Year after year our sports program increases, with more participants and more variety. The College provides equal opportunity for both male and female students.

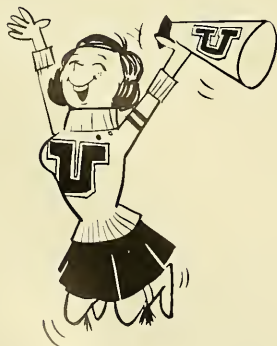
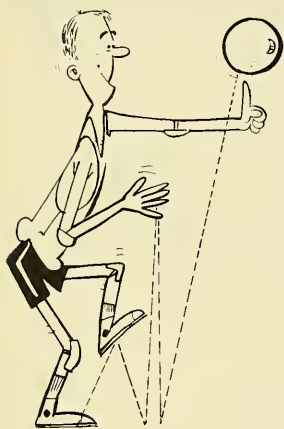
Four C's excels in basketball, and has proven over and over again, that despite the limited size of our college we are not limited in ability.
