



Not hardy. Pot with crown protruding, using equal of rich fibrous loam, sand, and leaf mold. A warm temperature (70 degrees) is required or bulbs will rot. Insure good drainage by replacing gravel in bottom of the pot. Water sparingly until growth starts, then plenty of water should be given and care taken not to wet the leaves. An eastern exposure, well sheltered from strong wind and sun suits them. After blooming, withhold water to ripen the tubers, then store in sand for winter at 45 degrees.






