TO THE MEMBERS OF THE CLASS OF 'NINETY-EIGHT

I HEREWITH respectfully submit the first report of the Class, and trust that it will meet with your approval. My one regret is that I have been unable to give all the time and personal supervision to its preparation that I desired to give, but this unfortunately, and in all probability, is a predicament in which a great many of the Secretaries of future Classes will find themselves.
