PREFACE

It is hoped that this "Synagogue Hymnal for Sabbaths and Festivals," like the smaller "Synagogue Hymnal for Sabbath Services" which we issued previously, will fill a long-felt want in our congregational life. For years, it has been felt by the spiritual leaders of American Israel, that the salvation of the Synagogue depends upon the introduction of a large amount of congregational singing, such as has been used for centuries in the Portugese or Sephardi ritual. For, congregational singing alone combines the decorum and impressiveness of a modern house of worship with the enthusiasm and religious fervor of the olden synagogues. And yet, no attempt has hitherto been made to make congregational singing, or chanting, in the Ashkenazi or German ritual possible, by the publication of a hymnal, at popular prices, which should enable every congregation to place in the hands of all its worshipers, a book containing the usual tunes connected with the traditional ritual. The need of such a book came to me with special force, when I organized a Junior Congregation for the young men and women of our district. We wanted the young people to chant the larger part of the service, as we knew that this is the only way in which the services could be rendered attractive and acceptable to them. Yet there was not a single book we could put in their hands which fulfilled this purpose adequately. We therefore issued a small synagogue hymnal suitable almost exclusively for the Friday night services which were in their charge.

But, as I indicated in the preface to that small hymnal, we felt that a much larger and fuller book was needed, one that could be used for all the services of the year. We also consulted the prominent orthodox and conservative rabbis of the country, men like rabbi Mendes and rabbi Drachman of New York, and rabbi Hoffman of Newark, New Jersey, as well as all the rabbis of Boston. They cordially endorsed the movement for the production of such a work.

We accordingly requested the cantor of our congregation, Rev. M. Halpern, to adopt the hymn-book, which he was intending to publish, to congregational singing, for use by children and juniors as well as by seniors. I have supervised the collection of the English hymns, contained in this book, and have seen to their fitness, from a religious and literary standpoint, for use in our synagogues and religious schools.

We now desire to place before the Jewish Community this complete Synagogue Hymnal, which contains not only music for congregational singing at sabbath and festival services, but also hymns for religious schools, for memorial services, and Zionist and American national hymns. We hope that in time all the Jewish congregations of the English speaking world will recognize the need of such a book, in order to intensify the inspiring character of their services, and will adopt it for their use, so that the Synagogue will regain its former glory, as the vitalizing religious center of Jewish life.

FOREWORD

With feelings of gratitude to the Almighty for having enabled me to carry out a project which for years has been on my mind, I offer this book to the public. Through my long experience as cantor, especially for the congregation with which I am now and have been for many years connected, I have come to the conclusion that the cantor can do his most effective work for the welfare of the Synagogue, by chanting a large part of the service not only with the help of his choir, but with the participation of all the worshipers. At the suggestion of the rabbi of our congregation, Rev. Dr. P. Israeli, who fully concurred with this idea, and with the aid of his valuable advice, I arranged the small "Synagogue Hymnal for Sabbath and Friday Night Services." After seeing the wonderful success which the small book had, in bringing the young people to the synagogue, and impressing them with the beauty of the Jewish traditional service, our rabbi suggested that the hymn-book, which I had been planning for years for the use of cantor and choir, should be adapted also to congregational singing, and I have accordingly arranged the present larger synagogue hymnal.

The book contains the traditional melodies of the Jewish ritual for the whole year, arranged in such simple form that they can be sung by the entire congregation, as well as played on the piano at home, as for instance, Kol Nidrei, Kaddish, Abodah, the Priestly Blessing, etc. I want to call special attention to the Sabbath Mincha Services, which have been rendered very impressively in our synagogue for several years. There are also included the Blessings before and after the Prophetic Portion, and musical renderings of important prayers to be sung by the cantor. Many of the melodies are adopted from the works of Sulzer and Lewandowski, etc., while the greater part of them have been composed by myself to such purpose that, while being traditional in character, they should be at the same time very simple and tuneful.

I hope that my colleagues, the cantors, will find this book a strong aid in their efforts to make the services more effective and more interesting to their congregations, than has been the case in the past. I also want to express my heartfelt thanks to the Boston Music Co., for their kindness in helping me to carry out my project.
