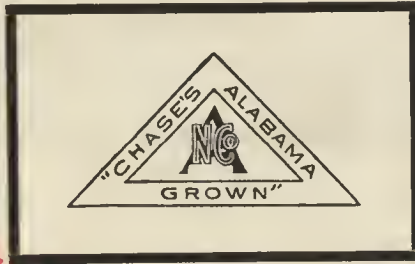
# BUDDING PREREQUISITES!

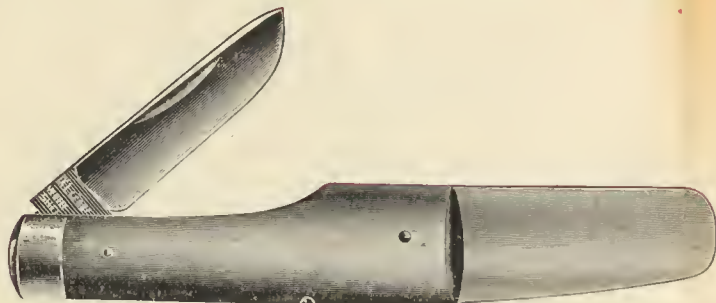
