We hear complaints of Nurserymen sending trade lists to parties not entitled to them. If our lists go to such parties, it is an error which we will thank rou to corrbet by advising us of parties name and address.

## For Your Information.

WE WOULD SUGGEST that parties with whom we have never had dealing, send us their orders in time for us to commminate with their referonces before they want stock shipped. We cannot accept orders from. such parties without eash in advance, satisfactory security or references, and we mention this to avoid any unnecessary delay on rush orders during the packing seuson.

HACH ORDER is handled separately. After lifting the trees are sent immediately to onr large cellar where they are GRADED AND BUNOHED UNDER COVER, exposurc is reduced to a minimum and customcrs may depend upon receiving stock fresh, sound and in perfeet condition.

T ELEGRAPllIC ORDERS usually filled same day they are received. Use Nurseryman's Telegraphic Code.

$S^{T}$TORAGE FACIIITIES. We lave here in IIuntsville a cold storage warehonse with a capreity of 20 carlonds and can hold stock here for bulk shipments in perfect condition until March 15th to 20th. Wa take particular pains in storing our trees, using moss all through the roots as we would in pucking eases, and customers are sure of recciving trees with their vitality unimpaired.

PaCKING. This important part of the lmsiness is under the personal supervision of Mr. K. O. Cmase. Many compliments from customers on onr method of packing reach us each season. It is as thoronglily done as possible and you may depend on the goods reaching yon in prime condition.

TT IS NOT our ambition to be a low-priced house, but we strive to grow stock that is FIRST-CLASS, TO GRADE ACCURATELS, to have the handling and packing as good AS THE BEST. We expect to sell on the market. We believe this is the way to hold your trade.

TEN, HUNDRED AND THOUSAND RATES. We make three rates to apply as follows: On orders for 50 trees and over (up to 300) WHEN NOT LIESS THAN TEN TREES OF A VARIETY, the IIundred rate will be charged. On orders for 300 trees and over WHEN NOT LESS THAN 10 TREES OF A VARHETY, the Thoosand rate will he charged. On all orders of less than 50 trees the Ten rate will be charged.

## Guarantee of Genuineness.

We exercise the greatest care to keep our varicties prise and true to name, and we hold ourselves in readiness at all times to rephace, on proper proof, all stoek that may prove otherwise, or refund the amount paid; but it is mutually agreed between the purehaser and ourselves that we shall not at any time be liable for any amount greater than the original price of the goods.

## Packing and Packing Cases.

Our packing season usually begrins October 1st, and continues through the winter until Mareh 1st.

The cost of eases seven and one-half to nine feet long, thirty inehes, is $\$ 2.50$; twenty-four inehes, $\$ 2.00$; eighteen inches, $\$ 1.50$. Bales, 25 eents to 75 cents. No eharge for draguge.

Bales cost a higher rate of freight; so, as far as possible, we ship in eases.

## Shipping.

Please state how goods must be sent; whether by freight or express ; also route. If no directions are given. we will ship as we think best serves eustomers' interests withont assuming responsibility. The risk and cost of transpartation belong ta purelaser.

## Grades.

We grade carefully ; in some cases by ealiper, others by height. When by both, the ealiper must govern. The lower number is ineluded, and the higher number exeluded. For instance, in a grade from four to five feet four feet trees are included, but five feet go into the next grade. If phump five feet trees are wanted, the order must be for five to six feet. When possible we prefer to send sumples to prospeetive eustomers.

## Qaution.

We aecept all orders upon the eondition that they shall be void should any injury befall the stoek from frost, hail, storm, fire, or other causes over which we have no control.

## Claims.

All elaims must be made immediately on receipt of goods, or they will not be allowed.

LTCime-lf possible, give us a few days notice before you want stock shipped. We will ship your goods on the day specified if possible.
