ANNUAL MEETING—"Illinois Day."

"Not without thy wondrous story,
Illinois! Illinois!
Can be writ the nation's glory,
Illinois! Illinois!"

The annual meeting for the election of officers is held on December 3d, the anniversary of the admission of Illinois into the Union.

Meetings of the Society are held on the second Thursday evening of each month from October to June at six o'clock, an informal dinner preceding the business meeting, which is followed by an address on some patriotic theme.

All members are cordially invited to attend these meetings without further notice.

SONS OF THE REVOLUTION

The Society of the Sons of the Revolution was instituted in the State of New York, on the anniversary of the birthday of Washington, February 22, 1876, and reorganized on the present basis December 4, 1883.

Following New York, similar societies were formed in several states, and, finally a national organization was perfected April 19, 1890, under the name of "The General Society of the Sons of the Revolution," with headquarters in New York City. The General Society embraces the various State organizations, and the objects, government, work and requirements for all the societies are the same. The Society is now well established by State organizations in most of the Eastern and many of the Western States, and is rapidly growing.

The necessity for and the purposes of the Sons of the Revolution are thus stated in the constitution of the General Society:

"It has become evident from the decline of proper celebration of such national holidays as the Fourth of July, Washington's Birthday and the like, that proper interest in the events and men of the War of the Revolution is less than in the earlier days of the republic." It attributes this failing interest "not so much to the lapse of time as to the neglect on the part of descendants of Revolutionary heroes to perform their duty of keeping before the public mind the memory of the services of their ancestors, and of the times in which they lived, of the principles for which they contended."

THE ILLINOIS SOCIETY.

The Illinois Society was organized at the Auditorium Hotel, Chicago, February 22, 1894, by Robert Patterson Benedict, James Frank Kelley, John Crocker Foote, John Whipple Hill, Henry Walbridge Dudley, Thomas Floyd-Jones, Fred Albert Foote, Arthur Leffingwell, Rev. Walter Delafield, Rt. Rev. Charles Reuben Hale, Alexander Ramsay Thompson, Daniel Elisha Foote, Edward Frothingham Wyman, Homer Wise, Orrington Lunt Comings, Frank Rhees Seelye, Rt. Rev. William Edward McLaren, and Richard Hoppin Wyman.

OBJECTS.

The objects of the society are stated, as follows, in the preamble to the Constitution:

"To perpetuate the memory of men who, in military, naval or civil service, by their acts or counsel, achieved American Independence; to promote and assist in the proper celebration of the anniversaries of Washington's Birthday, the battles of Lexington and Bunker Hill, the Fourth of July, the Capitulations of Saratoga and Yorktown, the Evacuation of New York by the British Army, as a relinquishment of territorial sovereignty, and other prominent events related to or connected with the War of the Revolution; to collect and secure for preservation the manuscript rolls, records and other documents and memorials relating to that war; to inspire among the members and their descendants the patriotic spirit of their forefathers; to inculcate in the community in general, sentiments of Nationality and respect for the principles for which the patriots of the Revolution contended; to assist in the commemorative celebration of other great historical events of National importance, and to promote social intercourse and the feeling of fellowship among its members."

OUR CREED

"We believe that the liberties which the heroes of old won with blood and sacrifice are ours to keep with labor and service.

'All that our fathers wrought
With true prophetic thought
Must be defended.'

No privilege that encroaches upon those liberties is to be endured. No lawless disorder that imperils them is to be sanctioned. No class that disregards them is to be tolerated. There is a battle that is worth fighting now, as it was worth fighting then, and that is for justice and equality. To make our City and State free in fact as well as in name; to cleanse so far as in our power lies, the fountains of our National life from political, commercial and social corruption; to teach our sons and daughters, by precept and example, the honor of serving such a country as America—that is a work worthy of the finest manhood and womanhood. The well born are those who are born to do that work. The well bred are those who are bred to be proud of that work. The well educated are those who see deepest into the meaning and the necessity of that work."
