All of my life, a part of my mind has been in Chapel Hill. Carolina was inside a thick red velvet bound book stamped in gold, *Yackety Yack 1907*. I knew the Class of '07 very well, especially the football hero who died the next year. And when I came to Chapel Hill in the summer of 1976, almost seventy years later, I found it to be fundamentally no different. The book came to life. As they said in '07,

“Yes, everything is just the same —
Same old campus, same old well,
Same old jaybirds raising hell —
You bet I'm glad I came.”

In Chapel Hill you can still go to Jeff's and get a vanilla Coke (alcoholic content of the vanilla: 32%); you can still get shoes repaired at Lacock's; you can still have a suit tailor-made for you at Julian's; you can still read all the books in the Intimate without buying any of them; you can still go to a movie, a play, or a concert most any time; and you can still walk to all these places from campus. Chapel Hill is one of the few places, in fact, in which you can still carry on a totally civilized existence without an automobile.

From the next generation — my father, and my uncle — I heard all sorts of tales. I heard about the big party at the Sigma Chi house in 1941, when my father's two sisters came from their colleges to visit. My uncle, of course, was missing. My father found him downstairs in the spooky basement, throwing circus knives at his roommate whom he had pinned to the wall. I also heard about the time they went on an expedition to Duke to paint “Beat Dook” all over the campus on the eve of the big game. The next day they were both in the Beat

Dook Parade, which somebody decided to take through Durham. My father was nearly pulled off the runningboard of a car by irate Dookies.

A definite picture of college life was growing in my mind, a sort of never-never land:

“Oh, father and mother pay all the bills
And we have all the fun — hooray!
That’s the way we do in college life.”

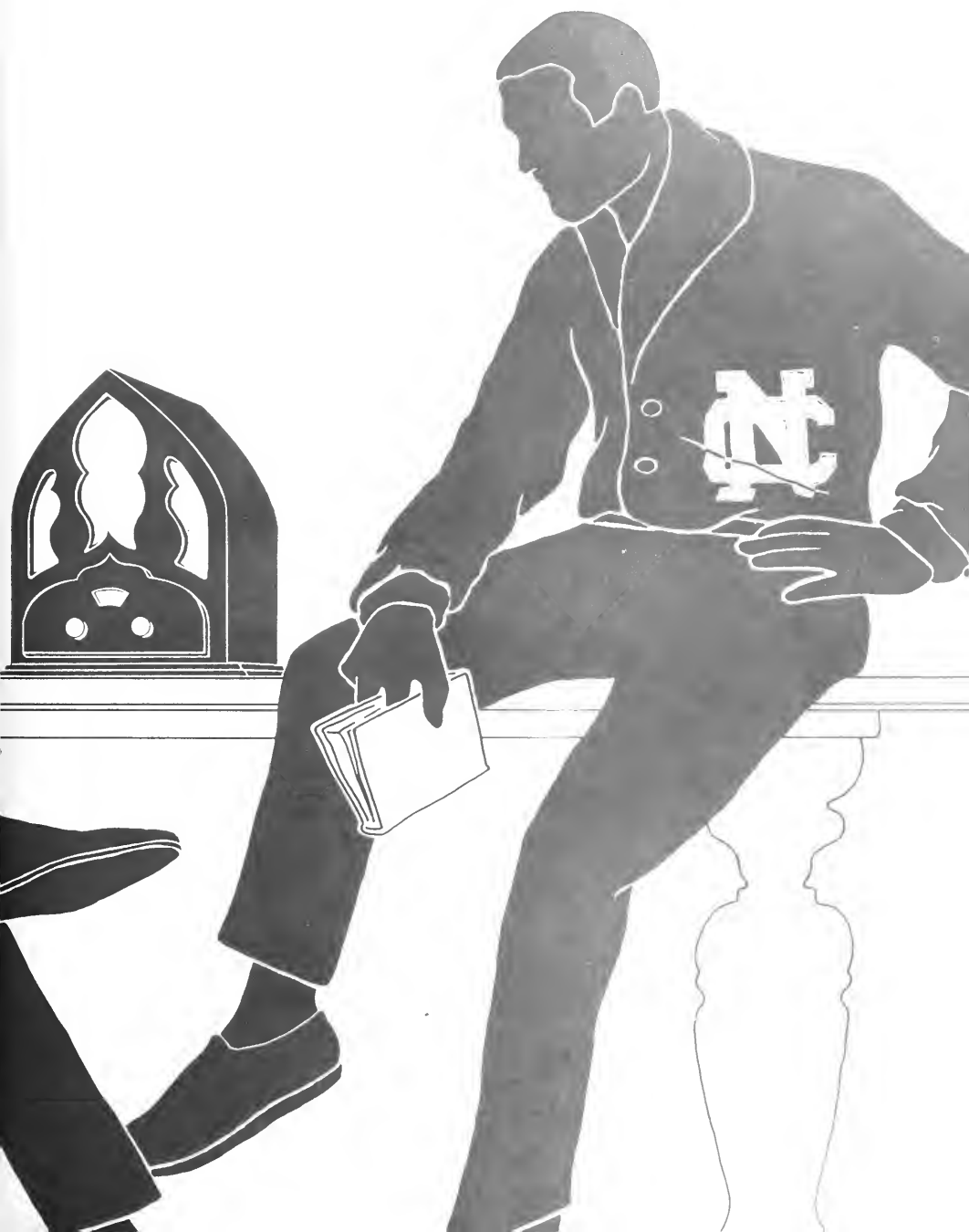

Often it disturbs me that the vital thing in my life, and most of my friends’ lives, is not the education we are getting here, but the fun we are having. At times Chapel Hill looks like a great big nursery school. There are moments when I cannot imagine what I’m going to do after I leave. Every student has them, those little darts of fear when you don’t know if you can *stand* being a dentist or an insurance salesman or a wife-and-mother after four years at Carolina. The darts come thick and fast the Senior year, and as the dreaded graduation day approaches students begin changing their majors or applying for law school. It is a bizarre spectacle, a university full of students trying frantically to keep from graduating.

En route to Franklin Street one afternoon, I met a man taking his ferrets for a walk in the park. Two long narrow animals on a leash waddled through the pink flower petals heaped up around Howell Hall. In a little while the ferrets had drawn an enthusiastic crowd. It was just another day at Chapel Hill. This place is like paradise, in which we eat the forbidden fruit of knowledge and then we are ejected to the cold world outside.

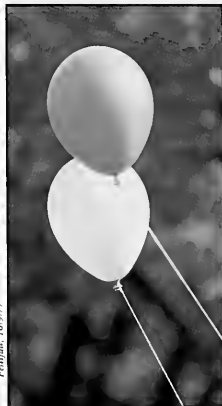
Playing in the Street

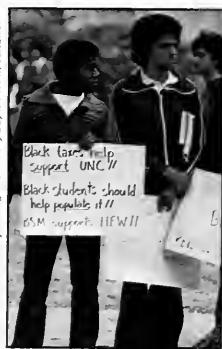

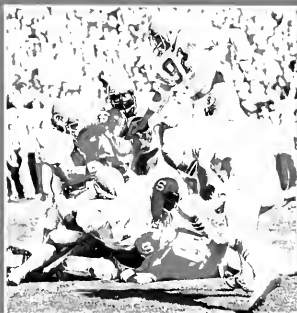


A Brief Visit

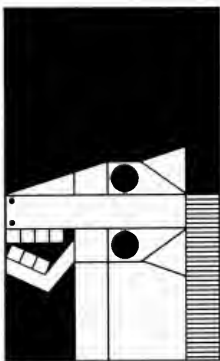


Former Governor Holshouser speaks to UNC College Republicans, 10/20/77

"But do *you*?" a voice said from the crowd.

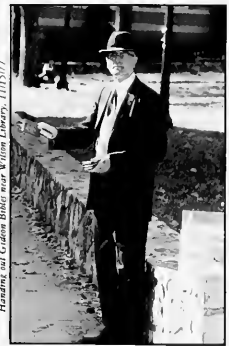

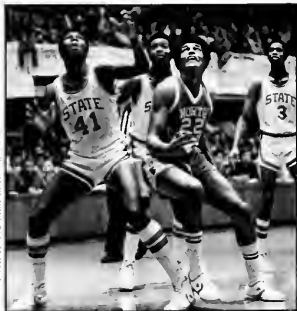

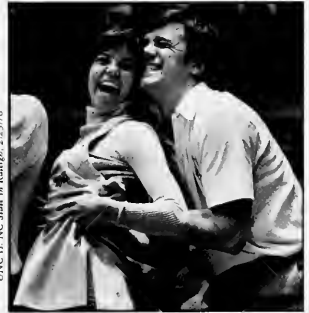

President Friday continued to insist that moving a program to a school would not make that school any more truly integrated.

UNC. Then Charles Kuralt took the stage. A large cherubic man, he stared thoughtfully at the audience. His full, rich voice filled the hall, the soul of authority.

"I wish Servereid were here," said Mr. Kuralt.

He went on to explain his function on the CBS news staff: "When there is a phenomenon like a swimming pig in Akron, Ohio, CBS turns to me."

"My wife especially liked that one," Dr. Spearman called out.

"I cringe that she remembers it," Mr. Kuralt remarked.

The liveliest part of the talk was the question-and-answer section. Mr. Kuralt told us, in the course of giving some answers, a story about how CBS had inadvertently caused a riot in Nicaragua: "We had set up a camera crew on a street in the capital, underneath this big clock. We were waiting for it to strike twelve, which would be in about fifteen minutes, so that we could begin the newscast with 'It is the hour of decision in Nicaragua,' or something equally trite. Naturally the people walking up and down the street began to notice us, and they all stopped and stood around waiting to see what would happen. Soon we had attracted quite a crowd, and while we were all standing there waiting for that clock to strike twelve some activists came along and started chanting anti-government slogans. Soon the whole crowd was chanting along. Then

the police came. Then ABC and NBC came with their camera crews to film the riot, and we got the hell out of there. We called up CBS headquarters in New York and told them, 'We've started a riot in Nicaragua!' All they said was, 'Did you get it on film?'

One girl asked if an *On the Road* story had ever been so ridiculous that CBS had refused to air it. "Actually, the silliest story I can remember doing was the one about the swimming pig, and CBS ran it with great joy. I think after being buried under such an overwhelming load of serious national news like CBS is every day, they are delighted to see a story about a swimming pig."

The inevitable question followed: "What *was* the swimming pig story?"

"Oh, we went all out on it, with underwater photography of the pig, all kinds of sophisticated techniques, and we ran it on the CBS Evening News. The next week we got a bunch of letters from farmers saying, 'You idiots! Any pig can swim'"

The talk ended at 10:00, but we were all invited to a reception in the Faculty Lounge at Morehead. At the reception I met some people I knew from the Journalism School, and we all lined up for punch. Dr. Spearman came along, saying, "Where's the refreshments?"

"I'm first in line," I said.

We all fell to talking about the merits of creative writing as opposed to the merits of journalism, and I made a remark as to how pushy journalists have to be. "Just so," said Dr. Spearman, breaking line in front of me.

Mr. Kuralt had already come in, but the crowd was thick around him. Dr. and Mrs. Spearman couldn't even get over to him to say goodbye when they left. I felt sorry for him, because he wasn't even in range of the refreshments, but someone else with the same idea carried them to him where he sat on the large table in the middle of the room, talking and swinging his legs.

THAT SEASON TIED TO AUTUMN

The end of summer came and when it had gone, you did not even know it had passed. It was stifling hot and as University Lake dwindled into a mud-puddle and the electric fans still pushed the hot air between your toes at night, you waited for fall and cool air and blue skies, so that when you looked at the pine trees which bordered the stadium, they would no longer waver in the heat.

They waited, too, in Ehringhaus Dormitory where they had been since August, perched high above the hinterlands known as South Campus. They waited for the hurricanes to come pinwheeling their way up the coast from Florida, bringing rain and cool air. Above all, they waited for football season, that season tied to autumn.

There is something primitive about it all: a sense of new blood coursing through your veins like the moon pulling the tides. And in the morning when you wake up exuberant it is for no more reason than that there is a new front in from the coast. Even if you are an intellectual who shuts himself up in a dingy hole near the Coffee Shop for a grey winter's contemplation of Kierkegaard or Heidegger, even if you think that Bill Dooley is a character from a nineteenth-century Southeastern folk song and that Famous Amos is a northern cookie dating from your childhood, you will come outside in the fall. And for a brief moment, you will wonder whether you wouldn't really rather burn your musty books in the piles of smoldering leaves and play football like a good ol' boy.

Perhaps your mind was so troubled on a mid-September afternoon, when over the mountains in Lexington, Kentucky, Carolina opened its season against its Peach Bowl opponents of last December, the Kentucky Wildcats. Ad-

renalin pumped wildly months before this contest as the Tar Heels looked for a chance to redeem themselves from their poor bowl performance. They nearly merited such redemption, leading the nationally-ranked Kentucky team 7-3 well into the fourth quarter. Then, the Heels fumbled a punt that set up the winning 10-7 score for the Wildcats.

Despite the loss, it had been respectable effort against a highly-regarded team, and there were plenty of individuals who could foretell that the University of Richmond would offer little resistance when they entered Kenan Stadium the following Saturday. They were correct. UNC scored thirty-one points through the air and on the ground; Richmond scored nothing. The smell of gunpowder from the cannon which sounded after Carolina scores mingled with that of smoke in the end zone opposite the field house. The alumni, who sink ever deeper into their Carolina blue cups regardless of the score, were not displeased by their team's performance. They celebrated by crowding into the bars and restaurants that line Franklin Street, and by drinking their way towards the Sunday morning newspaper.

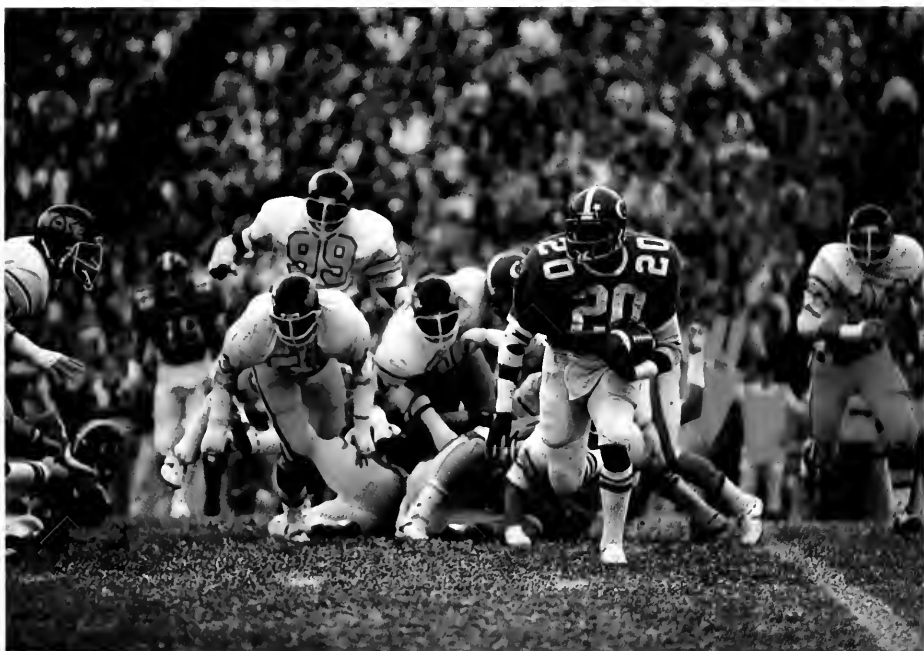
Many asked the question upon perusing their sports pages: where was the celebrated Amos Lawrence? Coaches all the way from Chapel Hill to Columbus, Ohio, believed that he possessed marvelous potential, but he had gained only twenty-five yards against Richmond and had not even played the week before. It was in sparsely filled Dyché Stadium in Evanston, Illinois that the slender running back answered the questions that had plagued him already in his two game career. Midwestern sportswriters wrote after the 41-7 Carolina victory that he came out of nowhere. In fact, he came from Norfolk, Virginia, the home of merchant marines, bushleague pirates, and minor-league hockey. On that cool afternoon, Lawrence spun away from Northwestern tacklers for a fifty-three yard touchdown run, and accumulated 101 yards in a mere ten carries. The defense too, had played well, for at the end of the game, they had held their first three opponents of the season to a meager 14 points.

Before you knew it, the first day of October had arrived. You could hear the drums from the stadium over in the wood-framed houses of McCauley street long before game time, and if the drums did not move you in some primitive fashion, you could sit on your front porch and watch the fraternity boys and their dates stroll past. In their pockets, they carried the same style hip flasks that their fathers had merrily concealed back in the Forties. Back then, they had a running back named Charlie Justice, who had come down out of the mountains to the Piedmont and established himself as a hero in the days after the war.

But on this day in October, Choo-Choo Justice, for that

was what he was still called, graced not the football field but the pressbox. He worked as a color man on radio and was as partisan as ever. You could tell from the excitement in his voice that he believed Amos Lawrence possessed all of the potential they had said he did. Carolina's foe that Saturday was Texas Tech, ranked nineteenth in the national polls. If the Tar Heels were able to defeat them, they would edge ever closer to the highest echelon in college football, where the Notre Dames and the Ohio States and the Alabamas had long ruled. Indeed, they seemed well on their way in the first half, as Phil Farris scored on a six yard run and the defense, spearheaded by All-American Dee Hardison, kept Tech scoreless. The second half, however, belonged to the visitors, as they rang up ten points to UNC's none, aided by the injury which kept quarterback Matt Kupec out of the game. When the game ended and the rushing stats showed that freshman Lawrence had gained but 19 yards, you almost expected to hear Charlie Justice's voice quaver with a bit more modesty about his distant successor. Actually, you heard nothing of the sort. Justice was as irrepressible as ever, already looking toward next weekend, when Atlantic Coast Conference rival Wake Forest slipped into Kenan Stadium.

It rained that day, and the leaves cascaded down around the campus. Nevertheless, forty-eight thousand fans jammed the stadium as Carolina put on the kind of defensive show that made it the national leader in scoring defense for the season. Wake Forest was soundly beaten, 24-3, and the highlight of the game was strong safety Alan Caldwell's seventy-two yard runback of a fumble for a touchdown.

Next weekend everything was still. Many students had packed their cars and gone to spend a couple of days at home. Those that remained listened to a gleeful Woody Durham and a euphoric Charlie Justice echoing off the balconies, as the two announcers described the Tar Heel's 27-14 unmaking of their sister institution, North Carolina State. State had been ranked twentieth in the nation but Carolina's defense allowed the Wolfpack only sixty-one yards rushing while Amos Lawrence raced around Carter Stadium for 216 yards. Jokes about tractors and hayseed mentalities were widespread after the game.

Few students traveled home the next weekend when North Carolina battled South Carolina in a rivalry that was not nearly so heated as it had once been. All in all, it was a fine fall day — particularly if you like punts. There were eighteen of them that afternoon, with USC averaging six yards more a punt. However, they led in almost no other statistical

categories, mainly because of the Tar Heel defense, which overwhelmed the Gamecock ball-carriers. The end result of such a stifling defense: a 17-0 victory for the North, and a 3-2 record for the Heels as they prepared for the University of Maryland.

You could hardly remember the last time Carolina had beaten the Terrapins; it seemed like centuries ago. Thus it was with some dread that North Carolina traveled into that wasteland known as College Park for what the sportswriters concisely call "a big game." If the Terrapins lost, they were eliminated from the ACC title race. In the contest, Carolina intercepted three Maryland passes, stopped them in a goal line stand, and watched as Tom Biddle kicked three field goals to salt the game away, 16-7. High in the stands, looking as immaculate as Greensboro Jaycees, the bowl scouts scanned the game and weighed their choices.

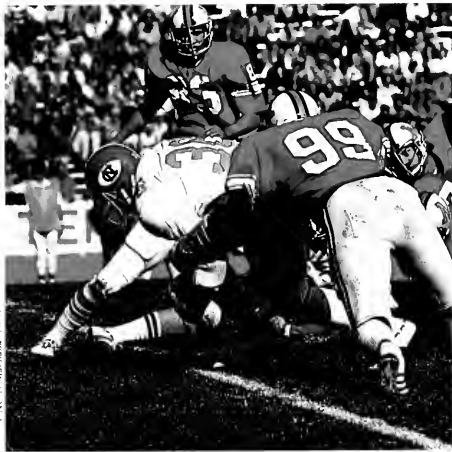

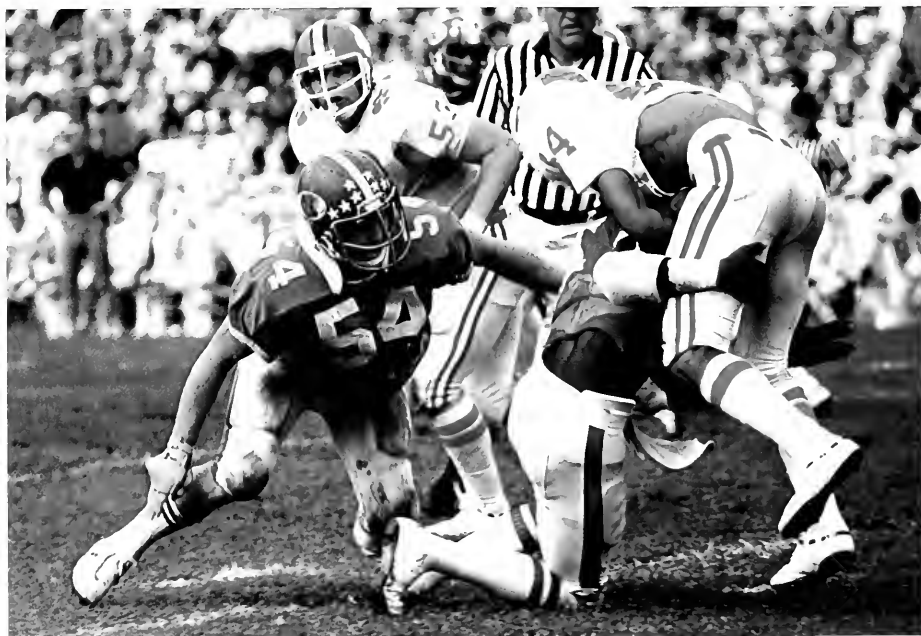

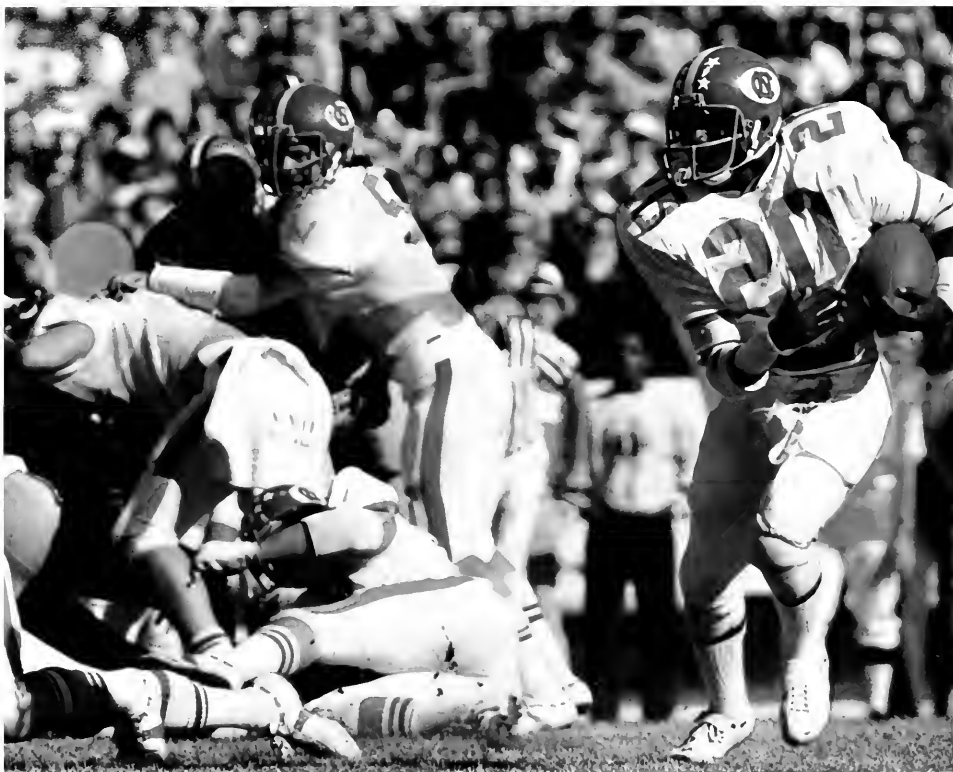

November 5 was homecoming day in Chapel Hill and as you drove past Hinton James, you could hear her say, "It's a good day for breaking up with your boyfriend." And then she would ask you "What are all of these people doing here?" and you longed to tell her something else but you surveyed the tailgates groaning under the fried chicken and Jack Daniels and answered, "We play Clemson today. Big game, Carolina has to at least tie." And then she was gone, to Durham she said, and the frustration you felt was mirrored in the game, in which Carolina came from behind to tie the Clemson Tigers 13-13, on a Tom Biddle field goal in the fourth quarter.

But occasionally, fall and football will miraculously peel away your frustrations until you feel like a child again. This is something you will deny if you fancy yourself an intellectual, but it is true nonetheless. The following Saturday produced an exhibition with that kind of effect, as Amos Lawrence returned to the high country of his home state and rushed for 288 yards against the University of Virginia. In the process, Lawrence broke Tony Dorsett's record for yards gained by a freshman in a single game, as well as the ACC game mark, held by Don McCauley. The score that day seemed an afterthought, but Carolina won, 35-14.

It would be a more suspenseful story if a Liberty Bowl bid for the Tar Heels was riding on the outcome of the Duke game,

played eight miles away in Durham. However, it was fairly certain that if Carolina performed decently against the Blue Devils, then they would go to Memphis, win or lose. What was at stake was the ACC championship and a year's worth of bragging rights — for the teams' followers if not the players themselves. By the end of the afternoon, Carolina had paced out a methodical 16-3 win, relying principally on defense and field goals. A Liberty Bowl bid was duly proffered and Dooley accepted.

NO SURPRISE

Carolina lost in that Liberty Bowl on a cold December night to Nebraska, and to put it frankly, you were not surprised. You had suspended your disbelief for three quarters, as the Heels thoroughly dominated the Cornhuskers, and when Carolina finally succumbed, 21-20, in the fourth quarter, you were more disappointed than you would care to admit. In fact, when you heard the bartender in Harrison's say, "Ah hell, what do you expect; they were out of their league," you momentarily felt like slugging him. Later, you would learn that head coach Bill Dooley was leaving for Virginia Polytechnic Institute and that a mild-mannered Ohioan named Dick Crum would be his replacement.

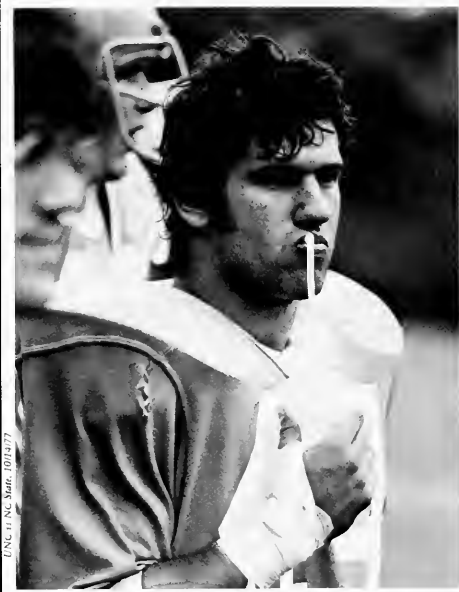

THE FUTURE

Western Rationality Meets a Palmist Who Lives
Not Far from Hazzersville

Long before that first October practice, there were strange occurrences and predictions signaling the season's approach. Though it was never widely known, a palmist who lives in a clapboard house on the outskirts of Charlotte entered a trance one hot summer day and predicted at least twenty-two wins for the Carolina basketball team. Her verdict did little to convince her client, already a skeptic, of the powers of the occult. When he stepped out of the cool, dim house into the sweltering afternoon he believed, on the basis of strict logic, that a national championship presented itself as a distinct possibility. Such a finish would of course entail more than twenty-two victories: the spirit he damned.

It was such logic, apparently, and not a peculiar configuration of the stars, that persuaded *Street and Smith's Basketball Yearbook*, as well as *Playboy*, to select the University of North Carolina as the nation's potential first place finisher. The Tar Heels ended up second to Marquette in the 1977 NCAA championship and returned possibly the finest guard in the country — professional or college — in Phil Ford, who in turn was supported by players like Mike O'Koren and freshman Al Wood. Not only that, the team was coached by Dean Smith, whose tactical abilities alone were probably worth several games a season.

For those who did not care for palm readers or sports writers, a more reliable indicator of the imminence of basketball season could be had by watching Mike O'Koren's hair. When the Jersey kid strolled by the Undergraduate Library and his locks had been cut shorter than they had been all fall, one knew that the season couldn't be far away.

A SEASON IS EXPLORED



One would have hardly noticed on the evening of December 10 when Carolina played Rochester in the sixth game of the season. In that contest, Smith had little to say. Up to the Rochester game, the season had gone well, with one exception. Carolina opened with a pair of wins against Oregon State, then garnered the annual Big Four Tournament in Greensboro with hard-fought victories over a resurgent Duke and State. Then came the clincher: a surprising three-point defeat at the hands of an inspired William and Mary. Whether this defeat foreshadowed troubles to the weeks to come was hardly answered by that Rochester game, in which Carolina finally secured nearly a sixty-point margin. That night, at least, Smith talked mostly to his players.

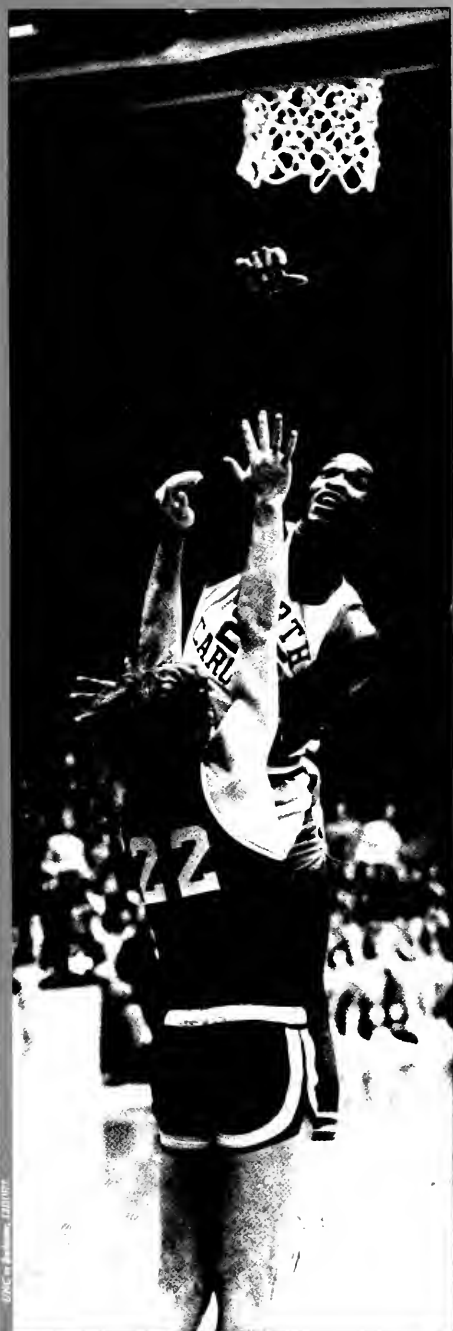
Subsequently, the Tar Heels led the Great East for New Orleans, where they disposed of Tulane, and then Hawaii, where a sea-burned contingent subdued three Western schools to capture the Rainbow Classic. Then, fading, the team returned to the mainland and slipped by Clemson on the road; then they defeated Virginia, also on the road. At that point, it seemed that Carolina might indeed be a strong contender for the national crown.

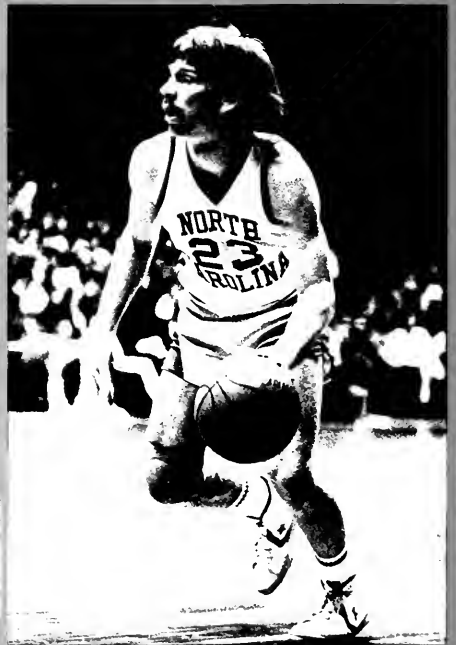
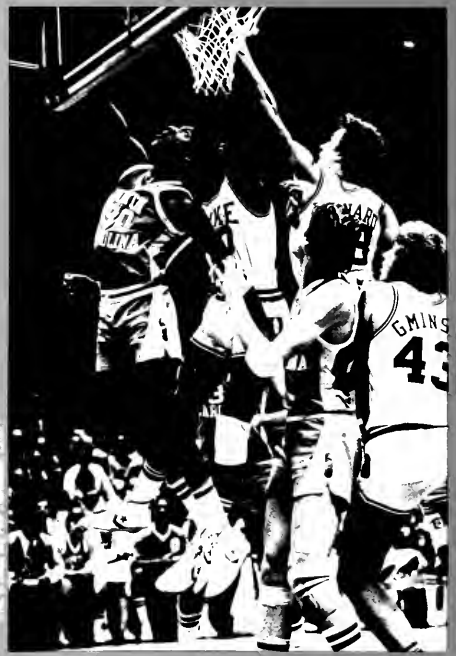
It was odd on the steps of Wilson Library that Wednesday night, January 18. The clock struck nine and the young

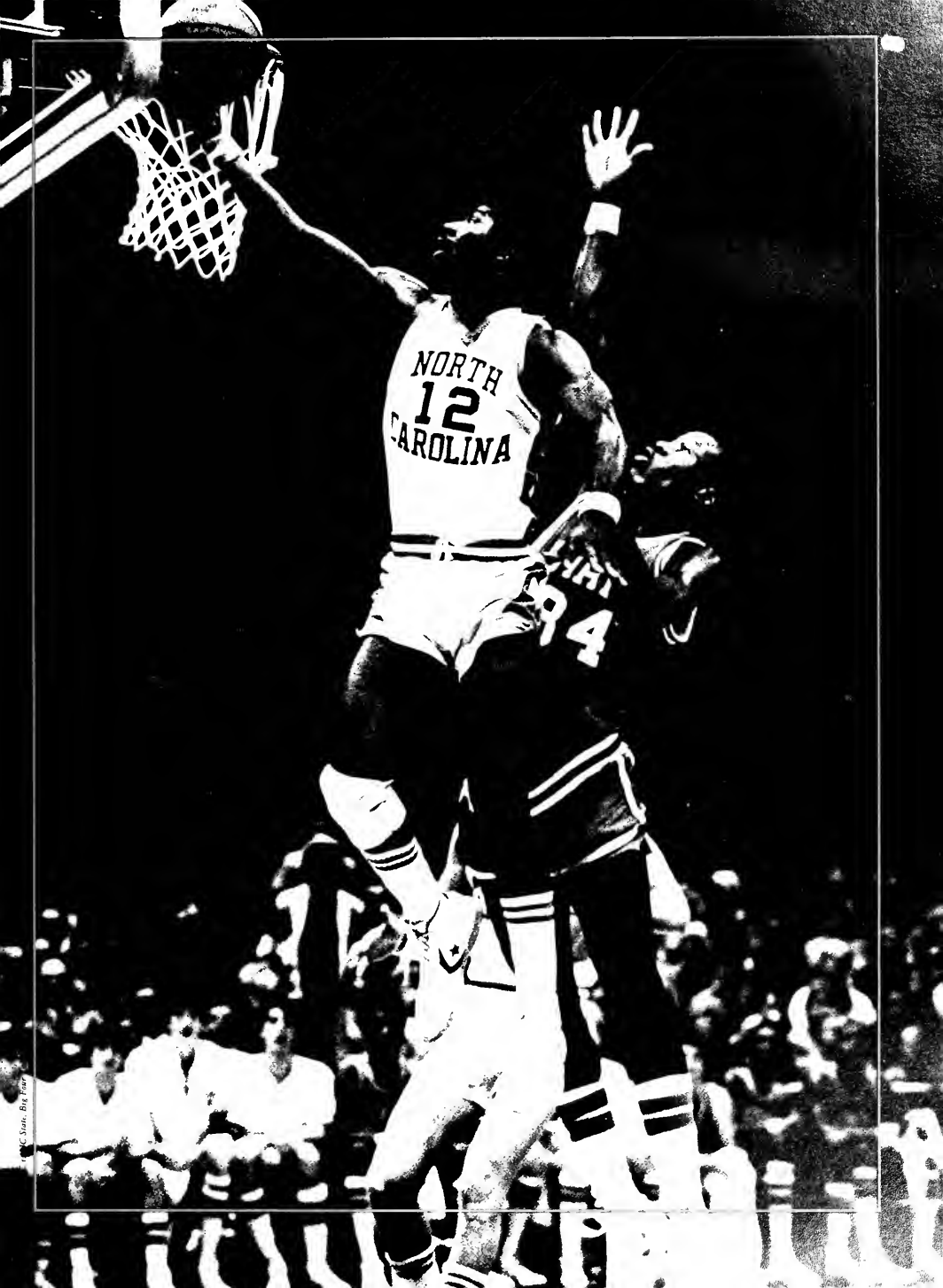
scholars emerged from the library. They shuffled out into the icy air, hugging their Proust and Plato. The wind whipped across their faces. Sadly, they considered the futility of man in the ever-expanding universe.

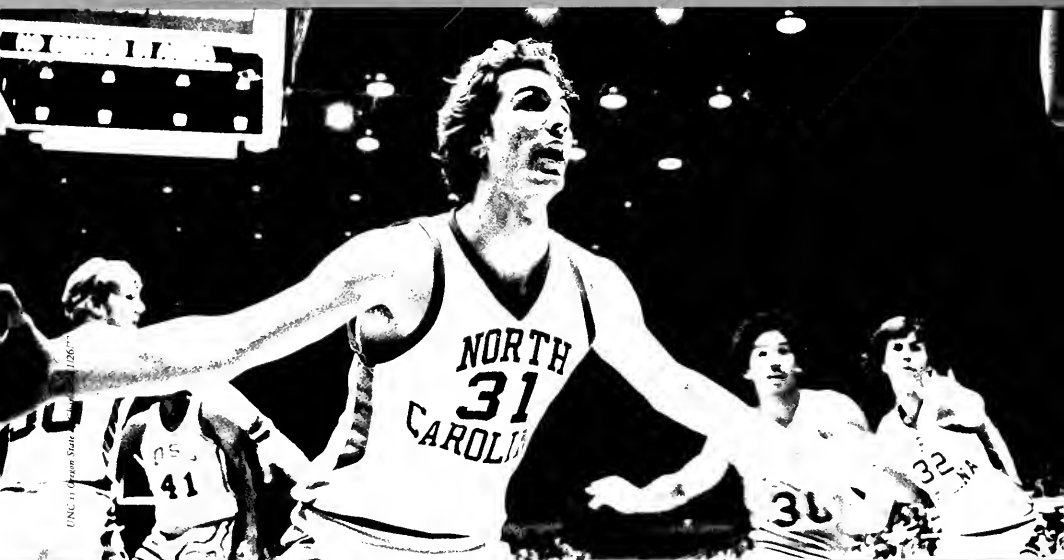
There was a brief cure for this cosmic melancholy. Before the primal gloom had eaten away their souls, they found the warm glow of a television set. For a few moments, they felt close to humanity from all parts of the campus, from Fraternity Courts to Hinson James — for, the foe is N.C. State, and it is secretly thought that if State can be beaten, then all is not so vain. State was beaten that night, by five, in a game that left everyone in awe.

However, earlier in the week, Carolina had lost to Duke in Durham for the first time since 1972. Hardly had they had time to recover from the defeat when they took on Wake Forest in Chapel Hill a day later. The Heels squeaked past Wake by only two points. Later, Carolina defeated Maryland before traveling to Winston-Salem and suffering a nine-point loss to Wake. The streak of eight consecutive ACC contests ended against Clemson, who was routed by the Tar Heels, 98-64. It was becoming difficult to predict what this highly rated team would do from one game to the next.









Carolina barely escaped from lowly Mercer. Had two of Mercer's shots at the buzzer gone in, they would have topped the nationally third-ranked Heels. There was no eluding Furman, however, which thoroughly outplayed UNC in Charlotte's North-South Doubleheader. The Heels, led in total by Phil Ford, did come away from Charlotte with one win, over Virginia Tech 101-88.

Again, it was Phil Ford, directing the four corners for attention mistakes at Maryland, who gave North Carolina a 66-64 victory. His teammates called him Bugs Bunny because of the way he hopped around the court when scored. Opponents might well have called Phil Ford other names because of what he did to them in games. His name comes Rocky Mason, whose he developed a style of play which often left big-city players stumbling to themselves. At the outset's conclusion, he had swept nearly all of the nation's most valuable player awards.

Was this man of the season, Carolina played well in sports. They rebounded into the 1969-bound Northeast in mid-February which they won impressively over Rutgers at

Madison Square Garden. However, the next day, the team lost a tight one in Providence on National television, 61-59. UNC returned home to wallop Kent State and Virginia, but lost to Duke in Raleigh, so Ford missed his first collegiate concert because of a wrist injury.

Thus, the Duke game was vital to the Heels in their attempt to maintain control of the ACC. Not surprisingly, it was Ford who sparked a cam-fan-behind win over the Blue Devils in his last home game with a career high of 34 points. With six seconds left, he hit the two free throws which sealed the game away. The victory proved a crucial one, for it provided the Tar Heels with the ACC regular season championship, but more importantly, with a first round-by in the ACC Tournament.

Carolina fell to Wake Forest, however, in the semi-finals of the Tournament, and one wondered whether the UNC team had ever been so good as they were initially cracked up to be. They answered this question against San Francisco in the opening round of the NCAA Western Regionals in Tempe, Arizona, to which they received an at-large bid.

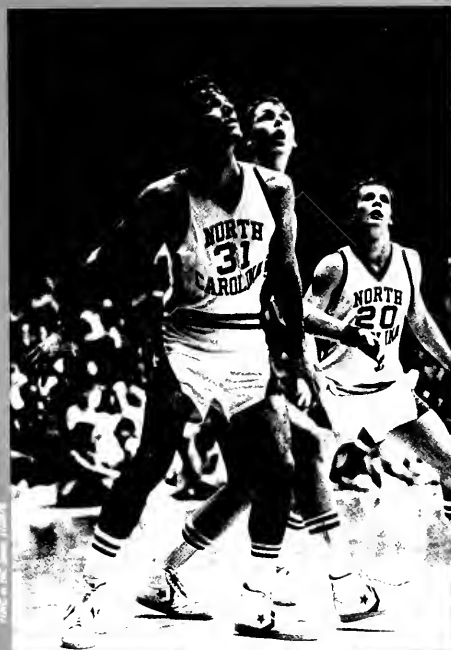
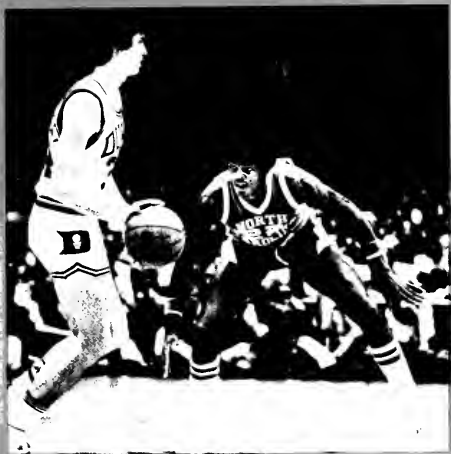


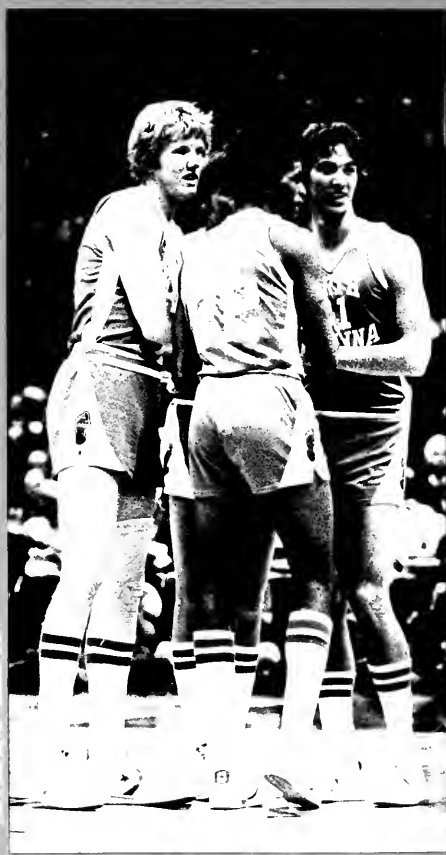

Though Dean Smith is a masterful basketball coach, he knows little about the stars, or he might have missed Carolina's season to that of the Comet Kibouché's. If one number been correctly, the comet was supposed to have almost scraped the sky, the brightest comet since Haley's. And though what we ended up with was certainly respectable, Kibouché would always appear as something of a flake after the extensive build-up it had received in the press.

Honor Code changes rejected by committee

The university is currently evaluating the plan, and it is expected to make a decision in the coming weeks.

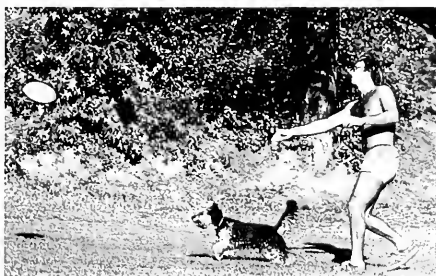

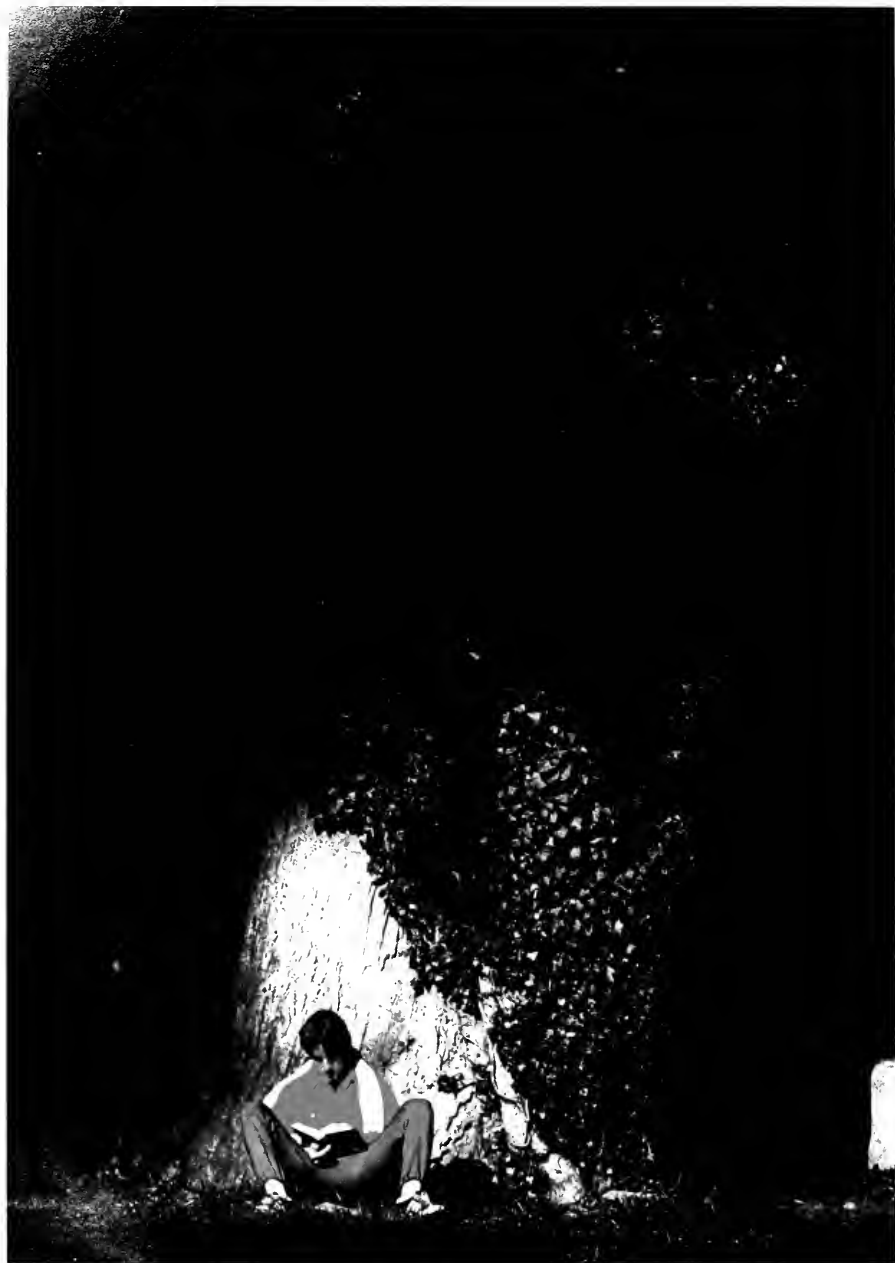
