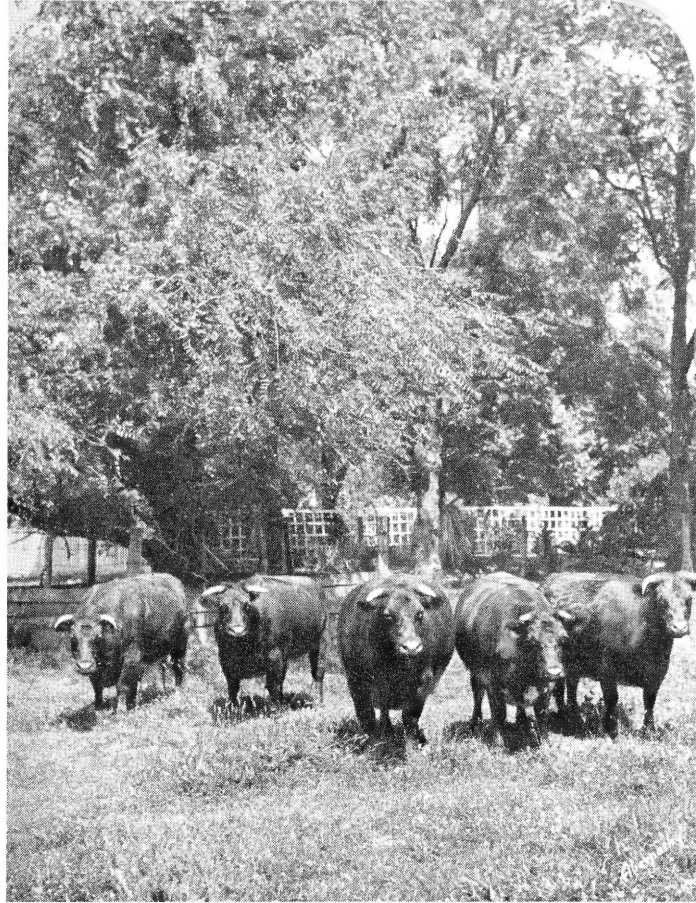

General Information

Time—12:00 o'clock noon, Eastern Standard Time on Monday, October 17, 1955.

Location—This sale will be held in the new heated sale pavilion at the Madison County fair Grounds, London, Ohio. London is 25 miles southwest of Columbus; 25 miles southeast of Springfield; and 45 miles east of Dayton. It is on Federal Highway 42 which is the main highway from Cincinnati to Cleveland. It is also on State Highway 38. Federal Highway 40 is only four miles north of London.

Transportation—London may be reached easily by automobile or bus on paved roads from every direction. It is on the main line of the New York Central Railroad running north and south from Cincinnati to Columbus and Cleveland. It is also on the main line of the Pennsylvania Railroad running from St. Louis to Columbus and Pittsburgh. The nearby cities of Columbus and Dayton are on main airlines and guests who travel by air will be met at these points if advance notice is provided.

Accommodations—The Shively and London Hotels are located in London, Ohio. There are also many excellent Tourist camps and motels in the immediate area. We will be glad to arrange hotel accommodations if you will let us know when you will arrive and the number in your party.

Lunch—A lunch will be served at the sale pavilion. Come early and allow yourself plenty of time for an inspection of the cattle.

Please note—Since this sale is to be held on Monday, we invite you to come a day early for a leisurely inspection of the herd. Greenwood Farm is only 15 miles from the sale pavilion and we will be glad to supply auto transportation for a Sunday tour if you will advise us.

PLEASE NOTE—On the front cover of this catalog appears a picture taken in the pasture at Greenwood in July of this year. The picture shows Greenwood Bombardier with a few of the brood cows. Aren't they thick and don't the heads indicate a wealth of character and good breeding? Good Shorthorns have been a part of the balanced farming program at Greenwood for over a century.

Terms and Conditions

GUARANTEE—All cattle in this sale will be sold under the standard guarantee endorsed by the American Shorthorn Breeders' Association. Certificates of registry and transfer will be furnished with each lot sold. Shipment will be made as soon as possible after the close of the sale without trouble to the purchasers, but cattle will be at buyers' risk as soon as bid off. Every precaution will be taken to see that animals arrive in sound and healthy condition. The Greenwood Herd is under Federal Supervision for Tuberculosis and calfhood vaccination for Bang's has been practiced for many years.

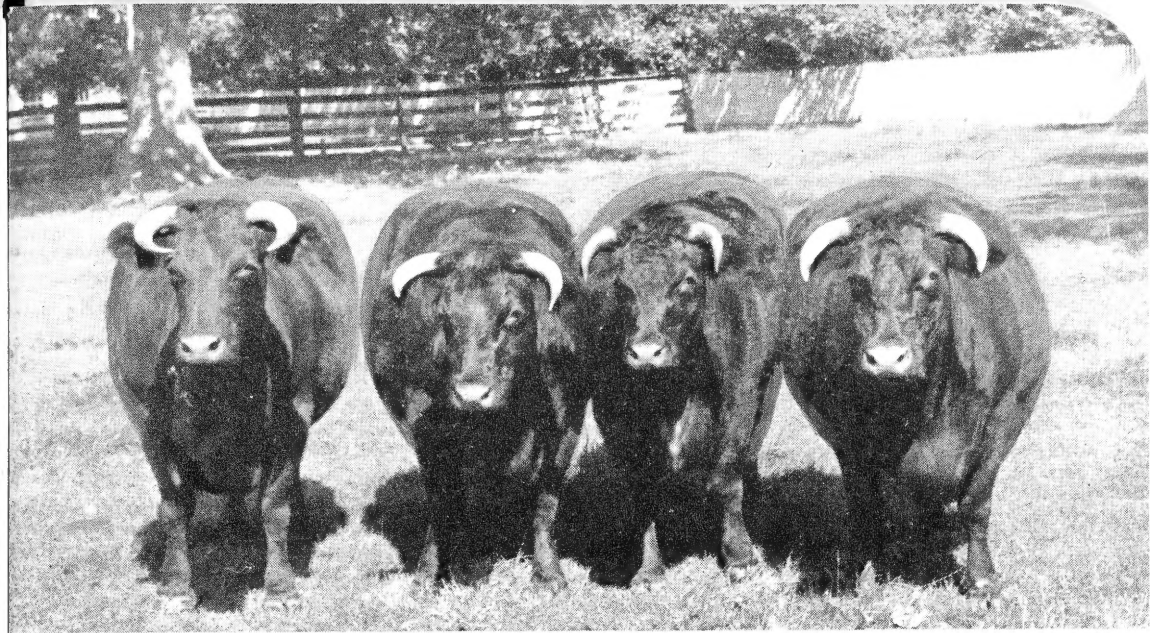
TERMS—The terms of this sale are cash unless arrangements are made in advance. All settlements must be made with the clerk of the sale immediately at the conclusion of the auction and before the animals are removed.

HEALTH—Every possible precaution is used to guard the health of Greenwood Shorthorns. All younger females in this sale have been calfhood vaccinated and the health certificates provided on sale day will be evidence of a clean health record. A 60-day Tuberculin retest will be allowed and those who buy in this sale may be sure that the cattle have complied with the rigid health requirements of the State of Ohio. Health certificates will be furnished with each lot sold.

Announcements from the auction box will take precedence over printed matter in the catalog.

LIABILITY—The above guarantee and terms shall constitute a contract between David S. Graham and the buyer of each lot. Neither the clerk of the sale, nor the individual designated as Sale Manager assume any liability, legal or otherwise. Where footnotes appear in this catalog they were furnished by the owners. 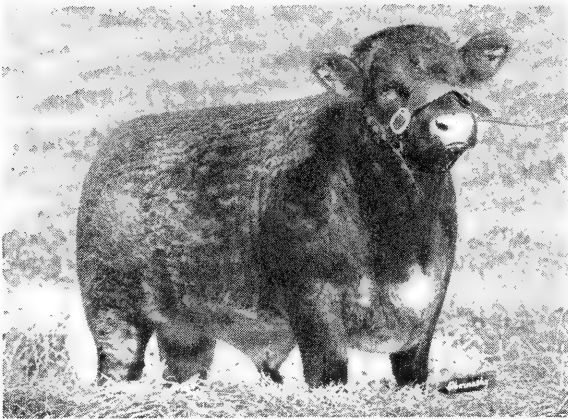
IMP. SCOTSDALE AUTOCRAT

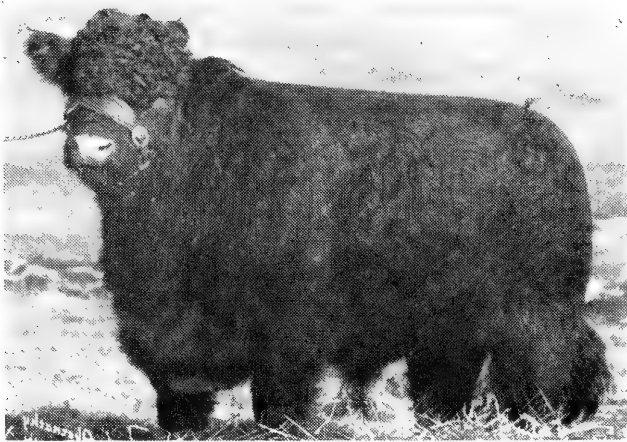
IMP. KIRKTON MONARCH

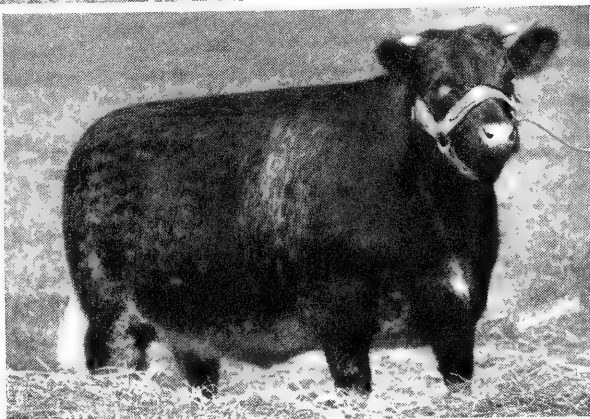

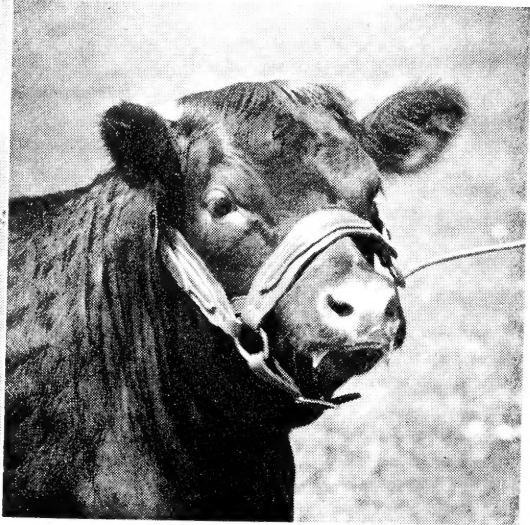
1. Proper care must be given by purchaser to protect breeding qualities and health of guaranteed animals.
2. All bulls are guaranteed breeders, provided they are not allowed to serve when under 14 months of age, or allowed to run with the herd when under 20 months of age. In case of failure of a bull to be a breeder, notice shall be given to the seller within six months of date of purchase, or by the time the bull is 20 months of age, if purchased under 14 months of age.
3. With the exception of heifers sold under 14 months of age, all females are guaranteed breeders. Heifers under two years of age shall not be served by a heavy or old bull. Cows or heifers sold as bred, or safe in calf, not proving to be in calf must be reported to the seller within three months after date of sale. Females over 14 months of age sold open, not settling within six months after date of sale, shall be promptly reported to the seller.
4. When an animal fails to comply with the above guarantee the seller has the option of substituting an animal of equal value to the satisfaction of the purchaser, or of having the animal returned for a trial for a period not to exceed six months. The expense of freight in such case is to be paid by the seller. If the animal is then proved to be a breeder beyond doubt it shall be returned to the purchaser at his expense. In case of dispute the return of the full purchase price, without interest, to the buyer will be considered full settlement and satisfaction of all claims. No charge for feed or maintenance shall be made by either buyer or seller. Salvage shall go to the seller. It shall be understood that the same guarantee given for the first animal shall likewise apply to any animal later substituted.
5. Certificates of registry and transfer will be furnished with each animal sold. A signed pedigree application for unborn calves will be furnished with bred females, showing names and record numbers of sire and dam, as well as service date.
6. Shipments will be made as soon as possible after the close of the sale, but at purchaser's risk of loss or injury after animal is bid off. Where cattle are sold at private treaty the above terms should apply as well as for sale at auction.

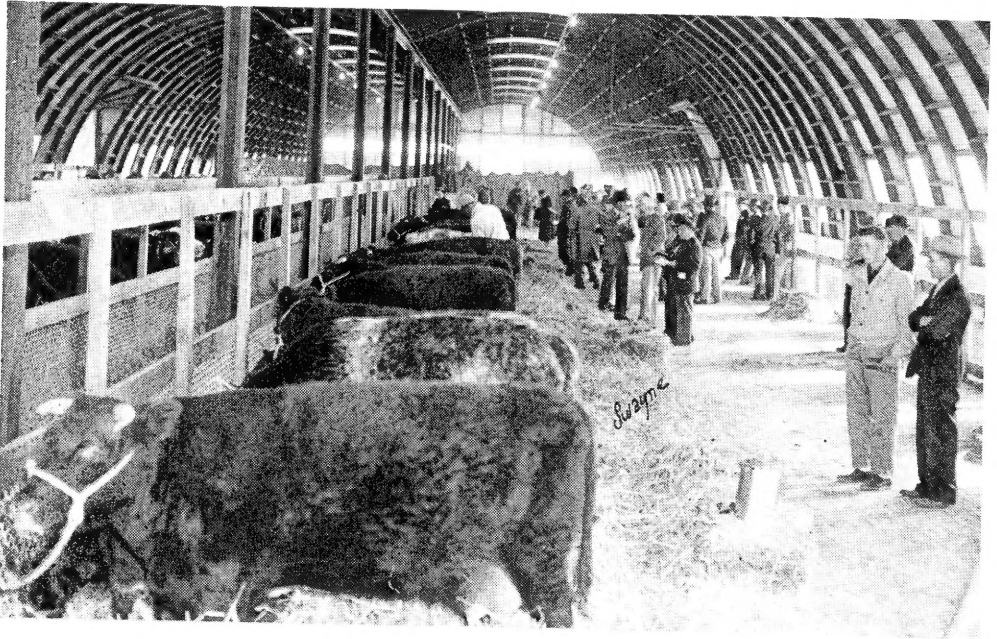
