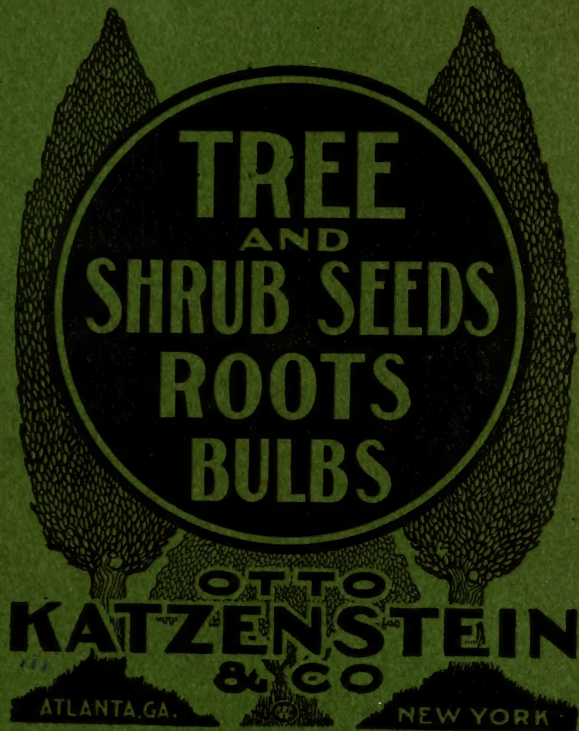

PLEASE READ CAREFULLY BEFORE ORDERING.

The publication of this list cancels all previous quotations.

TERMS—Cash with order or usual trade references from unknown correspondents. All accounts become due and subject to draft, unless otherwise arranged, 60 days from date of invoice. Two per cent. discount for remittances within 30 days from date of invoice.

DOMESTIC REMITTANCES requested by Postal or Express Money Order, Registered Letter or Draft on New York or Atlanta Bank. Our banks charge for collection of local checks.

FOREIGN REMITTANCES are payable in United States currency through Money Order on Atlanta Postoffice or Draft on a New York or Atlanta Bank. We ask that remittances not be made in foreign postage stamps or foreign individual checks.

POSTAGE—The rate is 86 per pound, which ought to be added to remittance. Limit of weight in domestic mail is four pounds, and in foreign mail twelve ounces. Registration fee in all instances 36 per package.

PARCELSPOST packages are admitted to a number of foreign countries now. Limit of weight per parcel is four pounds six ounces, and the rate is twelve cents per pound or fraction thereof.

FREIGHT AND EXPRESS—Unless instructed we shall use our own discretion as to kind of conveyance or route. Nearly all express companies allow now a deduction of twenty per cent. from regular merchandise rates for shipment of seeds and roots. All goods sent by freight travel at risk of consignee.

FOREIGN SHIPMENTS will be consigned to Downing's Foreign Express, 32 Broadway, New York, or their correspondents at other ports, unless we receive other instructions.

MARINE INSURANCE will be effected at request and expense of consignee.

REQUEST FOR EARLY ORDERS—We do not sell any old seeds and do not take in stock, therefore, much larger quantities than we can be reasonably sure of selling during the ensuing season. It is very important on this account, especially, that orders for large quantities of early maturing kinds, should reach us as early as possible in the season to assure complete execution. While we anticipate at this writing a supply of all kinds offered, our acceptance of orders is not a warranty for delivery, but it is subject to crop accidents and limits of crops. All quotations are subject to change without notice.

WARRANTY—While we exercise greatest care to have all our seeds, bulbs, plants, etc. pure and reliable, they are sold without warranty and without any responsibility, expressed or implied, in respect to the crop. If our goods are not accepted on these terms we must be informed at once after their inspection upon arrival at destination to arrange for their return. We cannot consider deferred claims or claims after the seeds have been planted.

An exchange of catalogs, seed lists, etc., is desired.

CONIFERS—KONIFEREN.

ABOUT SOWING SEEDS OF CONIFERS AND WOODY PLANTS.

Sow small quantities in cold frames or in shallow boxes filled with carefully sifted mellow sandy loam. Larger quantities sow in seed-beds which must be naturally or artificially sheltered from heavy East or North-east winds. Enrich soil with well rotted manure. Work the soil—a well-drained sandy loam—thoroughly to a depth of twelve inches, removing sticks, stones, etc. Destroy weeds before sowing and avoid subsequent annoyance. Seed beds can be used for a number of years.

Seeds with hard shells soak in almost boiling water just before sowing.

Seeds with thick pulp (as Magnolia) macerate and wash off pulp immediately before sowing.

Seeds which naturally dry up or which “lay over” stratify by placing them in boxes or other vessels between alternate layers of sand, storing them in sheltered places out of the way of mice and other vermin. In due time, sow like any other seeds. Keep stratified seeds moist. Sow broadcast or in drills. Last is preferable as facilitating cultivation. Cover seeds with soil equal to about the thickness of the seeds. Do not cover seeds too deep, especially not those of conifers; light mulch of seed beds with moss, pine needles or similar material, assists in retaining even moisture. After sowing press soil firmly with roller or back of spade and water thoroughly with fine rose. Shade seed-beds until seedlings appear when shade must be removed gradually. Keep beds well weeded at all times.

To prevent dampening off sprinkle pulverized charcoal over and between the seedlings.

WINKE FUER DIE AUSSAAT VON KONIFEREN & GEHOELZEN.

Kleine Quantitaeten und seltene Samen saet man in kalte Mistbeetkaesten, wohldrainierte flache Holzkaestchen, Samenschaalen, etc. Groessere Aussaaten werden in Samenbeete gemacht, die gegen heftige Ost—oder Nordostwinde natuerlich oder kuenstlich zu schuetzen sind. Man waehle humusreichen, sandigen Lehmboden, der durch wohlverrotteten Stallduenger verbessert wird. Man rigole tief und entferne sorgfaeltig Steine, Stoecke, etc., ebenso wie unbedingt auch alle Unkrautwurzeln vor der Aussaat. Gut vorbereitete Samenbeete koennen jahrelang erfolgreich benutzt werden.

Hartschalige Samen weicht man unmittelbar vor der Aussaat in sehr heissem, fast kochendem Wasser und beschleunigt dadurch das Aufaufen.

Samen mit fleischiger Huelle (wie Magnolia) weicht man unmittelbar vor der Aussaat und waescht die Samen frei.

Samen welche soust austrocknen oder welche “ueberliegen” stratifiziert man, indem man sie schichtenweise mit feuchtem Sand in Kaesten oder andere Gefaesse packt und sie in geschuetzten Plaetzen, fern von Mausem und aehnlichem Ungeziefer, bis zur Aussaat aufbewahrt. Man haelt sie nur maessig feucht und saet spaeter wie andere Samen.

Man saet entweder breitwuerfig oder in Reihen. Reihensaat erleichtert indessen Kultivierung. Man bedeckt die Samen nach der Aussaat mit einer duennen Schicht leichter Erde. Koniferen namentlich bedecke man sehr leicht und andere Samen nur bis zu ihrer eignen Dicke. Man presst die Erde dann fest und waessert sehr sorgfaeltig. Es ist ratsam, das Beet mit leichter Schicht Moos, Tannennadeln, Lohe, etc. zu bedecken, um gleichmaessige Feuchtigkeit zu erhalten. Man schattiere Saatbeete bis die Saemlinge auflaufen, wenn das Schattiermaterial ganz allmaehlig entfernt wird. Man halte die Saat beete durchaus unkrautfrei. Um Umfallen von Saemlingen durch Faeulnis am Wurzelhals zu verhindern, ist das Ausstreuen von pulverisierter Holzkohle ueber und zwischen Saemlingen oft sehr erfolgreich.

About Sowing Seeds of Herbaceous Plants: Sow in late fall or early spring either in cold frames or preferably in shallow boxes, filled with finely sifted mellow sandy loam. Press soil firmly before sowing and cover seeds with loam to their own height after sowing. Water well and carefully and do not let the soil get dry. To prevent "dampening off" sprinkle pulverized charcoal over and between the seedlings. Shade carefully. Prick off as soon as the second leaves appear. Cover seed-boxes with mulch of chopped sphagnum moss or some similar material, to retain even moisture.

The plants are at least as hardy as *Rhododendron maximum*. Their value for ornamental planting is unsurpassed. The superiority of the true *Rhododendron catawbiense*, as a parent for hybridizing purposes over the so-called *catawbiense*, so often offered in Europe under that name, which in reality are generally hybrids with *ponticum* or *arbor-eum* blood, is also to be considered very carefully.
