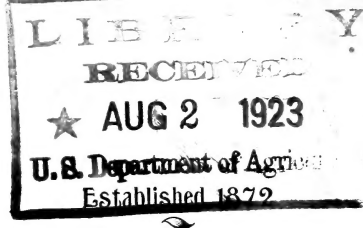

To intending purchasers, who cannot call to examine stock, we will be pleased to send samples. All the stock is **our own growing**, and equal to any grown anywhere.

**Those who wish to buy by car load or larger quantities than indicated in this list**, or special sizes, will please write us. We promise the best terms the size of the order and current prices will permit.

**Dealers and others** will find our facilities for the careful, rapid handling of stock, first class in every respect. Storage buildings and sheds are ample, with an abundant supply of water. 100,000 cubic feet cool storage.

New Haven is on the Missouri Pacific Railway, and also on the Missouri river, 67 miles west of St. Louis by rail.

**Digging and Shipping** season usually begins about February 20th and continues till April 20th.

**Packing** in very best manner. Paper lined boxes at cost as follows: 20x20x9 feet, \$1.50; 24x24x9 feet, \$2.00; 30x30x9 feet, \$2.50.

All stock now on hand and budded, with but few exceptions is from "mother blocks," which are budded the previous year from bearing trees and every care is taken to have varieties true to label. Will be graded full caliper and height.
