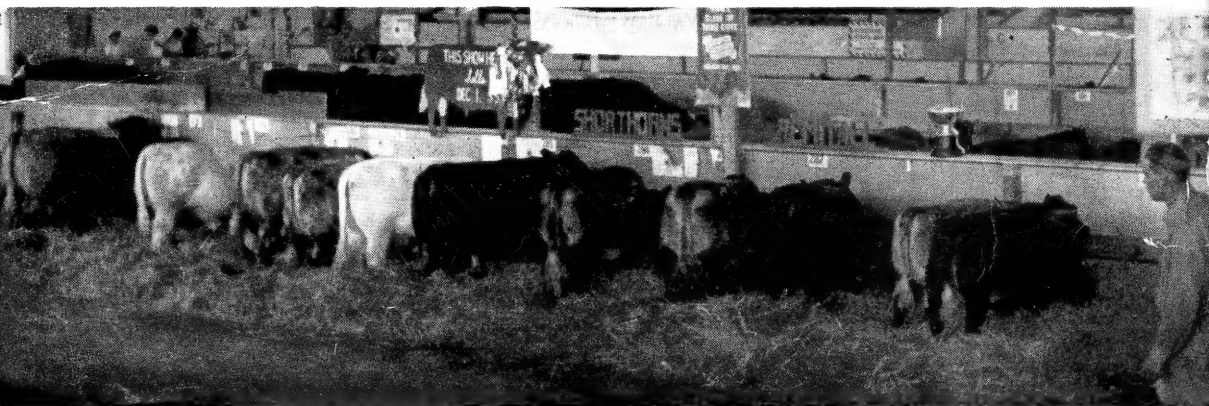

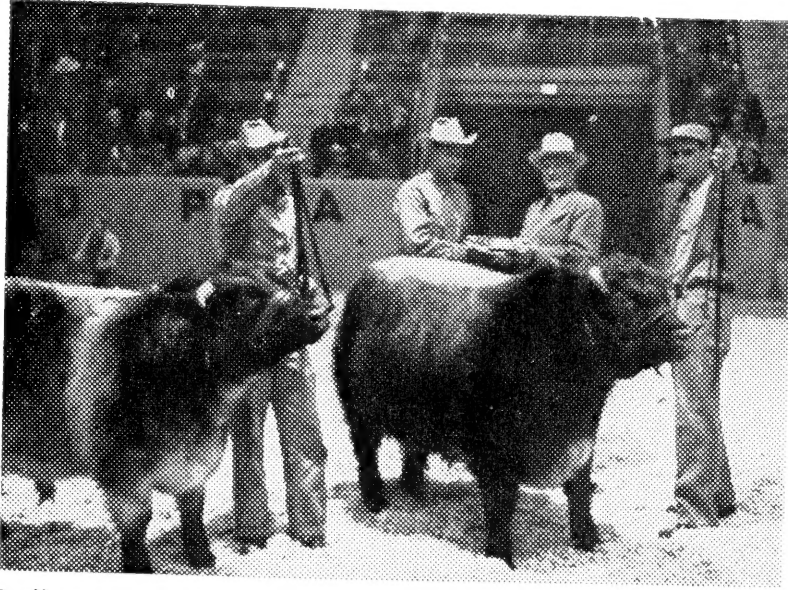

The bull on the left was reserve Jr. Champion at Calgary, Edmonton and Regina summer shows, second in the Range Bull class at Saskatoon International. This calf is now Herd Sire for E. F. Richardson and Son of Semans, Sask.

Friends and Fellow Breeders

This being our second annual sale, presented a new challenge to us and that is to better the offering of our first sale. This we think has been done and we welcome you to come and share this event with us.

This year the two Snyder Bros., Ady and Bill, have joined us. They were planning to be with us last year but due to the death of their father they had to postpone their union with us to this year. However this has given them time to make an even greater selection for the sale. They are presenting them right from the pasture in the truest of breeding form. As with us, they are concerned with the fixture of this sale, and are offering nothing but the best.

Mr. Abe Snyder formed this herd before the First World War, and if they weren't good breeding cattle they wouldn't, or their descendents would not, still be in the herd.

Rothney Admiral -303066-, Sire of most of their sale females, is a sire that made good cattle better. He is good to meet and to follow, with the best of quality and lines and extra good over the tail head. He was Grand Champion bull at Lacombe for A. R. Cross after he had used him liberally in the Rothney Herd.

Failaise Lad 17th was picked from the last Calgary Bull Sale, and is the service sire. This bull was an outstanding selection, and proved this by developing nicely and at the same time being used heavily.

The Hayard offering owned by N. D. Latimer and Sons (Marvin and Norval) will also be presented in naturally good condition. These cattle have a good future before them and also came from a herd that has been strictly culled down through the years, being one of the oldest herds in the province today.

Monarch's Beau V.A., the great old bull now going to his 12th birthday, is still the main spring and will be the sire or grandsire of their offering. No bull in Alberta has been more consistent (in color and quality) or in having more grandchildren performing faultlessly. His get stretch right across the continent. Nova Scotia champions were his grandchildren as were Ohio State Fair champions and as were champions at the Western State Fairs this year.

The best thing we know about Old Monarch is the kind of breeding matrons his daughters are. Have you tried to buy one from someone that owns them? Over 100 head of the Hayard herd has his daughters and sons.

Louis and Carroll Latimer's Remitall Portion are a slightly different proposition as they consist entirely of members of our show herd. They are all young cattle and have been brought along to present them to you to the very best of bloom and reasonable fit. They will just be back from a long trip to the Toronto Royal and from the Western States.

Marden Consort (Imp.) sired the major portion of our show herd. He has just completed his fifth summer with us and has done some very constructive work for the Shorthorn breed. He has shown that good shorthorns can be red, white or roan and that it takes all three to make shorthorns. Consort is not a sire of cattle that can't be beat but as a sire of every calf that is hard to beat. His son Remitall Frosty Consort was chosen to support him in our breeding program and his first calves can not be told from Consorts.

Calrossie Problem's first calves have arrived this year. His first heifer was shown at the summer fairs and won her share of Firsts and Seconds. One of his first sons was first at Red Deer and Olds. His calves are of good size, particularly good heads and strong backs.

Remitall Monarch's Climax was a breeding phenomenon for us and should continue for Howard Hymas & Son of Rosebud. One daughter was reserve junior and reserve grand champion female at Calgary and Edmonton, another was junior and reserve grand at the Oregon State Fair. We have retained a number of daughters for the herd and his last to be offered from here are in this sale.

The sale participants are giving a turkey away as a door prize to be drawn for at the conclusion of the sale.

Whether you need cattle or not we welcome you to our sale. We will be proud to have you and your friends and hope you will enjoy the day.

2. Each animal will be sold without reserve to the highest bidder.
3. Each animal will be at purchaser's risk as soon as sold, but will be cared for for a reasonable length of time, free of charge, and loaded on a car where shipped by freight.
4. Certificate of Registry transferred to the new owner will be furnished with each lot sold. Calves at foot will also be treated the same.
5. Terms of sale are cash unless other arrangements are made before sale.
6. All sale animal pictures are absolutely un-retouched, and are shown standing on the ground with no bedding.
7. Anyone purchasing females, that wish them left to be bred to the herd sires may do so. No service charge will be made. A small charge will be made for feed.
8. The Warranty is printed elsewhere in the catalogue.

The consignor will then be granted the privilege of a further period of four months to prove the female a breeder in his own premises before refunding the purchase price as full adjustment or make other settlement satisfactory to the purchaser.

(4) The consignor is not responsible for damage caused by foreign bodies after the animal is sold, inclusive of mummified calves, nor sickness not apparent at sale time.

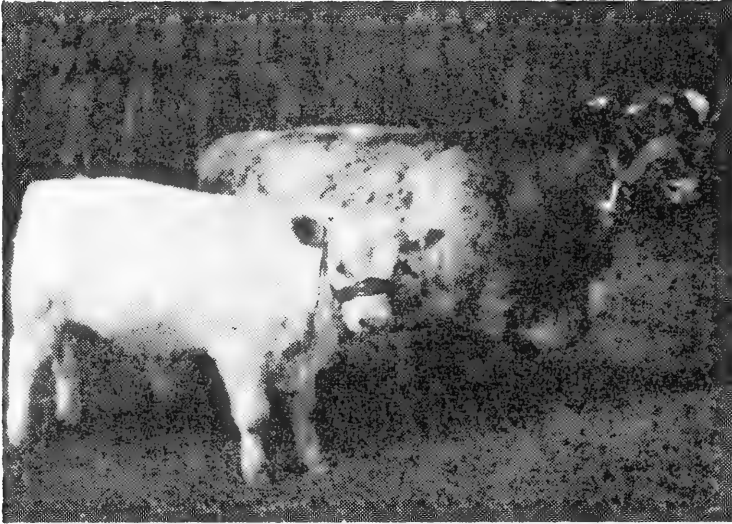

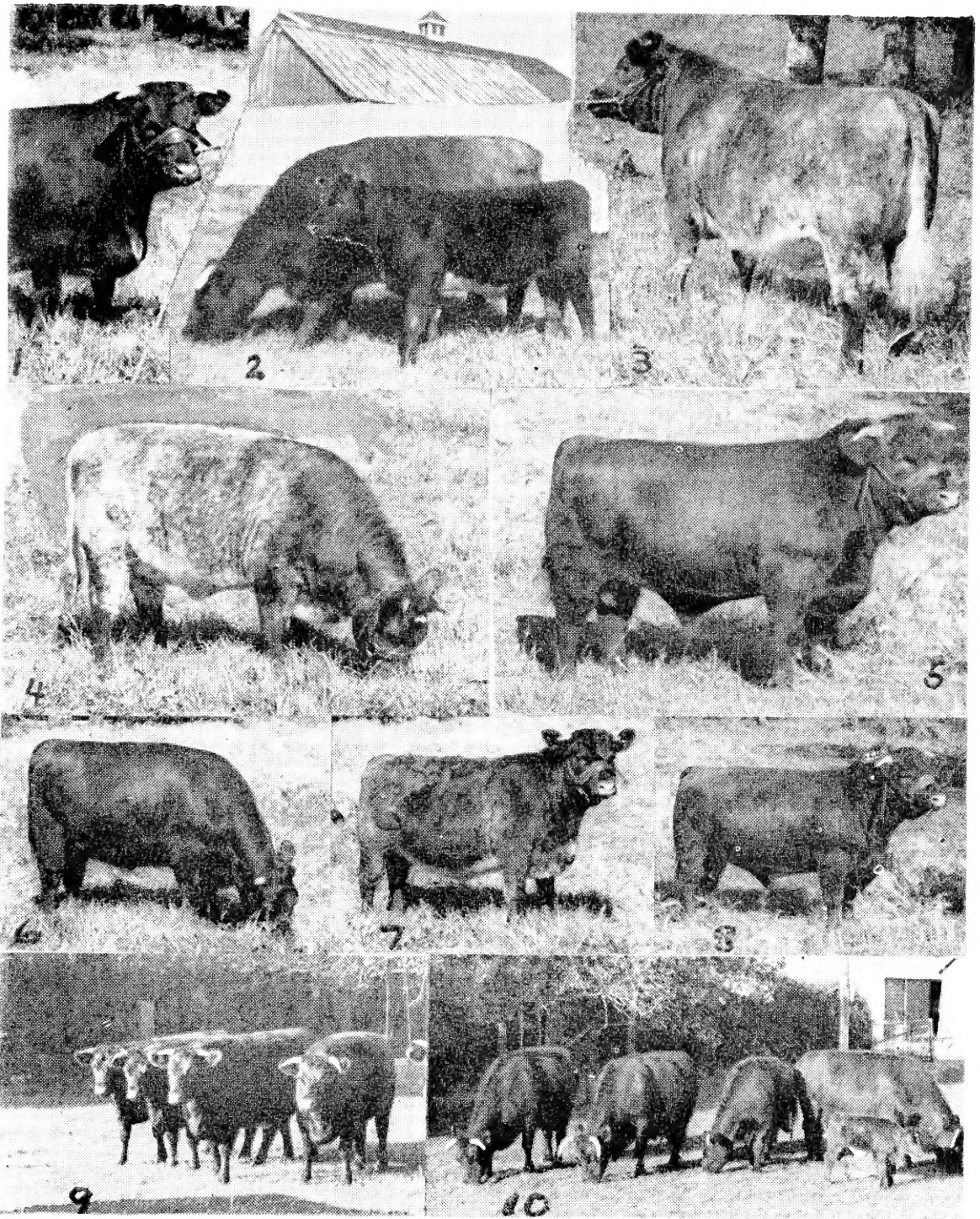
