

Fall planting is becoming more popular each season as experience shows its advantage. As soon as a tree or shrub becomes dormant it can be removed and change of location will affect it but little. When set out in the Fall the bruised roots begin at once to heal and callus is formed; recover quickly from moving; soon become firmly established and with the first touch of Spring are ready to go into business for themselves in a vigorous way.

Again, the ground is usually in better condition for planting in the Fall than in Spring, for much Spring planting is done when the ground is too wet for best results. Perhaps your Spring will be two or three weeks earlier. In this case your trees should be planted earlier than the dates you have oredred them shipped. If they have been planted in the Fall, these Spring delays are done away with.


