Not bound by these prices for any length of time and subject to advance without notice. **We send out no seeds on commission.**

Up to this time the Jersey Wakefield has been cultivated for the earliest of all Cabbage, producing pointed or so-called sugar-loaf heads, but in the 20th Century we have the round shape, like All Seasons and others, which is the most preferable form of head. A novel feature of this variety is in its forming a number of small cabbage, similar to Brussels Sprouts (and equally as good) at base of cabbage or top of stem.

as a cannon-ball and earlier than any other sort. It grows more compactly, thus yielding a much larger crop than either Wakefield or Winnigstadt. For garden or market use it is unexcelled.

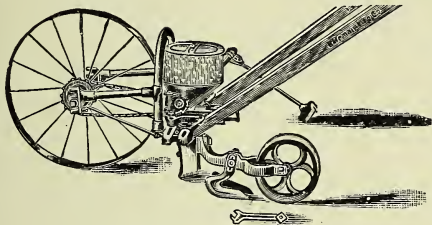
