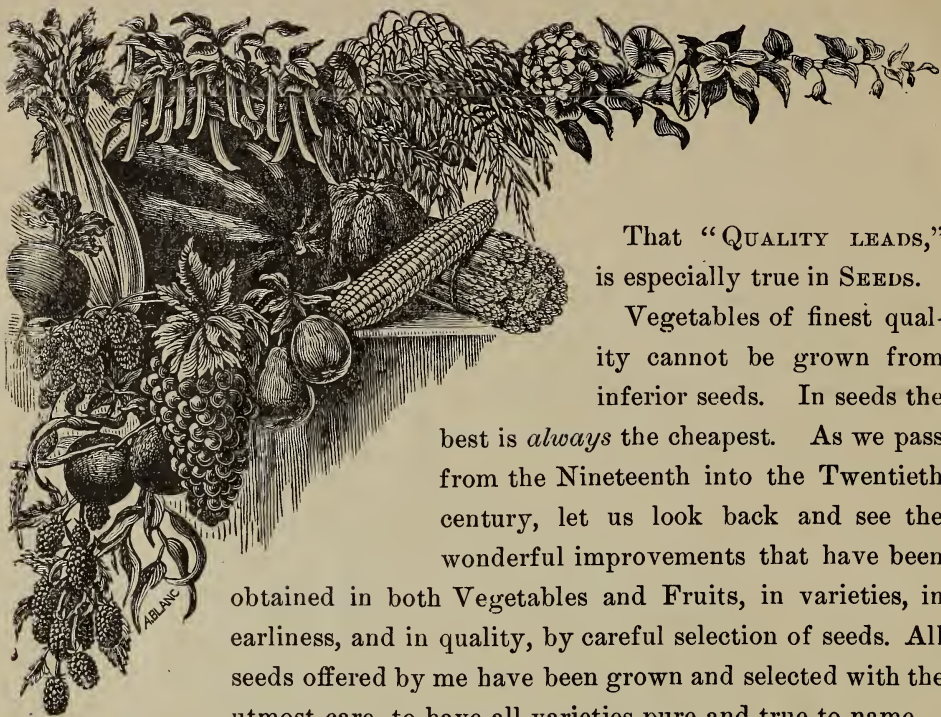

For many years I have made a specialty of Market Gardeners' Seeds, grown from selected seed stocks. The importance of following this system for the production of choice vegetables is familiar to all gardeners; if the vegetables from which seeds are grown are inferior or impure, so will be their product.

PERFECTION OF QUALITY WITH ME IS OF THE FIRST IMPORTANCE.

I make no charge for packing. Bags charged at cost price only.

Half a bushel will be supplied at bushel rates, half a peck at peck rates, one-half pound at pound rates. Orders for less than one-half peck or one-quarter pound will be charged at quart and ounce prices.

When seeds are to be sent by mail, in larger quantities than packets and ounces, postage must be added at the rate of 8 cents per pound, or 15 cents per quart for Peas and Beans, and 10 cents for Corn.
