

**RAPE** has a high-feeding value. It makes an excellent feed for fattening sheep and swine and for producing an abundant flow of milk in milch cows. Rape can be used to good advantage as a part of the rations for animals that are being fed in pens for market or for the show ring. It is also a valuable food for young lambs at weaning time. Rape is ready for use in about 8 weeks after planting. By beginning as early as practicable in the spring and seed-ing at intervals of two or three weeks, a continuous succession of rape can be produced throughout the period



when the permanent pastures are most likely to be short. Rape will endure quite severe cold weather and thus will last a long time after the ordinary pasture grasses succumb to the frost, 3 to 5 lbs is required per acre. 3 lbs 25c.
