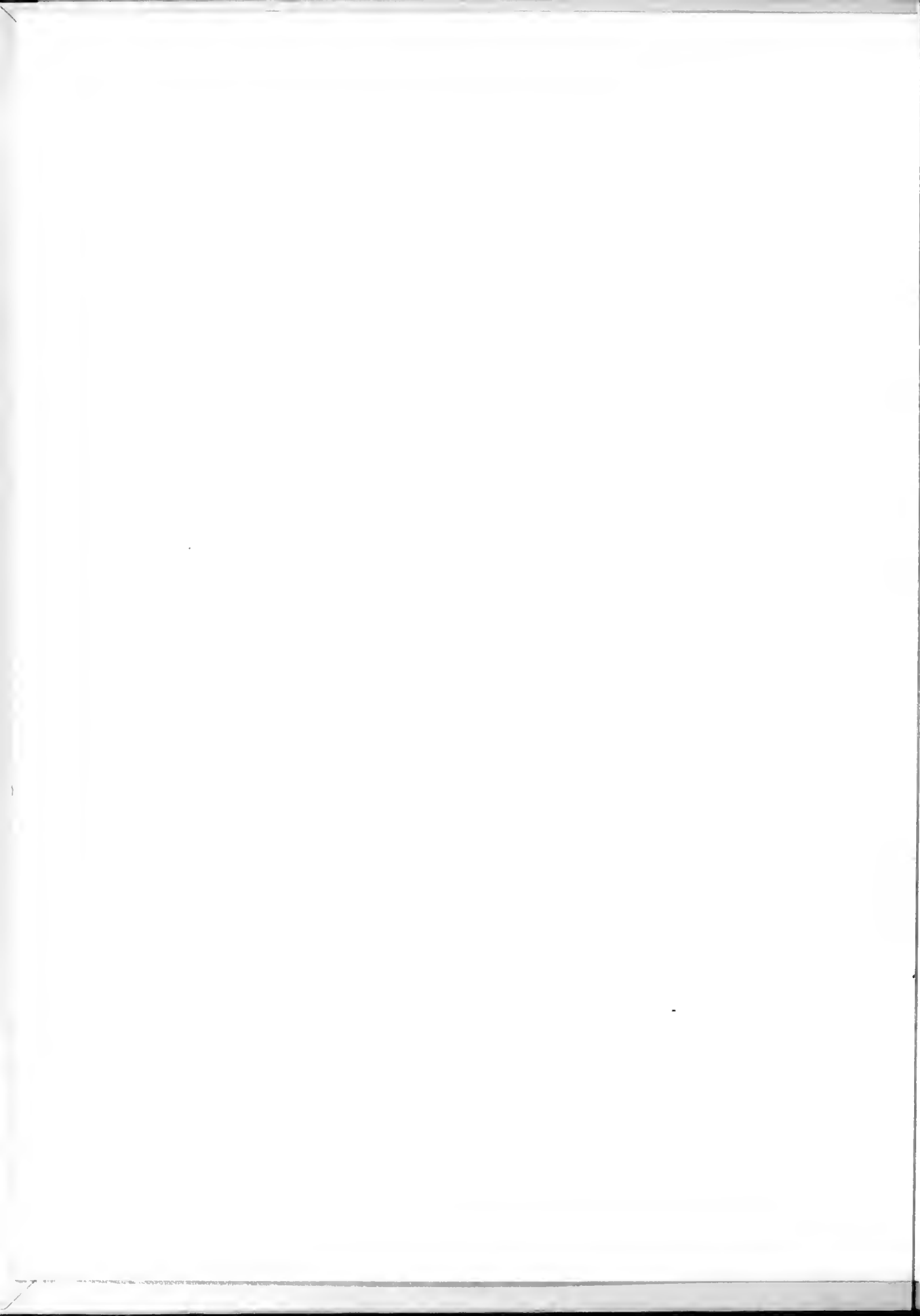

PREFACE

The aim of the 1984 YACKETY YACK is to convey a collective experience rather than the experience of individuals. Since it is impossible to document, the life of each individual in a community the size of this university, we have instead sought to show the totality, hoping that each individual will find his or her place within that whole. The 1984 YACKETY YACK is intended to be a book of self-discovery. Today most of this work is too current to be evaluated for its ultimate worth. Eventually we will rediscover in these pages ourselves, our world, and the experiences that had ultimate meaning to us. In order to give definition to these specific memorable experiences we have divided the book into seven somewhat arbitrary categories:

Documenting the Environment; the environment undeniably has an effect on our daily lives. This section includes the natural, the man-made, the beautiful, the ugly, the kitschy, the classy, the banal, and the exciting. It records the changes in our environment, both seasonal and temporal, not only in Chapel Hill and Carrboro, but as far as the university's responsibilities lie, in the entire state of North Carolina.

Life in Motion; this section attempts to focus more closely on the dynamics of student life within the university community. Due to the nature of photography we are restricted to recording instants. But as our lives are in a constant state of flux the task of accurately representing our lives becomes increasingly difficult. However we have resigned ourselves to compiling this section of moments with the hope that they are the right ones and truthful to our subjects.

Persuasions; there are numerous issues, causes, concerns, and choices that confront students. In this section we have concentrated on the more public arenas of religion, arts and entertainment, politics, and an active concern for our future.

Athletic Endeavors; in addition to academic concerns there exists in many the desire for the more physical aspects that typify the student athlete. Ranging from the glamorous to the virtually unknown, this section attempts to bridge the gap between swim tests and national championships.

The Vital Ingredient; there is a mass of humanity that makes this institution work, namely the students, teachers, and administrators that are this university's most valuable assets. In this section we highlight these people in both their formal and informal poses.

Alternative Lifestyles; of all the decisions that a student makes upon entering college, the choice of lifestyles is one that greatly determines attitudes and friendships. Whether it be on or off campus, fraternity or sorority, these are the ties that draw us together. This section presents the societal portraits that try to illustrate the options.

Extending the Limits; this section is dedicated to those people and events that went beyond normal limits and expectations. In their respective arenas these people and occurrences had significant effects on the university as a whole. These last pages represent the things that, were, ponder the things that might have been, and look to the things to come.

These categories are neither all inclusive nor wholly exclusive, all the aspects of the university cannot be categorized so easily. We certainly can not hope to make a comprehensive statement about the university within the limited space of this yearbook. Hopefully what we have accomplished is to capture the essences that express what it meant to be a part of the University of North Carolina in the year 1984.

DOCUMENTING THE ENVIRONMENT



his year our nation celebrates the 400th anniversary of the arrival of English settlers on the Outer Banks of North Carolina. Four hundred years is a short time in history, but it is a long span in the life of an institution. One of the most enduring institutions in our society is the university. Of the many institutions in the western world when those ships left the Plymouth harbor that April morning in 1584, only some 75 have survived to the 20th century. Of these, 70 are universities, institutions on the same land in some of the same buildings, governed in much the same way they were four centuries ago.

It is not surprising that these early settlers established universities in America and there emerged a new concept of a university, a state university. The University at Chapel Hill was the first of these new public institutions to open its doors in 1789.

William Richardson Davie is called the Father of the University, but many men had a hand in its founding. The first president was Joseph Caldwell, who in the early years stressed good teaching. He also recognized the responsibility of a university to teach science and provided the latest in scientific equipment for this purpose. Dr. William Thornton took the lens from one of Dr. Caldwell's telescopes with him on the space shuttle Challenger last November. That telescope, with lens replaced, is on display today in the Morehead Building.

By the second decade of the present century, Dr. Edward Kidder Graham was advocating that the boundaries of the campus be coterminous with those of the state. Thus, the Extension Division, the Institute of Government, North Carolina Memorial Hospital, and many other agencies now serve the needs of thousands of citizens every year.

Frank Porter Graham brought the University to national prominence as a center of intellectual freedom and active social concern. He also broadened its influence far and wide.

Through its teaching, research, and public service the University must continue to be a dynamic force in the life of our state. Throughout history it has been nurtured by the citizens of the state, its alumni family, and friends. This venerable institution, born in the spirit of the American Revolution almost two hundred years ago, has emerged today as one of the most respected and productive institutions in the United States.

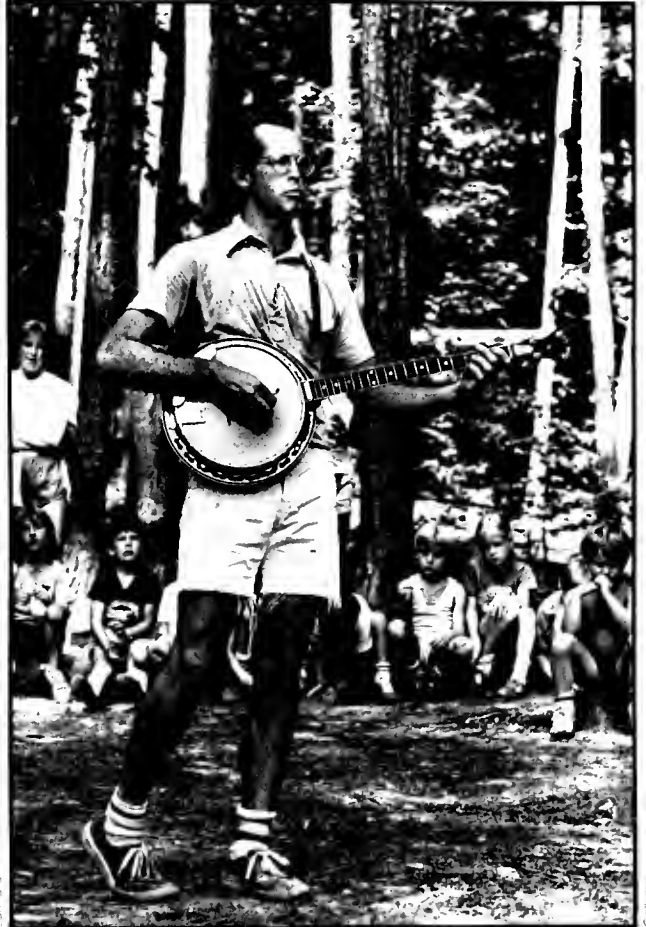

Davis Library is finally open, and my worst fears have been realized: The undergraduates have descended. fractions of the Honor Code and/or Campus Code.

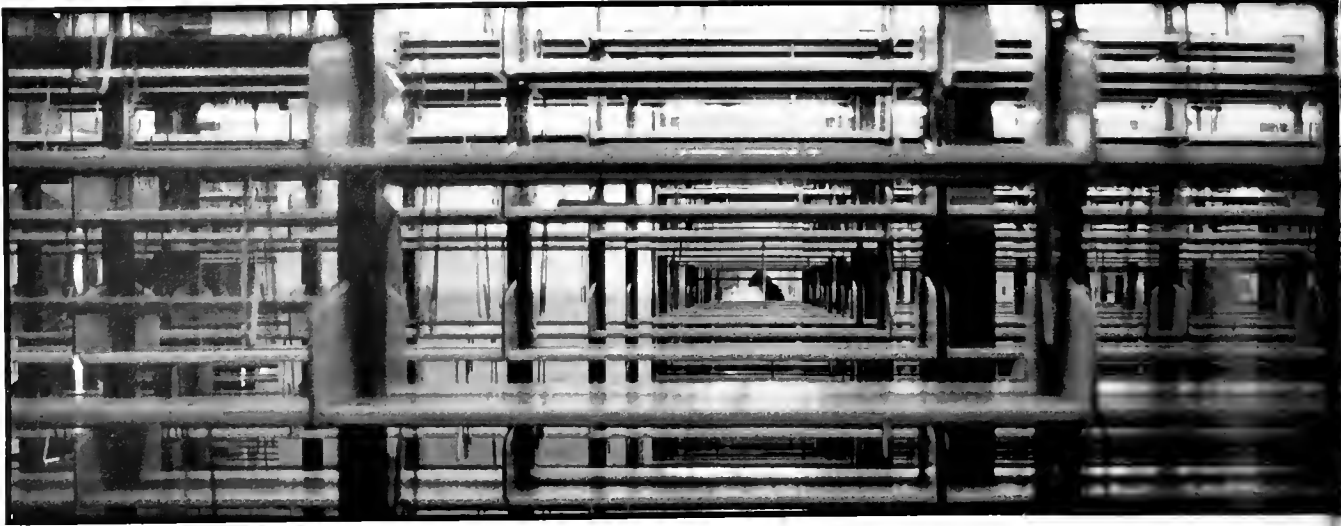
*Hold required seminars outlining literary etiquette for those benighted souls who don't understand how they should act.

And Sports Illustrated put us on their cover twice.

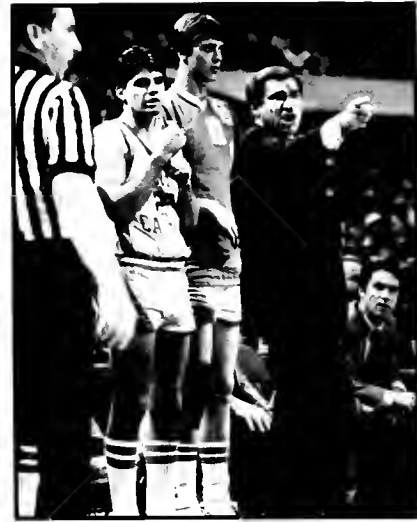

And Michael Jordan has turned pro ...



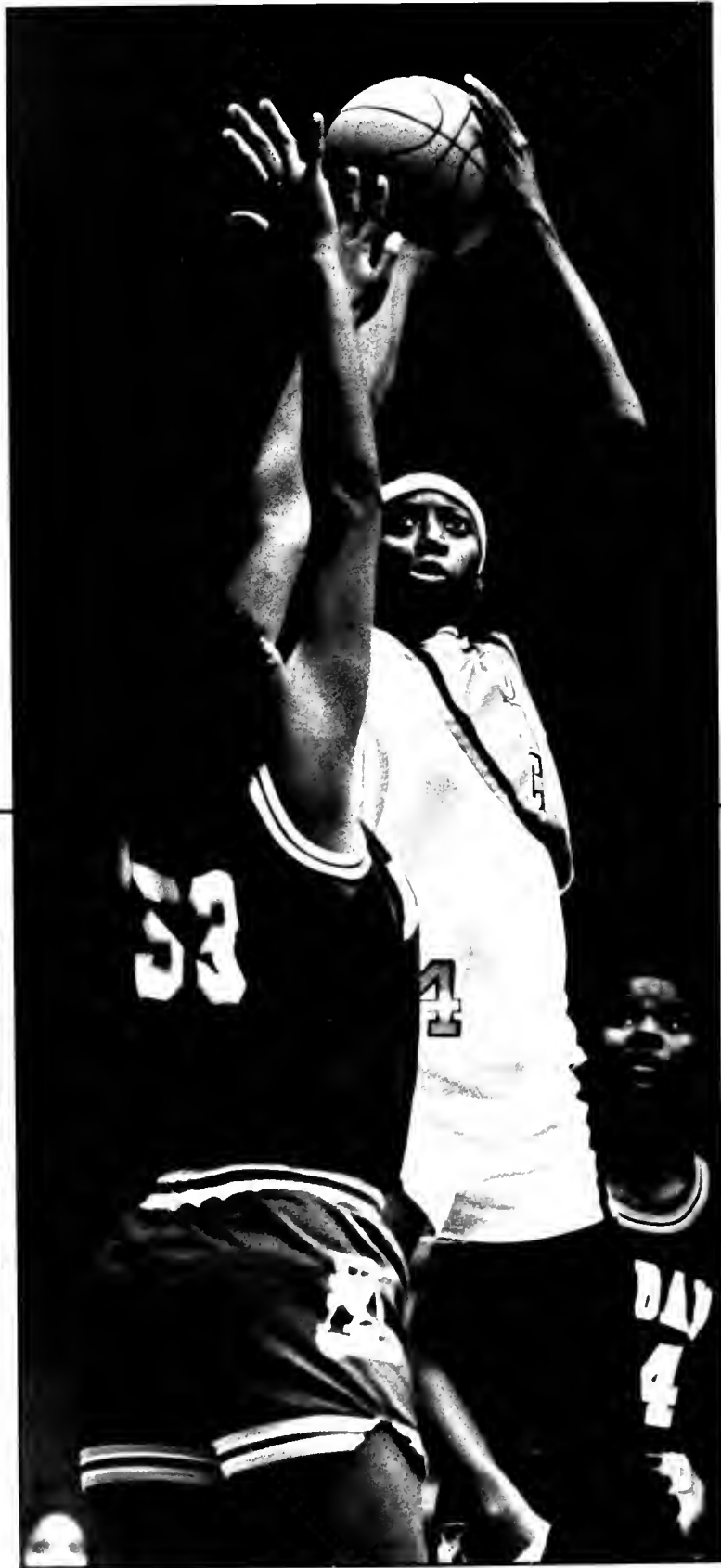

On November 19, 1983 the Tar Heels defeated Duke University, 34-27 in the first night game ever played in Kenan stadium. This victory ended a three-game losing streak and sent the Tar Heels to Atlanta, Georgia to play Florida State in the Peach Bowl. Only a scattering of fans could endure the freezing temperatures as they watched Head Coach Dick Crum suffer his first ever post-season defeat to the Seminoles, 28-3.

The Tar Heels were led through the 1983 season by defensivemen William Fuller and Micah Moon. Offensively, Ethan Horton rushed for 1107 yards while Tyrone Anthony rushed for 1063 yards. With the addition of these two running backs, Carolina has now produced 16 backs who have rushed for 1000 yards or more in a single season. U.N.C. leads the NCAA, with the University of Southern California ranking second with 15.



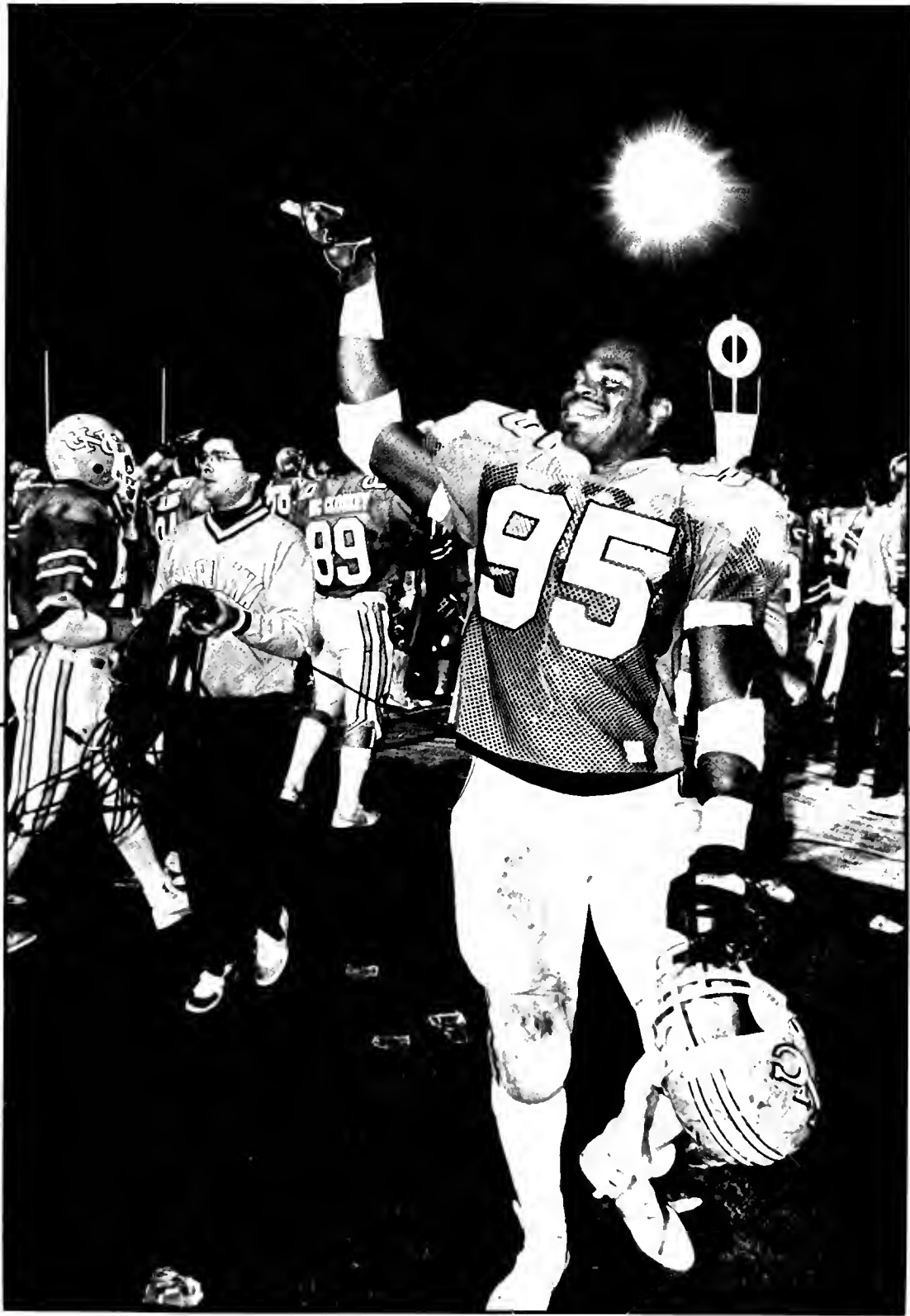

I realize that the Chapel Hill Police Department is undermanned, but in this case, however, it is irrelevant. At approximately 3:40 p.m. I saw two officers, one from whom I received the ticket, walking past Whitehead. The violations of the "traffic lane" were clearly obvious. Why should I pay a fine when the consistency of enforcement is blatantly disregarded? Parking is difficult enough. The public should not be subjected to the police department's whimsical method of random selection for violators. It is unjust and unforgivable. Do it right or don't do it at all!

This year, as in many years past, Henderson Residence College is sponsoring Springfest, an outdoor concert to be held on Connor beach in April. In past years, Springfest has attracted a few small bands from the area for a two day event. Mike Beverly, program director, and the Springfest '84 committee want to bring it back to the quality concert it was in 1978 and 1979 when it attracted performers like Jimmy Buffet, Mike Cross and Bruce Street. But any major campus event cannot be tackled alone. It needs support from all areas and student government if it is to be a success.

The Springfest '84 committee has contacts with bands like R.E.M., Squeeze (yes, they are back together) and various others. A concert of this size will work to bring the whole campus together for a day of great music. And since it is possible that Springfest will be the only major concert on campus this spring, the Residence Hall Association has already come out with a \$500 donation to help in financing. In addition, Ehringhaus Residence College has made a \$200 contribution to help Springfest '84 get the bands we would like to see.

I would personally like to extend a challenge to the other areas to match our offer. Ehringhaus Residence College supports Springfest '84 and wants to see it be a concert that will have the whole campus ROCKIN'!

In the fall of 1983, if you wanted to know what was happening on campus you had two options. Either you could see it in the Daily Tar Heel or hear it on WXYC, but not by any stretch of the imagination could both be done simultaneously. People began to notice that something was missing at UNC. Something that other universities, such as Duke, already had. That something was a student television station.

One weekend that October, eight motivated students borrowed a video camera and set out to show what could be done with the concept. Their immediate goal was to produce a thirty minute, magazine-type program focusing on events such as the Ackland's 25th anniversary, the Campus Y's "Big Buddy" program, and Carolina's first male Homecoming Queen, "Yure Nmomma." During the filming of these segments when curious passerbys asked "What channel will this be seen on?", they were surprised with the response, "STV, Channel 11. It's gonna be big!"

Drawn solely by word of mouth, large crowds gathered around Chapel Hill television sets to watch the pilot show. As the crowds laughed, applauded and were obviously entertained, the eight originators realized how much they wanted to do it again. But the equipment loan had been a one-shot deal so these students had to find alternative means of acquiring the necessary equipment. The idea of purchasing equipment was suggested to the Union, the CGC and Administration. All three agreed that purchasing equipment was a great idea, however, they each felt that the other should be responsible for obtaining such funding. By Christmas the group had no money and no equipment, but now had been officially recognized as "Student Television for UNC-CH." The original eight-member group had by now expanded to a very psyched group of thirty.

By mid January, they had organized a joint venture with Duke's well established student station, a late-night show taped in Chapel Hill. Sam Perkins, Michael Jordan, and Johnny Dawkins were excited about being on, as were the three girls who had posed in Playboy's "Girls of the ACC." President Friday, Chancellor Fordham, Terry Sanford, Woody Durham, and Dean Smith all accepted invitations to join students in the Village Cable studio audience. It was going to be the biggest thing to come out of Chapel Hill in a long time, had it not snowed. This caused the postponement that cost the show some of its best guests. But the final product, now the result of student imagination rather than glamorous personalities, did the trick. The next day, February 14, 1984, U.N.C. students proved their faith in the ideas behind STV. They voted 4 to 1 to start their own station and the rest is . . . on the air.

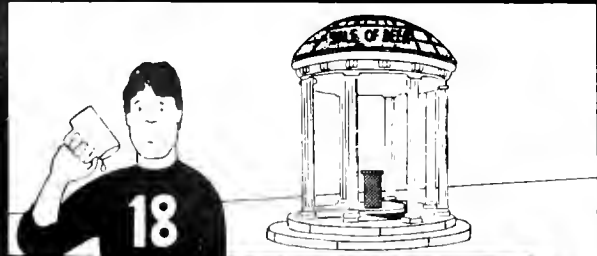

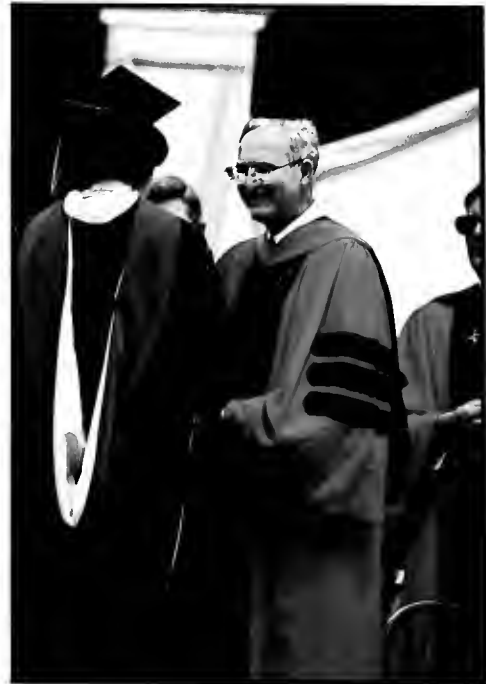

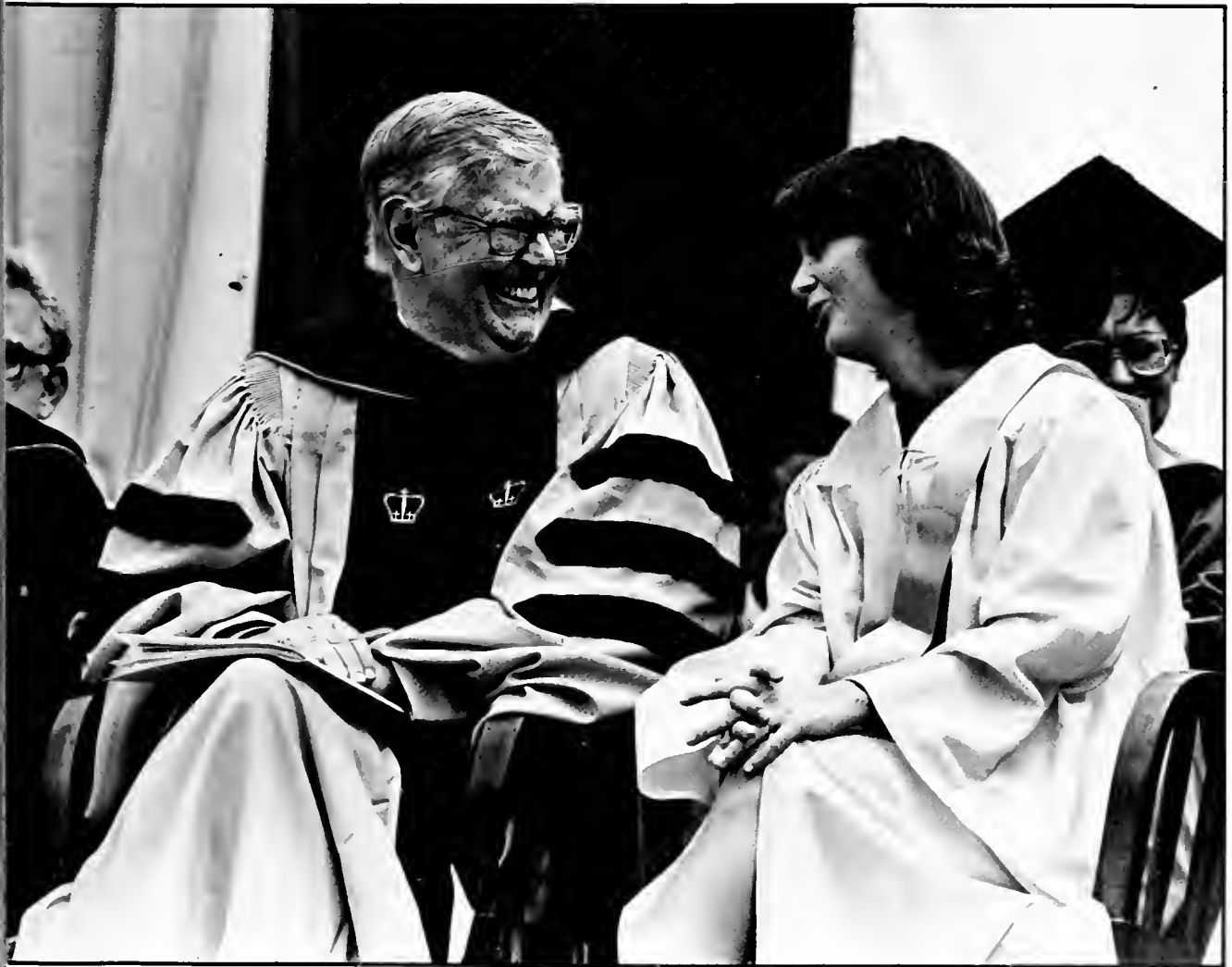
