B for be-annuals that bloom the second year from seed and then die, although many if sown early in the spring will flower the first year.

P for perennials that usually bloom the second year for from seed, and continue to grow and bloom for many years, some will also bloom the first year if sown early.

H for they that are hardy, these will live over winter with protection.

H H is half hardy.

T is tender.

For example: H A is hardy annuals, and H P is hardy pernnials, etc. All such seeds marked hardy may be sown very early in the spring; half hardy and tender should not be sown until all danger of frost is over, unless you start them in conservatories, hot beds or in the house.
