
To that man the YAMACRAW is dedicated.

Staff members are: Clare Isanhour, Bob Snow, Alice Callaway, Jewel Fisher, Diane Himmer, Alice Gore, Shirley Sanders, Dick Stoller, Dick Griffiths, Boh Owens, Jack Fisher, and George Scott. Dr. J. J. Brooks is now Faculty Advisor.

Unquestionably The Stormy Petrel is well-named. It has ridden through many storms in the past two years and the majority have been financial. There were occasions when the storm clouds were very dark and things looked hopeless, but The Stormy Petrel, the only bird that can fly in the face of a storm, made a successful flight, ending the school year in the black.
