

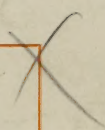

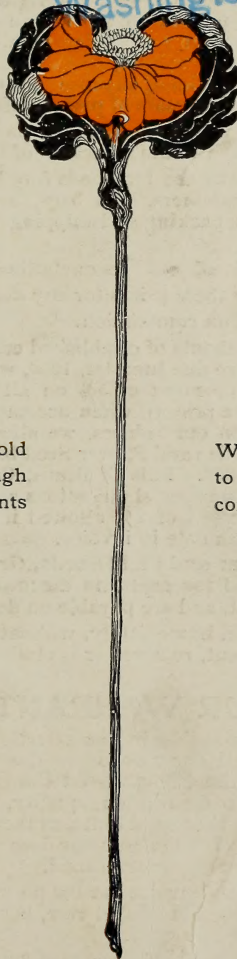

NOTICE.

For over sixty years this firm has made a specialty of Garden and Flower Seeds in bulk, including Peas, Beans and Sweet Corn.

Our business is steadily increasing, which in itself is assurance that our seeds are to be relied upon. We handle nothing that we do not believe to be the *very best obtainable*, Plant Seed Company being the *actual growers* of many items, and other items are grown on private contract in the various countries of the world, where each comes to fullest maturity and are subject to our personal inspection.

There is a disposition on the part of many to always buy where the *price* is lowest, and if the final result of the crop is of no consideration, this is all right, but lowering the price of seeds is always done at the expense of quality. Quality in vegetable and flower seeds is maintained only by constantly exercising the greatest vigilance. No larger knowledge of our business is needed to produce a crop of seed than that possessed by the average farmer or gardener, but to maintain the purity of each variety is where the training of the skilled grower and expert seedsmen comes into play, adding expense in ways which cannot always be readily seen, and covering years of patient effort.

It is this knowledge which we claim to possess, and wherever you see **Our Sign** it will always be the assurance of **High Quality**.

Prices in this catalogue are for goods f. o. b. cars St. Louis, and do not include the cost of containers. All bags, both seamless and small, when necessary to proper packing and shipping will be charged at value and are not returnable.

This price list cancels all previous quotations.

We are not bound by these prices for any definite time or quantity.

We send out no seed on commission.

TERMS: To all merchants of established credit, all bills invoiced at prices in this catalogue are due June 1st, 1906, without regard to date of purchase. We allow a discount of 5% on all orders for Garden and Flower Seed (at catalogue prices), when accompanied by a cash remittance. When charged on our ledgers, we allow a discount of one per cent per month on all Garden and Flower Seed bills (at catalogue prices), if paid before June 1st, 1906. Bills of Beans, Corn or Peas, when purchased alone, and orders on special quotations are due in sixty days from date of invoice, or a discount of 2% allowed if remittance reaches our office within ten days from date in invoice.

Grass, Clover, Farm and Field Seeds, Grain, Poultry Supplies, and Fertilizers are sold for cash, no discount, at prices ruling from store the day of shipment, and are payable on demand at our option.

All bills become due, immediately, without notice, when purchaser suspends payment, sells out, removes or is closing out.

OUR WARRANTY.

We use every effort possible in the selection of our seeds, and feel justified in saying that all our **Seeds** are the **purest** and **best** to be found; but, at the same time, **Plant Seed Company** gives no warranty, express or implied, as to description, quality, productiveness, or any other matter of any seeds they send out, and they will not be in any way responsible for the crop. If the purchaser does not accept the goods on these terms, they are to be at once returned.

Ten pounds of a variety invoiced at 100 pound rate; half pound and half bushel at the pound and bushel rate, but for a smaller quantity a slightly higher rate will be charged.

TELEGRAPHIC CIPHER

The telegraphic cipher word for quantities must always precede the cipher words for seed. If the same quantity of several articles is wanted, the word for that quantity should be placed before the word for the first article only. For example:

“Freight Quapode Password, Pannier, Baneful,” means ship by first freight ten bushels each Plant’s Extra Early Peas, Alaska Peas, Extra Early Round Pod Red Valentine Beans.

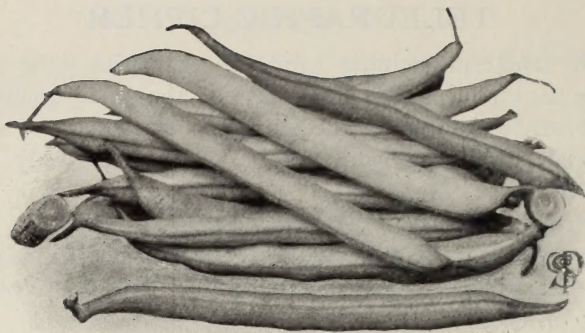
“Express Quanopsy Charm, Carun, Bracelet, Quanrush Loburst, Rector,” means ship by first express five pounds each P. S. Co.’s St. Louis Late Market Cabbage, Extra Early Jersey Wakefield Cabbage, Crosby’s Egyptian Beet, and ten pounds each Early Curled Simpson Lettuce, Early Scarlet Turnip White Tip Radish.
