joyner Pilot Project. Expenses were shared on a 2-1 basis, the Administration paying twice as much as Student Government.

To stimulate a greater interest on public issues, Student Government co-sponsored National Issues Week October 26-30 with various other campus organizations. Such outstanding figures as Averill Harriman, Under-Secretary of State for Political Affairs: Richard Starr. noted political science professor and member of Voice of America; and Herbert Philbrick, author of *I Led Three Lives* and counterspy for nine years, spoke on topics of national concern. A mock presidential election, won by President Johnson, was conducted on November 2.

A community service project, Volunteers in Giving a Hand (VIGAH), was organized by Student Government with the advice of officials of the North Carolina Fund. These volunteers are setting up typing and adult reading classes in the preparation of government surplus foods.

The State Affairs Committee has sent a number of students to speak at various civic clubs throughout the state in an effort to improve the over-all public opinion of the University

and discuss its role in the state. Students also personally contacted state legislators to acquaint them with the University's budget needs.

A course evaluation booklet was written and published by the Academic Affairs Committee. It evaluated courses which are either very popular on this campus or which are outstanding but relatively unknown to students.

Through the Student Government Report, a monthly newsletter informing students of student government activities and programs, communications with the campus were broadened. President Spearman and Vice-President Carson both spoke in many residences during the year explaining student government issues.

Student Government also worked with many new projects including a campus radio station, the President's Commission on the Status of the Coed, the establishment of a President's Cabinet, composed of the Presidents of the Men's Residence Council, Women's Residence Council, Carolina Women's Council, Panhellenic Council, and the Interfraternity Council, a joint student-faculty committee to propose reforms in the Campus and Honor Codes, and the re-establishment of the Fine Arts Festival in the spring of 1965.

Anxious to do more than merely observe the rising turmoil that was Europe in 1936, and concerned with the changes being injected into American society by the New Deal. students in the Political Science classes of the late Professor E. J. Woodhouse formed the Carolina Political Union.

The Union, designed to provide sponsorship for speakers prominent in the field of public affairs and to promote debate among the selected membership, thrived from 1936-1954, During this period, the Union brought such speakers to the campus as Senators Claude Pepper and Gerald Nye, Speaker Sam Rayburn, President Franklin D. Roosevelt, and Congressman John F. Kennedy.

The C.P.U. was re-organized last Spring on the initiative of several student leaders who felt that such a non-partisan discussion group had a definite place in the University community. During the past year, the Union has met with Senator John Sherman Cooper, Rep. Frank Thompson, Gov. Ross Barnett, Dean William S. Barnes (of the Harvard Law School), former Governor Averill Harriman, Herbert Philbrick, and several faculty guest speakers. The Union meets each Sunday night in the Grail Room of Graham Memorial. The members are selected by interview before the Union, which is limited to thirty members from both the graduate and undergraduate student body.

S. N. E. A. PROMOTES PROFESSIONAL INTEREST

The Thirty-Seventh Legislative Assembly has had few peaceful sessions. Early in the session, a proposal to submit the question of the controversial student boycott on the campus for a referendum provoked several nights of stormy debate.

In early October it became apparent that efforts were being made to have Carolina disaffiliate from the United States National Student Association. The possibility of a campus referendum on affiliation was debated in committee and on the floor as pro- and anti-N.S.A. forces sought to hold the referendum under conditions most favorable to their cause. The final resolution was followed by a three-week campaign climaxed with a record voting turn-out which brought 5.400 students to the polls. N.S.A. affiliation was maintained by a margin of almost five per cent.

The fall half of the Assembly saw a deluge of financial appropriations, as the Legislature departed from its past precedent of appropriating from the Unappropriated Balance and began dipping into the General Surplus.

As the Thirty-Eighth Assembly began, Legislature turned its attention to continued residence hall improvements and the establishment of a Residence College System. Encouraging reports from the Campus Radio Committee added to the hope that S.G. would have its own radio station soon. Judicial and Orientation Reform also seemed probable for consideration.

ATTORNEY GENERAL INVESTIGATES ALLEGED VIOLATIONS

It is the duty of the Attorney General's staff to investigate and present before the appropriate council any alleged violations of the Honor or Campus Codes. The expanding University and increasing importance of the role of the judiciary has necessitated a specialization in several areas. In addition to the staffs of the Men's and Women's Councils, there exists another group to handle all residence hall violations and to present these cases before the M.R.C. court. A fourth group exists to handle cases appearing before the I.F.C. court.

When a case is reported to the Attorney General's office, it is assigned to a member of the staff for investigation. Another member is assigned to serve as defense counselor for the accused in order to explain his rights and the procedure of the council. It is the duty of the investigator to summon all necessary witnesses, gather statements, and present his own summary of the case. The defense counselor assists in aiding the defendant himself.

In essence, the Attorney General's staff represents the contact between the accused students and a particular judging body. It was originally set up so that members of the council would not have to do investigation themselves and thus have prior knowledge of a particular case.



MEN'S COUNCIL ESTABLISHES STUDENT-FACULTY COMMITTEE

The Men's Council is the court of original jurisdiction for male violators of the Honor and Campus Codes. Its purpose is to mete out justice for violators, to lead campus thinking and attitudes toward honor, and to direct standards of behavior in a positive direction.

This year, the most important activity for the Council was the establishment of a student-faculty-administration advisory committee on the Honor System. The committee met throughout the year calling members of the University community to air their views about the System. Late in the spring, a report was issued to the Chancellor, giving the committee's complete re-evaluation of the principles and workings of the Honor System — the first such study in recent history.

Besides questions of procedure, the committee considered the more fundamental issues of the University's responsibility for moral education and the extent to which it should exercise its jurisdiction.

The Council attempts to make the Honor System a positive code of conduct and integrity — one which applies to all members of the academic community, faculty and student alike.

WOMEN'S COUNCIL SEEKS TO IMPROVE HONOR SYSTEM

The Women's Council. composed of eleven geographically elected members and a chairman, is the court of original jurisdiction in cases involving the alleged violation of the Campus and or Honor codes by female students. In addition it tries cases involving specific violations of Women's Residence Rules such as latenesses of an hour or more. Appeals from House Councils also are heard by this body.

Aside from these regulatory functions, the Council, through various elected representatives, seeks to improve the Honor System and the students' knowledge of it. This year the chairman is serving as a member of the Chancellor's Advisory Committee on the Honor System, an advisor for the Student Government Committee on the Status of the Carolina Coed, and as a consultant for the Women's Residence Council Rules Committee. She also meets regularly with the President's Cabinet, the Dean of Women, and the other heads of student judicial bodies.

The House Council Coordinator meets regularly with the vice-presidents of residence halls and sorority house managers to supervise and coordinate the work of the various House Councils on campus. Members also serve on the Honor System Study Commission and the Constitutional Council.

Through these various related groups the Council seeks to fulfill a creative role with regard to the Honor System.

PUB BOARD ESTABLISHES SUB-COMMITTEES FOR SPECIALIZATION

The Publications Board supervises the financial transactions of the Daily Tar Heel, the Yackety Yack, the Carolina Quarterly, the Carolina Handbook, and any other Student Government publications. The Board is in charge of hiring and firing employees, preparing budgets, and determining salaries for the publications, This year, for the first time, sub-committees were established to handle long- and short-range planning and to deal with special problems of each of the publications. The Board is responsible to both branches of Student Government and to the student body as a whole for proper reception and allocation of funds.

HONOR SYSTEM COMMISSION QUIZZES JUDICIAL MEMBERS

The Honor System Commission has worked this year to strengthen and clarify the U.N.C. Honor System. One of its first duties was to administer orientation and quizzes for prospective members of the Men's and Women's Honor Councils. This year, for the first time, the Commission gave quizzes to members of all judicial courts within the university.

The Commission has also worked closely with the University of Oregon in an attempt to change U.N.C.'s Campus Code so that it will apply to students only while they are on the Carolina campus.

Another major endeavor has been to establish a Public Defender's Staff to provide active defense for students going before a judicial court.

The Commission has had the responsibility of traveling to various high schools throughout the state and introducing U.N.C.'s honor system to the students.

The Commission has also compiled a brochure on the mechanics and philosophy of the Honor System, which aided its Speakers as well as provided a source of information for requests by other schools.

ACADEMIC AFFAIRS STRIVES FOR COMMUNICATION

The Academic Affairs Committee strives towards communicating with and easing tensions between the students and the faculty. Its goals surpass those of former years in hopes of more thoroughly aiding the student during his academic career at North Carolina. Through more extensive work it also is attempting to gain the respect of the administration.

This year a course evaluation booklet is being published to aid the student in choosing his elective courses during the following semesters. Through objective criticism of courses and of permanent faculty members, it will enable students to become aware of outstanding courses offered by the university.

It will also help the administration to realize how the students feel about particular courses and professors.

The Committee also is working with an evaluation program which will evaluate every course, including those that are good, mediocre, and bad. The results of the program will then be made available to the professors, so that they will be aware of the weak or strong points of their courses. This program will be handled with the aid of questionnaires and computer work. The effectiveness of seminar groups and other problems which concern the academic life at Carolina will also be investigated.

DEBATE TEAM IS TOPS IN EAST

The Debaters again proved to be one of the top teams in the East as they represented the University in tournaments at Kentucky. Emory, N.Y.U.. Dartmouth, Wake Forest, Harvard, South Carolina, and Pittsburgh, Debating the topic RESOLVED: "That the Federal Government should establish a national program of public work for the unemployed." the team defeated such strong national powers as Miami, Loyola, Georgia, Wake Forest, and Duke. It also played host to the N.C. High School State Championship tournament and publicly recognized the top ten individual high school debaters in the state.

The team expanded its novice program this year with the addition of Mr. Charles Lucht. Assistant Director of Debate. to serve under Dr. D. K. Springer, Director of Debate. Under Mr. Lucht's supervision. the novice teams enjoyed an unprecedented year of success in intercollegiate competition as defending champions of the A.C.C.

STUDENT BODY VOTES FOR NATIONAL STUDENT ASSOCIATION

NAVAL R.O.T.C.

The ADX House, now in its sixth year as UNC's "oldest, newest, non-social, non-fraternity," began the year with an all time high 45 pledges.



The School of Medicine, known as a paragon since its inception in 1930, has offered the complete four-year undergraduate program only during the past twelve years, but in that time has risen to a point considered unsurpassed in medical education.

During this year the Memorial Hospital has incorporated new patient care facilities as well as new research potentialities, both designed to better the medical attention offered to all who enter in need of care. The staff of the School of Medicine and of the Memorial Hospital not only maintain the instruction of the medical students, but include in their teaching program the education of members of various Health Affairs departments and the interested practicing physicians throughout the state.



With the advancing medical research and practice and the developing of more efficient laboratories, the medical technologists are becoming a more vital part of the health affairs.





HEALTH AFFAIRS

The Division of Health Affairs, each section working independently and interdependently, comprises a major educational area in the University of North Carolina. Through class lectures, group discussions and consultations with students and instructors, and individual work with the patients the students learn their professional theory and skills.

The treatment of the patient as an individual integrates not only the areas of X-ray and Medical Technology usually associated with the hospital, but reaches for aid from dentistry, pharmacy, social work, and all concerned with returning this unique being to his community in the best possible health.







SCHOOL OF PUBLIC HEALTH


Students come into the School of Public Health with a sense of purpose — that of preparing themselves, usually in one academic year, for a new profession, Beginning as physicians, engineers, teachers, mathematicians, nurses, they have become imbued with the factor of health in economic and social development at home and abroad.

Students go out from the School of Public Health to the four corners of the earth. Problems of water and air pollution, of infant mortality and family planning, of nutrition, and of pestilence are universal in scope, and the public health student, whether he serves in a local community or in a far away land, employs the tools he has forged in his intensive training at our School.

One of fourteen such accredited Schools of Public Health in North America, students engage in study and research in ten academic departments of the school: Biostatistics, Environmental Sciences and Engineering, Epidemiology, Maternal and Child Health, Parasitology, Public Health Education, Public Health Nursing, Public Health Nutrition and Mental Health. All instruction is on the graduate level, with increasing numbers of students pursuing doctoral studies.

LAW SCHOOL

Founded as a private school in 1843 by William H. Battle, the Law School was not completely incorporated into the University until 1899. Battle, a judge of the Superior Court, later a justice of the State Supreme Court, was made Professor of Law in the University in 1845 and the University provided that the degree of Bachelor of Laws should be conferred on those completing the prescribed two year course.

The School maintained a certain independence from the University for a long time. The Professor of Laws received no salary, though he did receive fees from his classes. The students were not entirely subject to the discipline of the University. This was the position of the School during the professorship of Judge Battle, who retired in 1379: during the two years when the law classes were conducted by Kemp P. Battle, then President of the University: and to a considerable extent, during the professorship of John Manning, who was elected in 1331 and died in 1399. The building in which the School is now located was named for Professor Manning. In 1399, the School was completely incorporated into the University as the School of Law. The first dean was James C. MacRae, previously a justice of the Supreme Court of North Carolina.

A succession of deans has followed Dean MacRae. This year marks the beginning of a new stage in the history of

the School. Not only did the School open its doors to the largest first year class in its history, but also welcomed a new dean, J. D. Phillips succeeds Dean Henry P. Brandis, Jr. who served from 1949 until 1964.
