DAHLIAS.

J. H. Jackson—Immense flower of splendid form, with very long pointed petals, color deep maroon, shading to black in center, one of the best.

Mrs. Leedham—Fiery scarlet, shading into orange, plant forming a compact bush of perfect habit.

Standard Bearer—Very full flower of bright red color, excellent shape, a profuse bloomer.

Chrysanthemum—Bright pinkish scarlet, with long, graceful, twisted and curved petals.

Firefly—A combination of cinnamon and magenta, very free blooming and pretty.

Constant—Bright scarlet with long and very narrow pointed petals, forming a graceful flower.

Kriemhilde—The color is a fresh, delicate pink, shading to white in center, the form is all that could be asked; it is a profuse bloomer, a strong vigorous grower of upright habit.

Dusky Queen—Darkest possible red, shading to black in center, very beautiful and attractive flower.

Colorado-Very bright red, very bushy plant and profuse bloomer.

Britannia—Deep shaded salmon flesh, free and early, stout. stiff stems.

Dreer—This is an unusual shade in Cactus Dahlias, being best described as bronze; habit of plant is grand.

Countess of Lonsdale—This most profuse bloomer among the cactus variety, and one of the very best; color shaded reddish salmon.

Mrs. J. J. Crowe—Pretty lemon yellow flower with long narrow, graceful petals, forming a pretty star-like flower.

MRS. J. T. Lowry—Orange buff, with yellow center, perfect shaped flower of good form.

Arachine—Has peculiar twister and curled petals, forming a curious, irregularly built flower, and on account of this unique form is well named Arachne, meaning spider; the petals are creamy white edged, with a band of crimson; the color, however, varies as much as the form.

Mrs. Parker—Rich yellow, with petals, splendidly shaped bloom, a strong grower.

Starfish—Bright vermilion, a large flower of splendid shape and a really good thing, very strong grower.

Island Queen—Soft lavender pink, a popular and beautiful shade, flowers medium size and fine cactus form, a good late bloomer.

Charm-An exceedingly pretty white, very free blooming.

Fairy—Old rose tipped white, shading to yellow in center, very curly petals, a delicately graceful flower.

Green's White-Pure white star-shaped bloom.

DAHLIAS-SHOW, DECORATIVE.

Theo. Wust—Buff with terra cotta shading, a huge sunflower like bloom, growing to an enormous size.

Crimson Ball—New, rich crimson, a large handsome flower. the petals turning back and meeting at the back of the flower and forming almost a perfect ball.

John Walker—Pure white, of perfect shape and a very full flower.

Oleo—Pure bright yellow, a lovely color, growing to an enormous size.

Purity—Pure white pompon, a charming little flower, most useful for cutting.

Guiding Star—Pure white pompon, petals beautifully quilled, largely grown for cutting.

Rosa—Very prettily shaded bloom from deep rose to almost white.

Mrs. Watters—Brightest rosy carmine, with broad petals, prettily curled, forming a grand decorative flower, one of the very best.

Harriet Sophia—A most beautiful shade of pink, a large, full, deep flower of great beauty.

Bessie Boston—An enormous flower, giving the appearance of a huge crimson Peony, awarded a certificate of merit by the Pacific Coast Horticultural Society.
