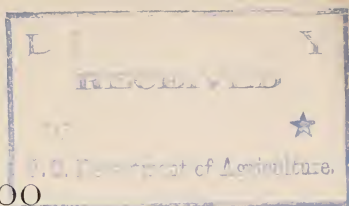

Japanese Maples

The Japanese Maples are grafted upon seedling stocks of our own growing. This gives a vigor which enables them to start at once into the luxuriance of color and form which distinguishes them from those imported, which, in our experience rarely attain that luxuriance. The voyage seems to sap their vitality.
