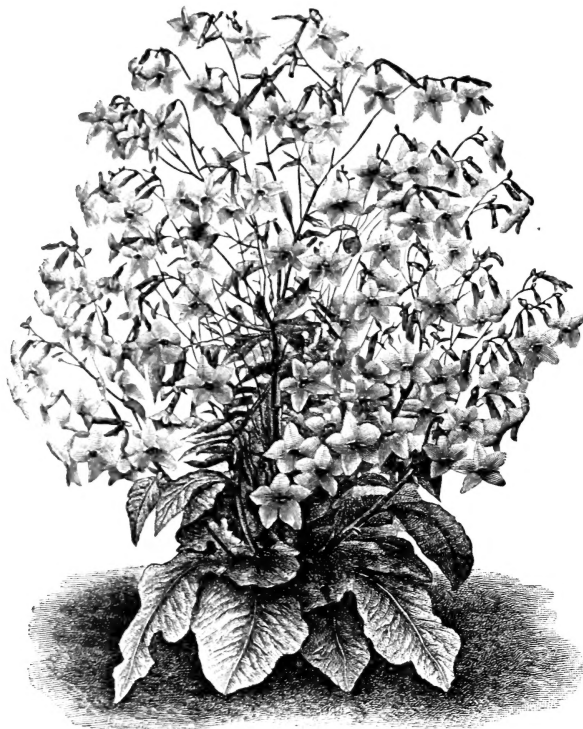

NICOTIANA SANDERÆ

(Carminc Tuberosc-flowercd Tobacco)

This beautiful hybrid Nicotiana was raised in England and has been exhibited this season at the Temple show and elsewhere and in every case has been spoken of as the most strikingly beautiful plant of the year. The originators describe it as forming bushy, much branched plants 2 feet high, the whole plant laden with flowers from base to summit—literally ablaze with most handsome carmine-red fragrant blossoms, thousands of which are produced on a single plant. In form the flower resembles Nicotiana Affinis, but having a short stout tube, and, unlike that variety, does not close up in the day time, but remains open all day. The fragrance, while not so powerful as in Nicotiana Affinis, is decidedly delicious. It is as easy to grow as a Petunia. If started indoors in early spring and planted out in May it gives a continuous display of blooms all summer and autumn. It can also be sown in the open ground when the weather becomes warm. A Beautiful Hardy Perennial

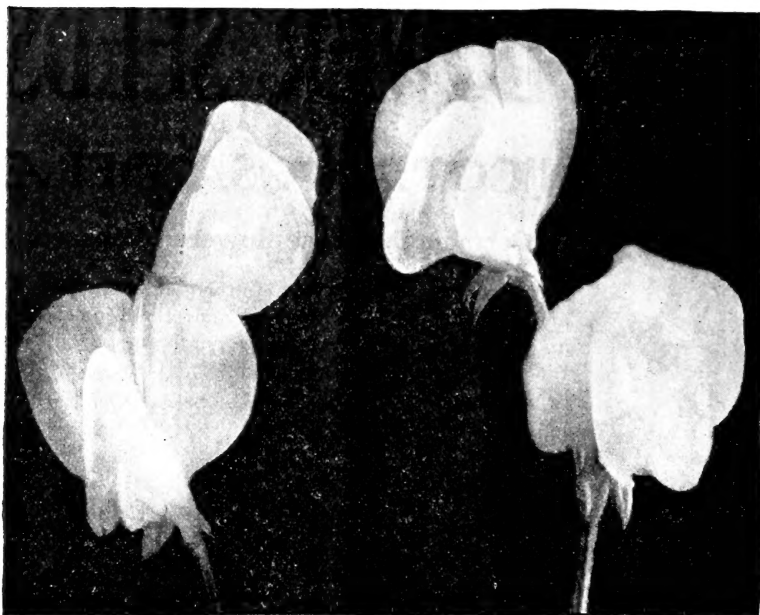
STOKESIA CYANEA

Or Cornflower Aster

This beautiful native hardy plant is not yet so well known as it should be. Without doubt the most valuable novelty of recent introduction. No garden, large or small, should be without it. No picture, be it ever so perfect, can do justice to its delicate beauty. When once seen every one will want a bed of them. As a single specimen or group in the hardy border it makes for itself a place that cannot be filled by any other hardy plant, while for beds or masses of any size, it ranks with the Phlox, Peony and Iris. It is of the easiest culture, growing easily from seed and also multiplied by division of the plant. The plants grow from 16 to 24 inches high, and in the North bloom from July to late in October, while in the South they bloom during May and June, with occasional blooms later if kept well cultivated. Although a native of the Sunny South it, seems to grow equally well all over the North and is reported perfectly hardy as far North as Northern Wisconsin. Its beautiful centaurea-like blossoms of a delicate lavender-blue color are highly valuable for cutting, supplying a shade of color not overly plentiful at any season of the year. It starts off rather slowly when first set out and is far superior the second year after setting, so should be set where it can make a permanent bed. Price, pkt. 15c., ¼ oz. 50c.

New Fleshy Pink WINTER STOCK Beauty of Nice

Under good cultivation the plant attains a height of 2 to 2½ feet, is clothed with bold foliage and throws up a gigantic main flower spike of about a foot in length. All around the central stem the plant sends out a number of long side shoots, loosely covered with uncommonly large and very fragrant flowers of nearly two inches across, remarkable alike for their beauty of form and their delightful color, which is a delicate shade of fleshy pink, such as is now in the height of fashion, and just what the grower of cut flowers requires. One may rely on getting from 60 to 75 per cent. of double-flowering plants. A further striking feature in this stock is the rapidity with which it comes into bloom, so that it may just as readily be employed as an early ten-week stock.

From sowings made on February 24, 1902, plants were in full bloom on June 10, and from sowings on March 21, 1902, plants were in full bloom on July 10. From a sowing made July 4, 1902, the blossoms first appeared by the beginning of September, and continued through the winter without intermission until the middle of April.
