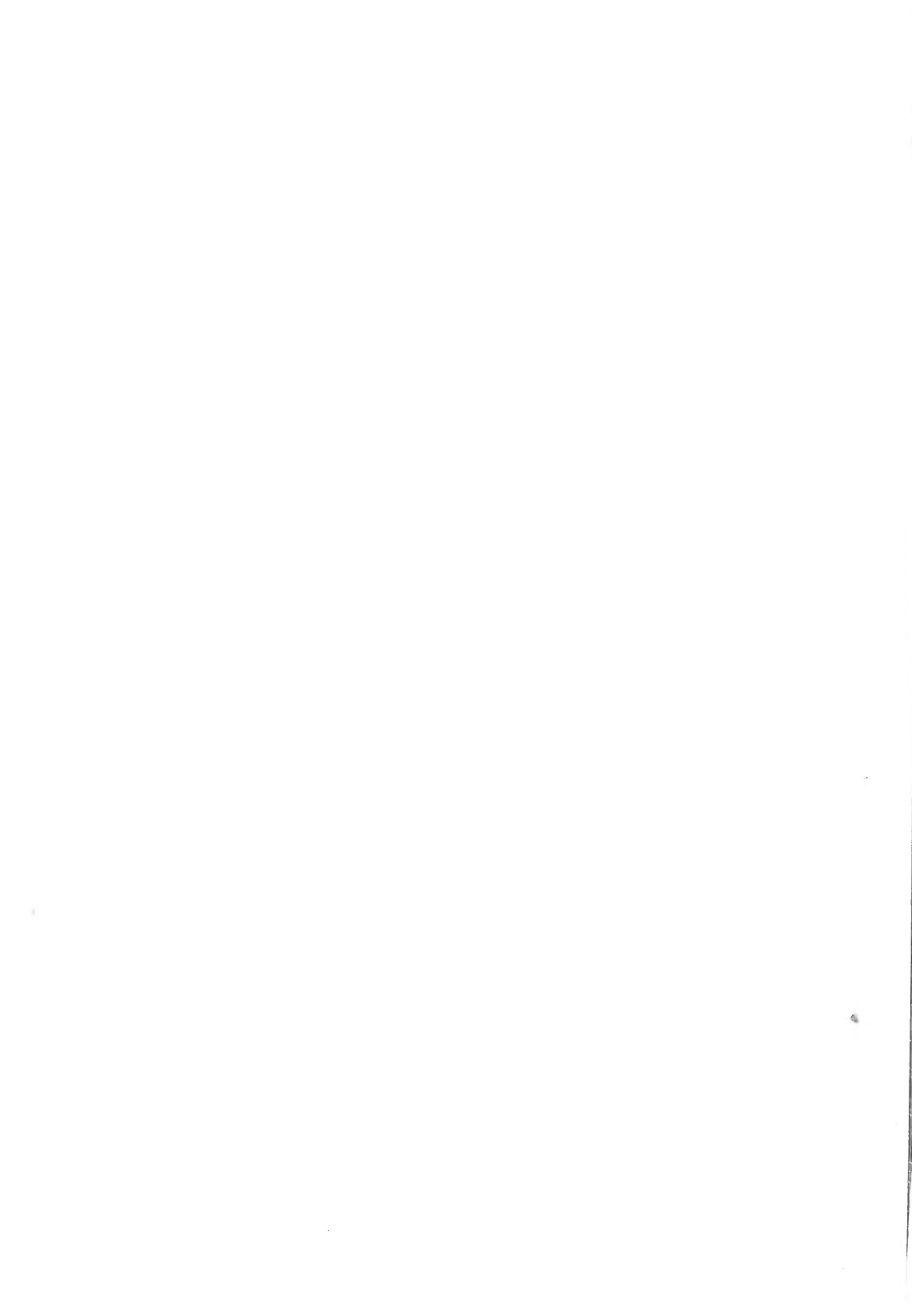

TERMS: Cash, unless by special arrangement. When goods are ordered sent C. O. D., one-half the amount must accompany the order. All offers are subject to stock being unsold on receipt of orders.

PACKING.

The packing season usually begins here in the spring about the 15th of April, though occasionally a week or ten days earlier, and in the autumn it usually extends from the 15th of September to the 1st of December.

Packing will be done in the most careful manner and will be charged for at cost to ourselves in labor and material.

All packages will be delivered free of charge to Freight and Express Agents.

SHIPPING.

We can ship either by Maine Central Railroad or by Steamers which connect directly with Steamers for New York and Boston or by American Express.

Customers are requested to state the mode of conveyance by which they wish their shipment dispatched; otherwise we will forward according to our best judgment. After delivery to the Forwarding Agents all goods are at the risk of the purchaser, and should any loss occur the forwarders alone must be held responsible.

CLAIMS.

All claims for errors or deficiencies must be made within ten days after receipt of stock. Customers will greatly oblige us by prompt notification of mistakes.

CONDITIONS OF SALE.

While we use the greatest care to have our stock true to name in every particular and stand ready to replace free of charge any that should not so prove or to refund its purchase price, upon proper proof, we do not give any warranty expressed or implied, and in case of any error on our part, it is mutually agreed between the purchaser and ourselves that we shall not at any time, be held responsible for a greater amount than the original price of the stock.

The articles on the following list will be furnished at the annexed prices only when the quantity specified shall be taken. *Five hundred* will be furnished at the *thousand* rate, *fifty* at the *hundred* rate, and *five* at rate per *ten*. *In no case will we supply long lists of selected varieties, two or three of each, of Trees, Shrubs or Plants, to Nurserymen or others, at wholesale rates, but at such a discount from retail prices as circumstances will justify.* Ordinarily a discount of 20 per cent. from retail single prices will be allowed on such lists. *Special rates given on very large orders.*

All orders are received subject to stock being unsold on receipt of same, and are accepted only upon the condition that should the stock be injured by any extremes of weather or other casualties before the shipping season they are to be void.

LOCATION.

The Nurseries, to which visitors are always welcome, are situated about a mile and a half to the south of the village of Bar Harbor, on the Schooner Head Road or Ocean Drive.

Bar Harbor itself can be reached by regular steamers from Boston and Portland, and also by New York and Philadelphia steamers connecting with these as well as by the all-rail route over the Maine Central Road.

Situated in 44° 25' north latitude, with a temperature that ranges from 96° above to 20° below zero and upon a sea coast where the ground is often bare of snow during portions of the winter, the climate and exposure to which our stock is subjected renders it unusually hardy, while our location is one of great advantage for the growing of seedlings, owing to its proximity to the waters with the cooler nights and moister atmosphere this brings us well as to its excessive rainfall, which is shown by recent Weather Bureau statistics to be greater than that of any other station on the Atlantic Coast.

Many of the trees and shrubs here, also are noted for their coloring and distinct forms, which they retain when planted elsewhere, and with few exceptions the seeds from which our seedlings have been grown have been collected here, and by ourselves, from specially selected trees and shrubs.
