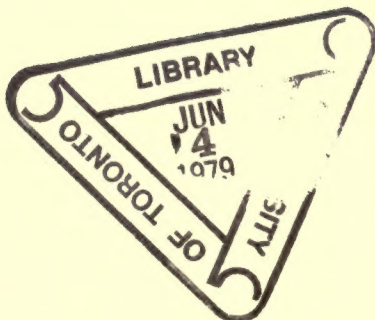

“A WAR MEMORIAL”

An American city of about twenty-five thousand inhabitants wishes to commemorate permanently the fact that twenty of her sons lost their lives in the Great War and that one of them distinguished himself by an act of personal bravery worthy to place his name beside those of the heroes of the Civil and Revolutionary Wars.

Space for this purpose has been found at the end of the vestibule or entrance hall of the contemplated municipal building.

This vestibule is to be twenty-five feet long by twelve feet wide and cannot exceed eighteen feet in height. The memorial is to consist of the decorative treatment of the wall at one end of this room. It should characterize the distinguished hero and should depict the nature of the action which won him fame. The names of all the twenty who gave their lives are to be incorporated, together with whatever inscriptions may be found necessary and appropriate.

No portion of the work should project more than two feet from the face of the wall.

Models to be submitted $\frac{1}{4}$ " full size.

The special prize for Sculpture will be awarded on the sculpture element in this collaboration.

Models to be delivered at 215 West 57th Street, January 15th, 1920.

THE HELEN FOSTER BARNETT PRIZE

The Helen Foster Barnett Prize for Sculpture, award \$50.00, limited to statuettes, including any work under life size. Artists under 35 years of age only eligible and the prize shall not be awarded more than once to the same artist.

CONDITIONS GOVERNING THE COMPETITION

1. The competition will be governed by the General Rules Governing Competitions, and will be conducted, and the awards made, by the Committee on Competitions and Awards of the Architectural League, who will constitute the jury.
2. No award will be made unless the work is of a quality that, in the judgment of the Committee, justifies it.
3. The premiated designs, and any others of sufficient merit submitted, will be exhibited at the Annual Exhibition, and the competitors in submitting their work will do so on the condition that such designs as are selected will be left until the end of the Exhibition.
4. Those which are not so selected are to be removed by the competitors on receipt of notice to that effect, and will be destroyed if not removed within time specified.
5. Those which are exhibited will be handled in accordance with the terms of the League Exhibition, except that Models not removed within time specified on notice will be destroyed.
6. If the work of any of the contestants be challenged as being not essentially their own work the contestant so challenged and the challenger will be given a hearing before the Committee on Competitions and Awards, and if the charge be proven to the satisfaction of the Committee, such contestants shall become ineligible for any of the awards.

Models in packing boxes will not be received.

Each model must be distinguished by a cipher. A plain sealed envelope bearing the cipher, containing full name and address of author or authors of the work in competition, addressed to the Committee on Competitions and Awards, must accompany each model.

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IN ARCHITECTURE, PAINTING AND SCULPTURE

The League established in 1909 a medal in Painting, in 1909 a medal in Sculpture, in 1915 a medal in Architecture and in 1919 a medal in Landscape Architecture and offers these medals annually. They are intended to encourage the submission of works of merit, to raise thereby the standard of the League's exhibition and shall therefore be given only in recognition of superiority in work actually submitted and placed. Recipients of these medals and of that formerly presented by the New York Chapter of the American Institute of Architects are *hors concours*.

Works in Architecture and Landscape Architecture to be eligible for an award must be adequately presented by means of drawings, photographs or models of executed work. The jury may request the submission of such additional data on the same work as may assist them in making the award.

The jury may invite the submission of such works in the four arts as they may desire to consider for an award.

If, in the opinion of the Jury, the work submitted in either Architecture, Painting, Sculpture or Landscape Architecture is not of sufficient merit to justify an award, no award shall be made.

The Jury of Award shall be thirteen in number, of which the President of the League shall be *ex officio* Chairman. The Executive Committee shall appoint three Architects, three Painters and three Sculptors and three Landscape Architects from nominations made by the New York Chapter of the American Institute of Architects, the Society of Mural Painters, the National Sculpture Society and the American Society of Landscape Architects, respectively. These appointments to be made in the month of October preceding the exhibition. All members of the Jury of Award shall be *hors concours* for the awards made by such jury. The deliberations of the Jury shall be strictly private, and its decisions shall be reported to the Executive Committee of the League before the exhibition is opened to the public.

In case the Medal in either of the four arts is awarded to two or more joint authors of a work, a copy shall be struck for each.

A Medal shall be accompanied by a certificate setting forth the name of the completed work which formed the basis of the award, together with the considerations which, in the opinion of the Jury, characterize the work as worthy of this distinction.

The Medal of Honor presented by the New York Chapter of the American Institute of Architects to designers of buildings represented in the exhibition of the Architectural League was discontinued in 1915. This medal was awarded as follows:

AMERICAN ACADEMY IN ROME

1. THE AMERICAN ACADEMY IN ROME is an institution established by law and incorporated by the Government of the United States.
2. The seat of the ACADEMY is at Rome, the art center of the world, with American Headquarters at 101 Park Avenue, New York City.
3. The academic course is post-graduate.
4. Residence of the Fellows is required for a period of three years, except during a term each year, when they are required to travel, and during the summer vacation of their second year, when they may visit America.
5. The direct and intimate influences of the world's masterpieces which surround the student in Rome will prove of incalculable advantage in the creation of the future art of America. The far-reaching benefits that have resulted to France, Germany, Spain and other nations through the establishment of Schools of Art in Rome justify the conviction that like or greater benefits will be secured to the United States through the foundation of a similar national institution.

ORIGIN AND DEVELOPMENT

A number of artists who had been engaged together upon the work of the World's Fair at Chicago established in 1894 "The American School of Architecture in Rome." Their object was to enable American students of architecture who had passed with honor through leading technical schools, or who had been equally qualified by private instruction, to develop their powers more fully, under the most favorable conditions of direction and environment. The students of the school were selected by competition, and the school was wholly supported by the artists referred to and their personal friends.

The rapid improvement in the work of the students and their enthusiasm convinced those who were interested that the scope of the school should be made broader, and should include the allied arts of sculpture and painting. To this end representative sculptors, painters and architects, together with other persons interested in the subject, decided in 1897 to found, on the lines of the French Academy in Rome, a school which should be opened to American students of sculpture, painting and music, as well as architecture.

In pursuance of this design the AMERICAN ACADEMY IN ROME was incorporated under the laws of the State of New York, in June, 1897. A constitution was then adopted and suitable rules made for the government of the institution. All these steps were taken under advice of competent legal counsel. In 1901 Hon. John Hay, the Secretary of State of the United States, authorized the Ambassador at Rome to accept the position of trustee *ex officio* of the ACADEMY, and directed him to secure for it "all the privileges and exemptions that are accorded by the Italian government to like institutions of other countries."

The ACADEMY has recently effected a consolidation with the American School of Classical Studies, and the combined institutions, under the title of the AMERICAN ACADEMY IN ROME, are now housed in new quarters upon a superb site on the Janiculum, overlooking all of Rome.

This great enlargement of the scope of the ACADEMY'S work is destined to be of the first advantage to its Fellows, through the intimate association of those engaged in the study of the Fine Arts with the students of Classical History.

Commencing in 1915 a Fellowship in Landscape Architecture will be awarded every third year.

OBJECTS OF THE ACADEMY

To afford exceptional advantages to a few chosen scholars is not the chief end of the ACADEMY, but is rather the means to that end, which is to help to raise the standard of art education in the United States. In the same way that the great national competition in France for the *Grand Prix de Rome* has made the *Ecole des Beaux Arts* in Paris the first art school of the world; so, it is believed, will the national competitions instituted by the AMERICAN ACADEMY in Rome increase the efficiency of the universities and art schools of America.

One of the great advantages offered by the ACADEMY in Rome is that, for the first time, American students in architecture, painting, sculpture and landscape architecture are brought together under the same roof, in constant intercourse with each other, enjoying that union and intelligent cooperation of the arts which in the end produce the highest results. Here they are enabled to work together, surrounded by monuments of architecture and sculpture, unrivaled paintings and galleries filled with masterpieces of every epoch. No other city in the world presents so wide a field of study or one so filled with the best precedents.

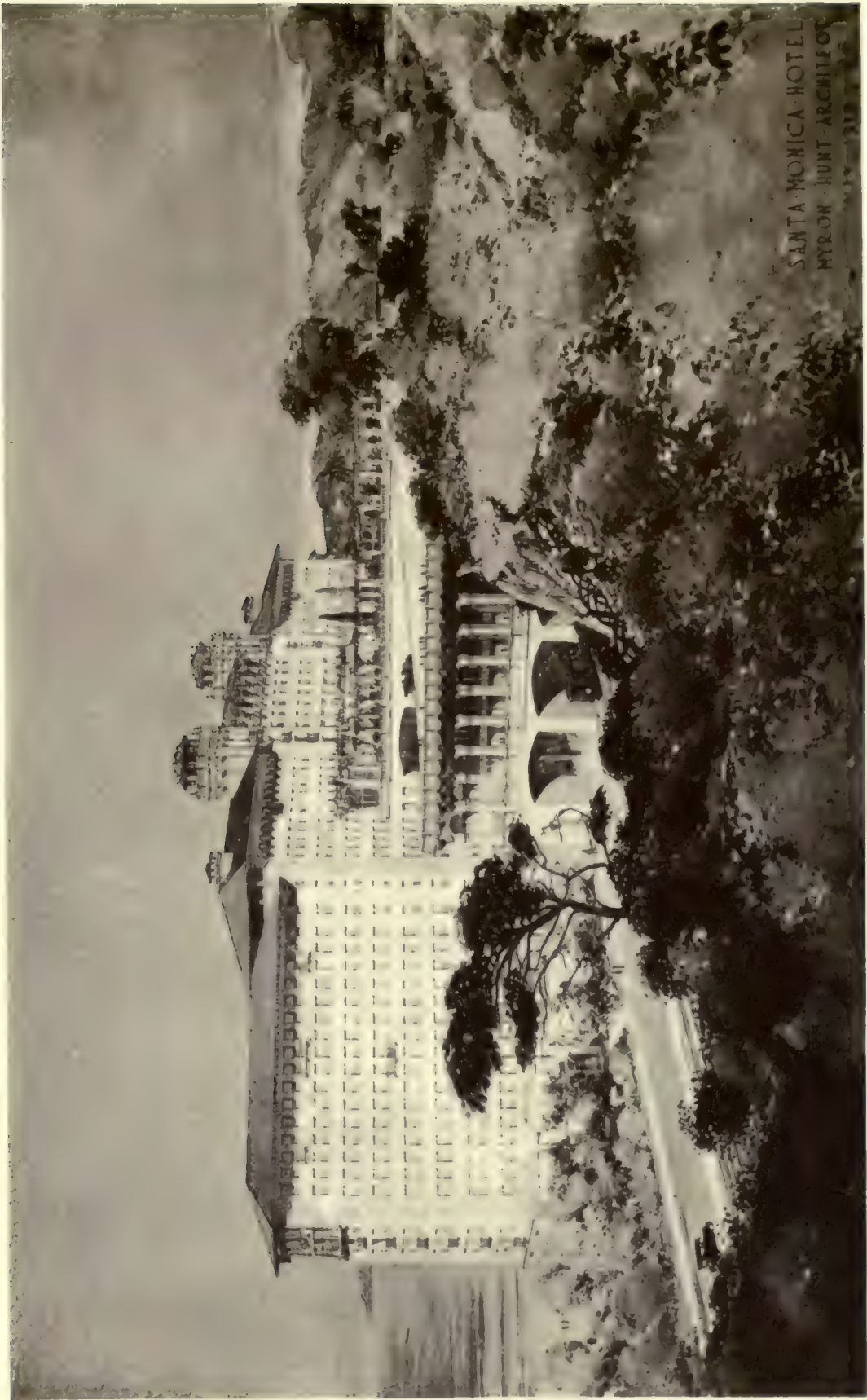

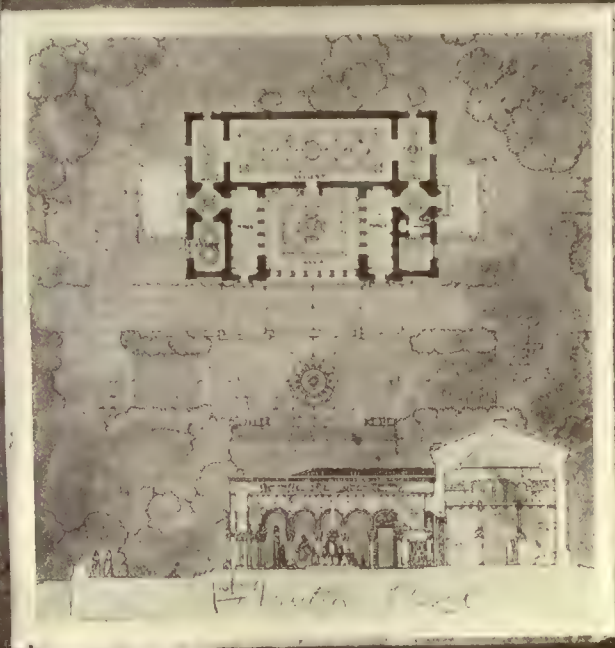


AN EXTERIOR STAIRCASE IN THE STYLE OF FRANCIS I, CLASS A & B,

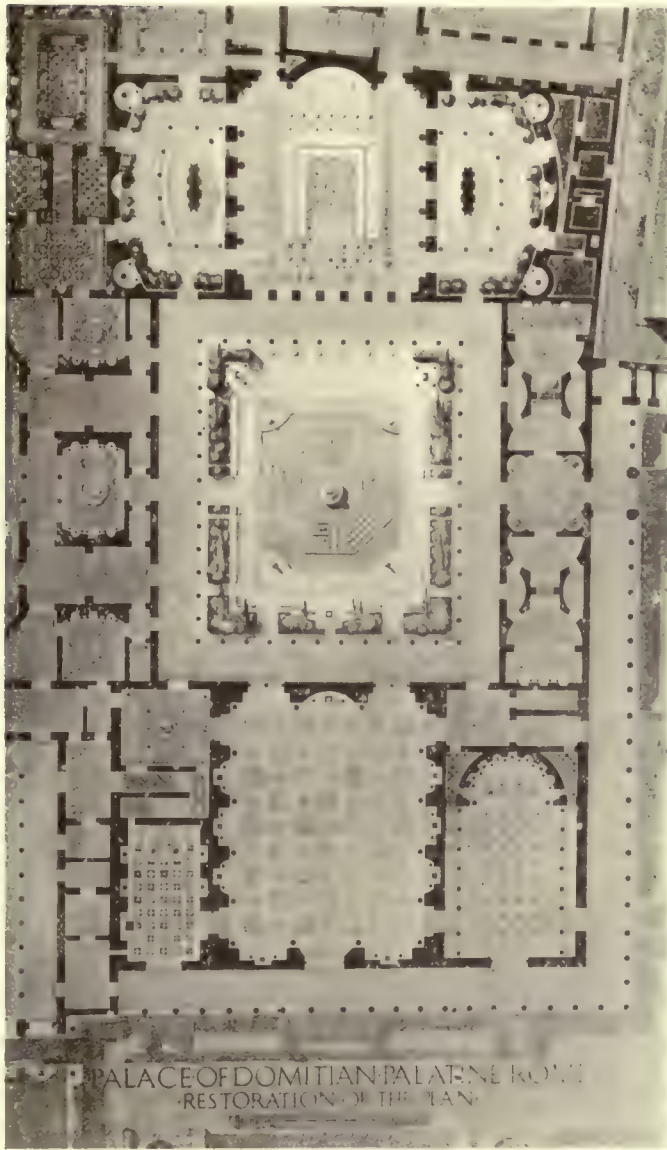
