**TERMS.**—To customers of approved credit, 60 days' credit will be given, unless otherwise agreed upon, or 3% discount for cash within 15 days from date of invoice, or 5% discount where cash is remitted with order. This applies to everything except Potatoes, Onion Sets, Grass and Clover Seed, Fertilizers, Lawn Mowers, and all Greenhouse and Garden Supplies, which are net cash.

All accounts remaining unpaid when due are subject to sight draft without further notice. New customers desirous of opening accounts with us must give satisfactory references as to their responsibility.

We make no charge for boxes, packing or cartage, except where Peas, Beans, Ccrn, or Grass Seed are ordered in large quantities; when 20c. extra must be added for every two bushels to cover cost of bags.

Our prices include charges of all kirds, and are f. o. b. cars or boat.




