





The soil best adapted for the beet is a rich, deep loam. Sow in drills fifteen inches apart, one inch deep and thin to six inches. For early sow as soon as the ground can be worked in spring; for main and autumn use about the 5th of May. The mangel wurtzels are grown principally for feeding stock, and grow much larger than the table beet. Sow in Krills two feet apart and thin to fifteen inches in the row.





Cucumbers succeed best in warm, rich, loam ground. They should not be planted in open ground until settled warm weather. Plant in hills four feet apart each way. When all danger from insects is past, thin out, leaving only three or four of the strongest plants to the hill.


