Terms and Conditions Governing Our Sales

TERMS

All accounts for general orders of **Vegetable and Flower Seeds** are due **June First, 1903**, without regard to date of purchase. Goods purchased after June 1st are Net Cash on October 1st, and after October 1st, Net Cash on January 1st, following. A discount of 1 per cent per month will be allowed on general bills of

Vegetables and Flower Seeds only. Bills of Beans, Corn or Peas, when purchased alone, orders on special quotations and orders of special items are due in 60 days from date of invoice, or a discount of 1½ per cent allowed if paid in 10 days from date of invoice.

These bills become due immediately, without notice, when purchaser suspends payment, sells out, removes or is closing out.

Grass, Clover, Farm and Field Seeds, Grain, Onion Sets, Potatoes, Poultry Supplies, Slug Shot, Fertilizers, etc., are sold for Cash, No Discount, at prices ruling from store the day of shipment, and are payable on demand at our option.

ERRORS AND SHORTAGE.

These should be reported at once, on receipt of shipment. No claims of this character will be considered at expiration of time for payment.

REMITTANCES.

Goods are priced on basis of having all payments made us in funds which pass at par with our city banks. The Clearing House Association control these collection charges; we have no option in the matter and should not be compelled to pay collection charges on checks drawn on your local bank when the remitter can frequently avoid it altogether—neither should we be compelled to pay collection charges on our sight drafts.

CONTAINERS AND DRAYAGE.

Bags, Barrels, Boxes, Crates and Cotton Bags charged for at value, and are not returnable.

No drayage charged on Garden seeds. Drayage always charged on Grass Seeds and heavy goods for orders of less than ten-bag lots of a single item.

Satisfactory Reference Required from unknown correspondents asking for credit.

SHIPPING.

When no such instructions are given, we shall exercise our best judgment; but we do not assume any responsibility, either for delay or otherwise, after the goods leave our hands—the shipping receipt being our voucher that the goods were received in good order.

Our location and facilities for prompt execution of orders, give us preeminently an advantage over more distant seedsmen. We make a study of quick shipment, and besides offering a large and varied assortment, we enable our customers to take the utmost advantage of a favorable season, with minimum risk of carrying over seed stock.
