

Y., wrappers at cost, and that it is distinctly understood that we do not warrant our Seeds, or hold ourselves responsible for any loss or damage which may arise from the failure thereof. If the purchaser does not accept the Seeds on these terms, they must be returned at once, carriage free.

Prices subject to change without notice, and stock being unsold, on receipt of order.

Filling Orders Pro-Rata.—It must be distinctly understood between ourselves and the party ordering Seeds in Bulk that when we book orders, either by mail or through our traveling salesmen, for Seeds of crops not yet harvested and for future delivery, that the quantities of Seeds so booked are subject to our ability to fill in full or in part, dependent upon the returns of such crops as harvested.

Terms.—June 1st, or one per cent. a month discount for Cash will be allowed. Parties unknown to us will be required to furnish satisfactory references, otherwise goods will be sent C. O. D.
