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THIRTEEN-PERIOD CALENDAR FOR 1937

For a number of years the practice of dividing the year into 13 periods of 4 weeks each has been gaining favor in business. Divided this way, any period is directly comparable to any other period.

The varying number of calendar days, working days, Saturdays, etc., in different months of the ordinary 12 month calendar often distorts seriously such vital statistics of business as sales, costs, production, payrolls, etc. For National Diary users who record such facts on a weekly or four weekly basis, the 1937 Official 13 period calendar is presented by courtesy of the International Fixed Calendar League, Rochester, N. Y.
