



PREFAGE.

HE Town of Yarmouth, as comprised within the limits recognized in the following Directory, is second only to the city of Halifax, in Nova Scotia, in population; and it probably holds the same relative position in the aggregate wealth of its population. By a careful calculation made by the compiler of this Directory, that pepulation is computed at-in round numbers-8000 souls. A large proportion of the property owned in the place consists of shipping. Indeed, the port and town of Yarmouth, in proportion to its population, owns more shipping tonnage than any other port in the Dominion of Canada. 1st day of January, 1890, its shipping amounted, in the aggregate, to 103,125 tons. Of late years, Yarmouth has become somewhat noted for the enterprise and activity displayed in the development of its manufacturing indus-Of this, ample evidence may be gathered from the following pages. Its trade is brisk, healthy, and growing, as the following table, compiled from official returns, will show:

It will thus be seen that the aggregate trade of Yarmouth for six years amounted to \$7,029,423, or (excepting the three capital cities) greater by over a million dollars than that of any other port in the maritime provinces.

Yarmouth has direct steam communication, every comfort and facility ensured, with Boston, U.S., with St. John, N.B, with Halifax and the intermediate ports, and with ports in Digby County. In the course of the current year (1890), it will be in unbroken communication by railway with Halifax, and thus will be connected with the great railway system, not only of Canada, but of all North America.

Yarmouth contains 13 places of public worship, viz.:—2 Church of England, 2 Roman Catholic, 3 Close Communion Baptist, 1 Free Will Baptist, 2 Wesleyan Methodist, 1 Presbyterian, 1 Congregationalist, and 1 African Methodist Episcopal. The educational interests of its youth are looked after by a County Academy, and 4 large section schools, besides several private schools.

Yarmouth is prettily situated upon gently undulating ground, slightly elevated above the tidal waters of its harbor. Its buildings, although mainly constructed of wood, are, for the most part, of a substantial character; and its dwellings, in the greater number of instances, betoken a degree of thrift and good taste, in the dwellers, which enable Yarmouth to compare more than favorably with other Canadian towns of equal population.
