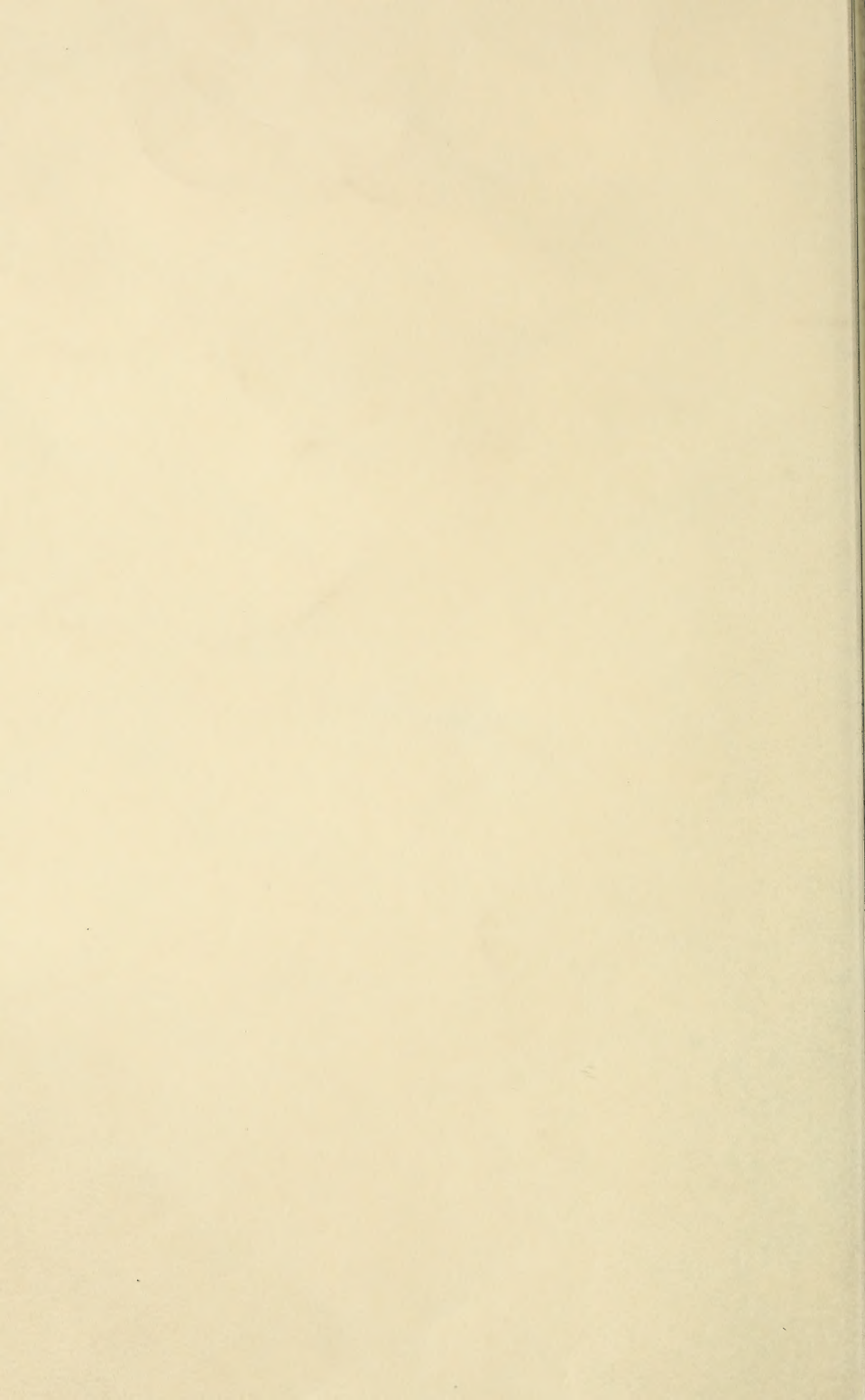

We have the stock herein listed dug, ready for immediate shipment, all strictly first class for the sizes specified, guaranteed true to name and in good condition.

Prices Quoted are for stock packed and delivered at your R. R. Station, freight paid on orders amounting to \$5.00 or upward. Orders of less than \$5.00 will be delivered at Geneva Station packed. If express shipment is desired, the express charges will be paid by purchaser.

Shipping Directions :—Be sure and state explicitly how and to what point you desire shipment made.

Terms :—Strictly cash with order.

If we should be out of the *size* you specify we will put in the nearest we can to the size desired unless you order otherwise; if we are out of a *variety* ordered we will *not* substitute any other variety unless so ordered by you, so please be sure to state if we may substitute if necessary.

All shipments are accompanied by a certificate of inspection from the office of the Commissioner of Agriculture of the State of New York; in addition to this we certify that all stock shipped by us has been fumigated with Hydrocyanic acid gas.

SEED POTATOES.—Following prices f. o. b. Geneva, N. Y., in any quantities.

1st size, \$1.50 per bushel, \$3.25 per barrel, 165 lbs.

Irish Cobbler. This is considered the best in quality of any of the extra early varieties. Have used them seven weeks from planting, and never later than two months. They are round, smooth, snowy white, and as handsome as they are fine in quality. They are good yielders for an extra early variety.

Early Favorite. This is a medium early variety, long, and of the rose type of potato. This is with us as heavy a yielder as the Carmen, and is a good main crop potato to keep through, as well as taking the place of an early variety. It is not however as early as the Cobbler, nor for early use, has it the quality of the Cobbler, although for late use its quality is unsurpassed.

Ontario White. A long, white potato, very handsome and of fine quality a first-rate general purpose potato.

Carmen. This standby hardly needs description: its large, round, high quality tubers have made it the best known potato that has been put on the market for years.
