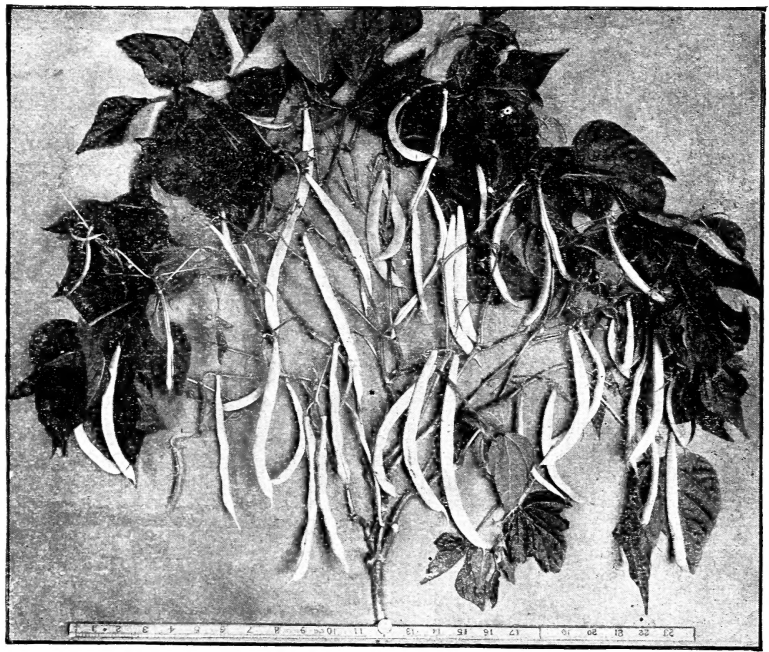

A new variety, which will soon take the place of the best strains of White Spine and other desirable Cucumbers. For several years this variety has been controlled by the originator, who is one of the leading market gardeners in the West and after whom the variety is named. Mr. Davis states that he experimented several years in trying to get an improved strain of Cucumber for forcing under glass and outside culture, and has finally fixed a "Perfect" type, combined in a quality, shape, color and productiveness. The Cucumbers grow long and slim, sometimes measure 12 inches in length; the color is a rich, dark, glossy green, which they hold until nearly ripe, when they turn white without a sign of yellow streak. It is very tender, brittle and of exceptionally fine flavor. The seeds are very soft when the Cucumber is really for table use. This is an important feature. It will hold its color and brittleness long after cutting, and being a strong grower is able to resist the Cucumber disease.

This variety is a remarkable rank grower, sturdy and productive, and thus far has been entirely free from rust and blight. The plants are well loaded with long, straight, handsome pods, which somewhat resemble the pods of Davis and Wardwell's Kidney Wax but are plumper, straighter and longer, averaging about seven inches in length, while the color is a clean, light yellow, making them very attractive. There are hundreds of contingencies continually arising to prevent the best seeds from always giving satisfaction, such as sowing too deeply, in too wet or too dry soil, insects of all descriptions destroying the plant as soon as it appears, wet weather, cold weather, frost, etc. A very common cause is heavy rain after sowing the constant baking of the ground, and there are many others which the planter cannot govern.

It is a well known fact that many plants tend to revert to their original type, notwithstanding the care of the seed grower or planter.
