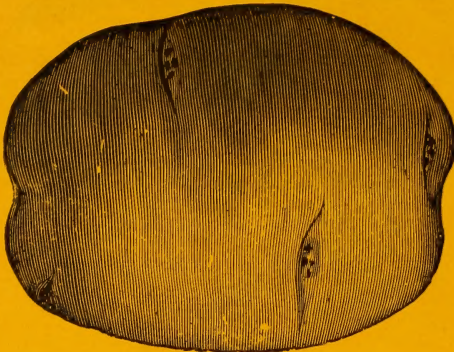

VEGETABLE SEEDS.

Seeds by Mail—Postage is 8 cents per pound. For Peas, Beans and Corn, add 15 cents per quart to prices quoted.

Remittances can be made by postal money order, bank draft, registered letter, express company's money order, or by express. Amounts less than two dollars may be remitted in postage stamps.

Shipping Instructions—When goods are to be shipped by freight or express, give plain shipping instructions. Otherwise we use our own judgment in this matter.

Guarantee—Seeds of the best quality are apt to fail, through improper treatment, by sowing the seed too deep or too shallow, in too wet or too dry soil. They differ greatly as to temperature required for germination. Some will germinate rapidly at a certain temperature, while others, if sown under the same conditions, are apt to decay. The young plants are liable to various accidents; cold or dry air may check their growth or destroy them. Insects above and below the ground may attack them, and a great many other contingencies may arise to prevent the best seeds from giving satisfaction, and for all these reasons it is impractical to **Guarantee Seeds**. We give no warranty, expressed or implied, as to description, quality, productiveness, or any other matter, of any seeds we send out, and will not be in any way responsible for the crop. If the purchaser does not accept the goods on these terms, they are at once to be returned.

Terms—Parties unknown to us will please send money as above stated, or satisfactory reference with order.

Prices subject to change without notice. Seeds in papers, 5 cents each, except Cauliflower; for prices on this, see under head of Cauliflower.

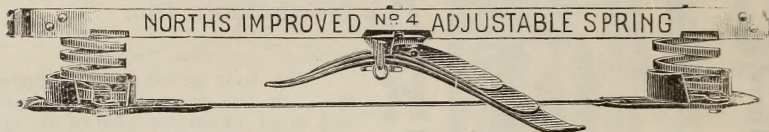

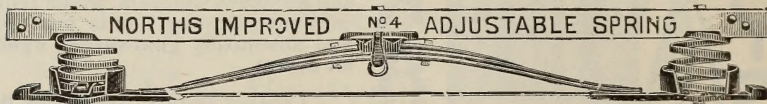

The above cut shows cross spring in position for all ordinary purposes.



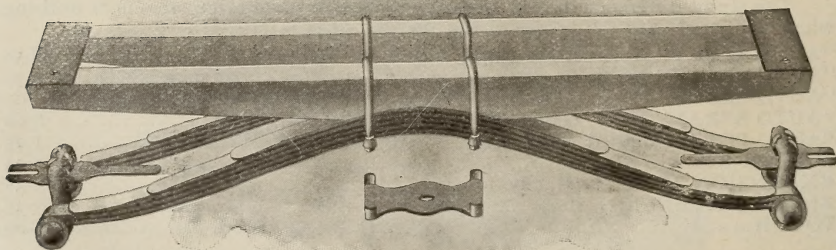
The above cut shows cross spring in position for heavy loads.
